#### Stoneleigh Neighbourhood Watch Team

**Burglary** - Between Friday 21/01/2011 and 1200hrs Tuesday 25/01/2011 a property in Stoneleigh Close was broken into. Entry was gained via a rear window, unknown if anything stolen.

**Burglary** - Between 0800hrs and 1705hrs Tuesday 25/01/2011 a property on Vicarage Road was broken into. Entry was gained by smashing a ground floor window to the side of the house and jewellery was taken. Forensic evidence has been obtained.

**Good News** - On 6<sup>th</sup> November 2010 criminal damage to an estimated value of £1000 was caused by a male in a vehicle to the grounds at Stoneleigh Abbey. After extensive enquiries by officers from your SNT and business partners the offender was identified and brought to justice. The offender, who is not a local, has been dealt with via the restorative justice procedure and has been required to write a letter of apology to The Trustees of Stoneleigh Abbey and to make a significant financial contribution toward the cost of repairs.

#### **Local Police Station News**

#### Kenilworth

- From February 28, 2011, our front office services will be located in Warwickshire Direct at Kenilworth Library, Kenilworth. Until this time front office services are still available at Kenilworth Police Station, open Monday -Friday, 8am - 4pm.
- o At present our Safer Neighbourhood Team operates out of Kenilworth Police Station. Work is ongoing to identify and then relocate to a new Safer Neighbourhood Office within the town

#### Door To Door Sales People - Police Advice

Members of the public should be aware of strangers calling at their home:

**1** Always keep downstairs windows closed and front and back doors locked to prevent people from entering without invitation.

**2** Check who is calling at your home by looking through a spy hole in the door, or through a window.

**3** Put the security chain on before opening the door, even if you are expecting someone to call. Ask to see identification if you do not recognise the person.

**4** Take the identity card from them, close the door and examine it. Contact the company they claim to be representing, after finding a number from the telephone directory. Do not just ring the number on the card – it may be answered by an accomplice.

**5** If you have any doubts about who the caller is ask them to make an appointment to return at a more convenient time, when you can have a friend or relative with you.

Genuine callers will not mind you making these checks. **Remember** you do not have to let strangers in to your home, even if they claim it is an emergency.

As February has only recently begun as I write, it is hard to say too much of what has been happening. However, the Marriage Preparation Day was attended by five of the couples getting married this year, and was a very enjoyable and useful time. We look forward to enjoying the 'big day' with them later in the year, but hope that the preparation day will help them for the life to follow that day once the guests have gone home.

March sees the beginning of the season of Lent – the time of preparation and penitence before the dramatic season of Holy Week and Easter. To start the season, we will be joining with members of the Kenilworth Anglican, Roman Catholic, Methodist, United Reformed and Heart of England Revival Churches for a joint Ash Wednesday service at Stoneleigh. Then, as Lent progresses, we will share Lent Breakfasts on Saturday mornings at Stoneleigh Village Hall, and Lent Lunches on Thursdays (following the 11.30 Communion services) at Stoneleigh Church. #### Stoneleigh & Ashow News is 143 years old!

Last month's magazine carried some extracts from the 1971 edition, which prompted Shirley Ball to find a piece from the same year, recalling even earlier days of the publication. The 1869 edition had commented, among other things, that "keepers and amateurs should be careful not to slaughter cage birds or other domestic pets" and illustrated this by an anecdote of " a favourite tabby cat which now figures in a glass case at Warwick Museum – presented by Mr Potts, keeper to the Right Hon. Lord Leigh."

The Warwick Record Office has a copy of the very first *Stoneleigh Magazine and Parish Record*, published in January 1868. Just as today, publication was monthly, but in those days there was a price per copy – of "three half-pence"! The editorial states that "the object of the Stoneleigh Magazine is to supply a periodical at a moderate price, which shall be instructive and entertaining and at the same time a record of Parish events." The idea was to have a 30-page magazine, the central pages being "Tales, Extracts, Poetry" and the outside ones on matters connected with the parish.

One of the most prominent events recorded each month was the fortnightly Penny Reading given in the Reading Room (now the Village Club), usually "crowded with an enthusiastic audience" who heard lectures, songs, and extracts from Shakespeare given, often by members of the Leigh family.

Edition number 9, for September 1868, also in Warwick Record Office, gives details of various "Harvest Homes" at the Abbey, where "rustic sports" were held, and also of a Coventry and Warwickshire Flower and Horticultural Show at the Home Park, Stoneleigh Abbey, when "most of the shops in Coventry were closed, and a great many persons numbering between six and seven thousand assembled from the neighbouring towns."

#### **Stoneleigh Village Club - Committee Communication**

Dear Member,

In order to increase the communication between the committee and the membership, please find below the main points of discussion from our recent meetings, as always you can find minutes of each meeting on the club notice board.

After a detailed review of the current financial position of the club, the committee have agreed a range of initiatives to reduce costs and increase profitability. Many of these initiatives will be implemented over the course of the coming year and are designed to not only increase the income of the club but are intended to provide greater exposure and make the club accessible to a broader section of the community.

Undoubtedly you will be aware that in January the VAT rate was increased, coupled with this the brewery also increased its prices, the cumulative effect of this has been an approximate rise of 6% in our costs, we have therefore unfortunately had no option but to increase bar prices by the same amount. I can assure you that this only covers the clubs costs and there is no additional profit being made on bar sales.

Through the committee's review, it has been identified that there are certain times during the week where we do not generate sufficient sales to cover our operating costs, we have therefore taken the decision to revise the clubs opening hours to the following:

With effect from 27th February 2011 (add 20 minutes drinking up time)

Monday 1930-2300 Tuesday 1930-2300 Wednesday 1930-2300 Thursday 1930-2300 Friday 1930-2300 Saturday 1200-1600 1930-2300 Sunday 1200-1600 Closed Although only minor changes to weekday trading you will notice that the decision has been taken to close on a Sunday evening, this will be reviewed towards the end of March when historically trade increases and we also host several clubs/societies.

The committee have also reviewed the current membership fee and have decided that there will be no increase for the 2011/12 membership year.

Needless to say we shall continue to advise through both the Parish Magazine and the Notice Board as normal, but should you have access please take a minute to check the web site out and let us know your thoughts.

The current telephone number for the club will no longer be available after the end of February. We are in the process of obtaining a new number which shall be issued in due course.

Finally the committee would like to thank all members for their support over the past year and look forward to your continued support in 2011.
