## Matters Arising since the last meeting:

- 1. There had been a successful tour at Stoneleigh Abbey on the warm evening of 26 June. The Abbey hopes to introduce a new guided tour which includes the Repton Garden restoration. The Abbey was planning to launch this in September, possibly with a free day, but this may be postponed to next season.
- 2. The Jubilee weekend had proved a great success with many visitors to the SHS exhibition (Thanks to the Church for hosting this, and to providing the facility for the period of the Leamington History exhibition). Sheila was thanked for co-ordinating the exhibit and for her contribution to its content.
- 3. Sheila had purchased a projector for use at her own talks, but this could be used by SHS too. Dick and Daphne James had generously donated a screen and projector stand. Sheila spoke about the work she had done following Joyce Taylor's transcription of the **Stoneleigh Village School Logbooks**. Biographies of some 20 headmasters were given in outline and extracts from the books read out (see attachment to these notes). It was noted the extent to which boys missed school due to agricultural work and girls were expected to help to look after babies and young children. In the 1890s Lady Leigh sent sewing to be done at the school - towel-initialling, nightshirt making etc. Sheila has two CDS which can be borrowed, one containing anecdotes about boys, the other about girls.
