From the Vicarage:

The beginning of November sees the third anniversary of the parishes of Ashow, Leek Wootton and Stoneleigh coming informally together with a 'shared' Priest-in-Charge, me. It has been a challenging time as everyone has had to get used to new ways of working. Hopefully, by now, the 'teething problems', some of which were very painful for those concerned, are consigned to history and we are able to really move on into the future with renewed vision and hope to face the considerable challenges which will lie ahead. It is looking unlikely that any formal 'marriage' of the parishes will happen any time soon, so we can concentrate on the needs of each parish individually while still looking for ways in which we can grow together socially and in mutual interest and support.

Within the churches, we are beginning to do this by ensuring that we publicise the services and events that are taking place in the other centres. I hope that there will be a growing support for such events from across the three parishes as time progresses.

But as Parish Churches, all three are here to serve the whole population of their parishes – parishes which are far bigger geographically than just the villages which give them their names. Working out that desire to serve is often a real challenge, though there are many individuals from within the congregations who are actively serving the communities in many practical ways – not always overtly in the name of the Church, but certainly motivated by the love of Jesus within them. 3-PARISH SPOTLIGHT (Ashow-Leek Wootton-Stoneleigh) (See www.a-lw-s.org.uk for up-to-date service details and other information about the three parishes.)

Two excellent concert performances have been enjoyed during October: at Stoneleigh, where local group "Chorum" sang various pieces of Handel's compositions, and at Ashow, where a mixed voice choir from South Wales, "Con Voce", entertained with a very eclectic mix. Thanks to all involved in these concerts, whether actively involved in the organisation, or more passively involved in the audience.

Before we leave October, a last-minute reminder that Sunday 30th October is a "Fifth Sunday" when we will be gathering from across the parishes for a united service at Leek Wootton (10.15am) rather than our normal 9.30 or 11.00 services.

We also offer you the chance to remember and give thanks for the lives of loved ones, whether your bereavement is recent or further in the past. There are services at Leek Wootton on Sunday 30th October (3pm) and at Stoneleigh on Wednesday 2nd November (7pm). At both of these services, you are invited to light a candle as a sign of love and prayer.

Remembrance events will take place in all three parishes on Sunday 13th. Ashow's service is at the normal Sunday time of 9.30 where two of our ministry team, Gloria Vaughan and Audrey Rowberry, will be leading the traditional commemoration before moving on to do the same at Stoneleigh. Here, the service begins at 10.50am, allowing the Act of Remembrance to take place at 11am. Jim Perryman will be at Leek Wootton this year where the service begins in Church at 10am and includes the Scouting and Guiding groups parading their flags and taking part in the wreath laying. The service concludes in time for everyone to parade through the village to the Recreation Ground where, again, the uniformed groups take an active part in the 11am Act of Remembrance at the Village war memorial.

November ends with the start of the season of Advent – the Christian "New Year". The Advent Carol Service will again take place at Ashow Church on the evening of Advent Sunday (November 27^{th}).

The Stoneleigh History Society:

The October meeting was a very jolly occasion: the plan had been for members to bring along old photographs and other memorabilia to share, sparking off reminiscences.

On the night, we welcomed many visitors bringing their own archives, and a fascinating evening ensued, with many "oohs" and "ahs" being heard around the Club!

We also welcomed Dr Nat Alcock, whose book *People at Home - Living in a Warwickshire Village 1500-1800* is a seminal work on Stoneleigh's past, and who was pleased to receive honorary membership of the Society.

Members continue their researches into a variety of aspects of Stoneleigh's history, and we are beginning to feel that we have already made enormous progress in uncovering "the story of Stoneleigh."

I have not been informed of any incidents to report via NHW this month, which is refreshing news.

As darker nights are drawing in please ensure you lock all windows and doors securing your properties appropriately, leaving the odd light on and a radio sounding as this deters opportunists.

Door to door sales people have been active and there are so many scams going on. It came to my attention that a man in a van was trying to sell a new bed as when he tried to deliver it and the recipients were out? This is suspicious activity.

Another interesting one: a canvasser knocked doors in Coventry in a suit with a PDF in hand stressing the occupier's television licence was out of date? He then proceeded to ask for bank account details from them, to check their accounts? Do not give any personal information or data to anyone either at the door, over the telephone or on a computer unless you are 100% sure, most companies have secure sites but again, 'Err on caution' is advised.

If somebody knocks your door selling things and you are not sure simply say – no thank you - and close the door no matter how interesting the offer is or how nice they appear. Install a chain on your door or a spy hole so you can see who is at the door.

Winter is fast approaching; sorry to depress you but frosty mornings mean icy roads. Please check in on our elderly and more vulnerable friends and neighbours, just to see if they are secure, safe and warm. I am aware there is a very positive community here but it always worth noting.

Thank you all for your ongoing support and vigilance in striving to keep Stoneleigh safeguarded from crime.

Finally, the band at Stoneleigh enjoyed a modicum of success in coming third in the Call Change section of the Guild Striking Competition Final which was held at Tysoe on Saturday 24^{th} September. It was a most enjoyable (if nerve-racking!) afternoon in a beautiful village on a pleasant, sunny day. PC Ken Jones 1923 - 2011

It is with great sadness to learn of the passing away, on 11th September 2011, of Ex PC Ken Jones. He will be greatly missed by his wife Audrey and his extended family and friends.

Ken, born in 1923, met and married his wife Audrey in 1946. They celebrated their Diamond Wedding on the 26th October 2006. Both were 88 years of age at the time of his passing.

Ken came to Stoneleigh in 1959 as the new local village police constable and enjoyed the position until 1972 during which time he became a highly respected constable and valued member of the village community. With wife Audrey they lived in what was then the new Police house opposite the Victory Hall.

Like all Village Pcs before him, transport was his bicycle; this did not present too much hardship as both he and Audrey had been keen cyclists. However, this did not last because he was to become the first Stoneleigh PC to be motorised by Moped.

During his tenure, Ken attended many and varied incidents in and around the parish; one which was to remain a very vivid memory to him was the great fire at Stoneleigh Abbey where, although he was first on the scene and tried to do what he could, the west wing of the Abbey was completely destroyed.

Ken's work in the community can best be remembered for his work with the young people of the village, devoting much of his spare time to the Youth Club and Junior Youth Club from which he took enormous personal satisfaction and enjoyment from what he saw as his responsible contribution to the village community.

Following his retirement from the Police force, Ken worked at the Royal Show and as an ambulance driver for Social Services, again showing his wish to continue to serve others in some capacity.

During his working and married life, Ken always strongly believed that it was important to support the Family, the community and accept personal responsibility.

Ken leaves behind his wife Audrey and children Valerie, David and Kathryn, who have all lost a wonderful husband and father. Audrey

has expressed how they enjoyed their time at Stoneleigh and remembers especially their involvement with the Youth clubs, Ken playing cricket and all the lovely people of the Village.

STONELEIGH VILLAGE COMMUNITY ORCHARD: YOUR ORCHARD NEEDS YOU!

WHAT is this about?

This initiative to develop an orchard within the village has been made possible by funding through the Rural Development Programme for England and the LEADER

Programme to develop and support 'Orchards For Warwickshire'.

WHERE will it be?

The Stoneleigh Meadows Society have generously agreed to allocate part of the 'Meadows' for the orchard. It will be in the area adjacent to the spinney and the Coventry road bridge, bordering the river and the footpath up to the 'Victory' Oak. There will be approximately 46 mixed apple and pear trees with a wildflower meadow.

WHO is it for?

It is to be a community project and a facility for the whole village, for all to enjoy. It is suggested that villagers could become 'FRIENDS of the ORCHARD' with a donation of £10 to have a share in the fruit and perhaps sponsor a tree in memory of a loved one. This would help to provide a fund for future on-going maintenance costs, with fundraising events and sales of Stoneleigh Cider.

WHO will do it?

A small group of interested villagers have held six meetings to date, to work on this project, supported and advised by Gareth Davies, the Leader Project Representative. The trees are ordered and due for delivery, ready to be planted on the weekend of December 3rd 2011.

Farewell Mr Tuesday (1929-2011) - Rest in Peace.

When Janet and I lived in Stoneleigh Road before moving to the Village, we became acquainted with this gentleman, who had made his home in South Wainbody Woods, under the branches with a roof of black polythene sheeting suspended overhead. His name we never knew other than as Mr Tuesday which he explained was the day on which he arrived in Coventry. He had a few blankets for his bed and a small log fire on which he cooked his meagre meals; only he and his Maker will have known how he endured the cold of the long winter months.

We have no idea what rations he bought or on which he survived beyond what may have been provided by friends and kind neighbours. I and others who had conversations with him found him well spoken and obviously well educated; to my knowledge he read the classics, mainly in Latin, sometimes in Greek. He kept in touch with world affairs by a small mobile radio and through the Times newspaper which some kindly person provided for him.

On Tuesday, 11th October, 27 friends gathered at Oakley Wood Crematorium to bid farewell to this very fine gentleman, whose name and origins none of us knew; nor, so far as I know, could he be identified by the Police or Coroner. Whilst the police knew of him and his 'home' and kept an eye out for him, they had no idea of, or record of, his identity. At his funeral service he was simply listed as 'Mr Tuesday'.

From the very limited information we had gleaned from him, it appeared that he had been born in Newcastle on Tyne in November 1929; at some 50 years of age, in 1980 or thereabouts, he left the 'Gold Pavements' of London, having decided to walk away from his former life. He kept walking and, I imagine more by chance than intention, he arrived in Coventry. He rented a room in Earlsdon until his money ran out, when he was forced to take to the Woods, making his home some few hundred yards to the north of King's Hill Lane. He must have had a very hardy constitution to have survived the rigours of the English winters, bitter during recent years. Remarkably, he survived for 20 years or more, without ailing (so far as I know), though his heart finally failed him, unexpectedly, during September.

There are many unanswered questions; perhaps they never will be answered about this amazing character. Who was he, what was his upbringing and education, his employment, why did he forsake the conventional life for a home and survival in the woods? Why, evidently, no pension or social security benefits? All I do know is that he was a lovely man that one could not fail to respect and whom I was privileged to have met.

The Sykes family are synonymous with swimming, in fact – Liz and Graham's son Gareth swam for Great Britain for many years, their daughter Kate swam for Wales, and now their

18-year-old grandson Buster represents Australia!

And what about Liz? Her contribution to swimming has been no less significant, and was recognised on October 22nd when she was presented, at an ASA Annual Council meeting in Nottingham, with a well-deserved award for her services to swimming.

Liz has been secretary and welfare officer of the prestigious City of Coventry Swimming Club for more than 30 years, and since 1993 has been involved in running national events. Frequently zipping up and down the country at weekends in connection with one or other of these roles, Liz will be in London early next year for several days as she is on the committee for organising the Olympic trials.
