# FROM THE VICARAGE

Christmas – a message of peace, yet a time of hectic activity and noise. Bustling crowds focusing on trying to get the best for themselves and sparing little thought or time for those outside their own little world. Well, that is one picture of those events in Bethlehem as people flocked back to take part in the great census, taking little or no notice of the young couple searching for a place of rest and refuge as the time approached for the birth of the Saviour of the World. God's greatest gift was among them, yet they were blinded by their own more immediate needs and concerns.

In 1966, Simon & Garfunkel recorded a song called "7 O'clock News / Silent Night", where the gentle singing of the familiar carol is gradually challenged by the reading of a news bulletin telling the events of one day in America in that year. As the message of peace is sung, we hear of issues to do with the civil rights struggle, drugs, murders, protests and a call to increase the war effort in Vietnam. It is a powerful antithesis which reflects that same basic situation – that while God still offers his greatest gift, the message we listen to is one that bears no similarity. And so to Christmas 2011. The message remains the same, but so do the distractions. All the activity can so easily stop us from really experiencing the peace that God longs for us to receive – His peace in our hearts – peace flowing from a knowledge of God's love and grace and from a true sense of forgiveness and reconciliation. As one of Cliff Richards' Christmas songs ("Mistletoe & Wine") phrases it, "...a time for giving, a time for getting, a time for forgiving and for forgetting". We hope that our presentation of this eternal message, through our various and varied services and concerts through December, will help you to find time and space to leave the hustle and bustle, the noise and clamour, and to let God's greatest gift touch your hearts and lives, bringing real meaning and joy into your celebrations.

And for those who, like me, will know the sadness of having someone special missing from those celebrations this year, may that gift of God's love and peace be a special help and comfort for you.

However "Happy" or "Merry" you may or may not feel, I wish you all a Peace-full and Blessed Christmas and a Hope-filled New Year

## STONELEIGH NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH









**Damage to property:** At approximately 2100hrs on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> October 2011, offender(s) smashed a double-glazed window at the front of the Village Hall on Birmingham Road. Police were informed.

**Number plate theft**: At lunchtime on Sunday 13th November 2011, a black, crew-cab-style 4x4 was seen to drive down Church Lane and then drive away later. Subsequently, it was discovered that a car parked in Church Lane had had its number plates stolen. It appears that these were then fastened to the 4x4, which filled up at a petrol station and drove off without paying, but with the petrol station having taken the (stolen) registration number of the vehicle. Due to huge increases in fuel prices this year, this situation is becoming ever more common, apparently. Police were informed.

**Intruders disturbed?:** On Monday 14th November 2011 at about 2145hrs, an intruder was disturbed on the private rear drive serving the houses on Birmingham Road and The Bank. This drive connects with Stoneleigh Close. The single intruder ran off when a householder disturbed them but, as it was pitch dark, the person was only seen in silhouette. On Tuesday 15th November 2011 at about 1000hrs, a darkly-clothed and hooded male was seen by a resident in Church Lane looking suspiciously around the place. The resident called a neighbour for assistance, but by the time they arrived, the person had gone. Police are aware.

You will be pleased to know that the Police have increased their activity in Stoneleigh most recently and will continue to do so over the coming weeks.

Due to the clocks turning back and the nights drawing in, please ensure that preventative measures are in place at your properties so that you don't become a victim of crime. When your home is vacant, you can leave a hall lamp and/or light on a timer switch to give the impression of the property being occupied. Please make sure that all ladders, access towers etc are locked away, dismantled if not in use, or moved away from upstairs windows if you are out.

Please remember that crime 'prevention is always better than cure'. Please be vigilant and make sure that vehicles and property are secure.



# Quarterly update from Colin Hooper, Estates Director, Stoneleigh Park

#### New estate management team

I would like to introduce myself as the new Estates Director of all Stoneleigh Park's 1,047 acres. I am now firmly in the saddle, having taken up the post at the end of September to head the on-site estate management team.

Many of you will already know my colleague, Richard Wood, who is Facilities Director and a long-standing member of the estate management team. Richard and I work with the lead asset manager at LaSalle Investment Management, Andrew Bull, and his colleague, Chris Mitchell.

I was very pleased to receive an invitation from the Parish Council to meet regularly with them and contribute to this newsletter. I hope to become a familiar public face of Stoneleigh Park.

### A major new tenant - GEA Farm Technologies

In October, we had the pleasure of welcoming the head office of GEA Farm Technologies to the estate from their previous base in Milton Keynes. As the dairy industry's market leader, they felt it was crucial for them to be based at Stoneleigh. It was great to hear GEA Farm Technologies' managing director, Paul Gerrard, refer to Stoneleigh Park as "the Harley Street of agriculture", stating that it's where an agricultural business like theirs should be.

Over the months prior to their relocation, we worked closely with the GEA team to create an environment which was ideal for their business, and I am glad to be able to say that everyone is pleased with the outcome. Next time you visit Stoneleigh Park, have a look at the transformation made to the former JCB Pavilion at the north-western corner of the Grand Ring. GEA's new, modern facility includes a showroom, a warehouse for spare parts, a design centre for new dairy installations, a training centre, and dedicated space for corporate entertaining.

#### Meeting with local residents

About 80 local residents joined us for a presentation on our ambitions for the Stoneleigh Park estate on Thursday 27th October – just after the November issue of this newsletter went to press. LaSalle's Andrew Bull and the Royal Agricultural Society of England's Denis Chamberlain joined me to explain our plans to create an agriculture-related science park and a national equine centre of excellence. Local MP Jeremy Wright chaired the meeting, and we also heard from ward councillor, Bertie MacKay.

We heard a broad range of views in a long 'question and answer' session. There is a desire for us to build on existing personal links between Stoneleigh Park and the surrounding community.

The dominant issue raised was traffic. We understand your concerns about ease of movement in the area and quality of life. We have proposals for highways improvements that we believe will ease congestion and divert a significant proportion of Stoneleigh Park's traffic away from Stoneleigh village. We will share more information with the Parish Council and local residents as our plans develop.

# **DROP SCONES**

On a chilly weekend morning, there's nothing we enjoy more than drop scones for breakfast. The batter takes no time at all to make and the boys enjoy helping to cook them. They also enjoy eating them smothered in syrup, so it's a very occasional treat!

50g butter, melted 25g caster sugar 2 eggs, lightly beaten 250g self-raising flour 275ml milk Pinch of salt

Sift the flour and salt into a bowl. Stir in the sugar. Make a well in the centre, pour in the egg and a little of the milk, and start beating, gradually incorporating the flour. Beat in the melted butter. Gradually add in the rest of the milk until you have a smooth batter that drops reluctantly off the spoon.

Heat a frying pan over a medium heat. Grease with a little oil or butter. Drop tablespoonfuls of the scone mixture into the pan, leaving room for them to spread. After a couple of minutes, when they are set and little air bubbles start to appear, flip them over and cook until the second side is golden.

Serve with maple syrup, blueberries and bacon for a delicious winter breakfast treat!

Through Advent and Christmas, we especially hope that everyone will recognise that we are Three Parishes working TOGETHER. Everything on offer is offered to everyone – whether or not it is happening within the building you would feel a natural affinity to. If you need help to get to the event(s) you would like to attend, please ask (contact the vicar or one of the churchwardens) and we will do our very best to get you there – and back!

Sunday 11th December has lots of choices: the Kings' Chamber Orchestra are returning to Kenilworth for another of their excellent, and really enjoyable, concerts – this year at St Nicholas Church. There will be a concert geared to children in the afternoon (3.00pm) and for adults in the evening (7.30pm). Information for this can be found at the King's Table in Kenilworth. Sadly, this year's unexpectedly late date for their concerts means clashes with some of our own big events – so choices will have to be made, but the message is clear: don't choose to go away somewhere or to do nothing that day!

The same evening, local group "Chorum", led by Ron Binnie, the organist at Stoneleigh, will be performing Handel's "Messiah" in Stoneleigh Church at 6.30pm. Tickets available from the Stoneleigh Church office (admin@stoneleighchurch.co.uk).

Three carol services are on offer, each with a different style: a "family"-flavoured service at Leek Wootton on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> at 4.00pm; a "choral" service at Ashow on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> at 4.00pm; and a "Nine Lessons & Carols" service at Stoneleigh on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> at 7.00pm. If the one in your village isn't the most suitable for you, then please come to one of the others.

Two "Blessing of the Crib" services are on offer on Christmas Eve – 3.30pm at Leek Wootton and 5.00pm at Stoneleigh. Both are very child-friendly, but the Stoneleigh service is normally a little shorter than the Leek Wootton service. What time and timing best suits you and your family?

Two "Christmas Night" communion services are offered – 10.00pm at Stoneleigh and 11.30pm at Leek Wootton. These services will be very similar and reflect the tradition of the "Eve" being seen as the start of the new day rather than the end of the old one. If the 'midnight' element of this service is important to you, then Stoneleigh begins at midnight in Bethlehem and Leek Wootton includes midnight in the UK!

Christmas morning again offers options. The traditional words of the Book of Common Prayer will accompany our Eucharistic worship at 8.00am in Leek Wootton, and the more contemporary words will be used at 9.30am in Ashow. Informality and fun is the focus of our All Age Christmas Celebration at 11.00am in Leek Wootton, where we expect to see evidence of Christmas presents on view as we give thanks to God for his wonderful Present to us and all the world.



January may be seem a bit of an anti-climax after all that, but we have moved our Christingle service to the end of January for the season of "Candlemas", and so that will be something really special to look forward to at the start of 2012, a year which looks set to be full of highlights.



# LATEST ON HIGH SPEED RAIL





Those of us who thought that the campaign against HS2 would subside once the period for consultation closed in July have been proved wrong! Campaigning activities and media interest have continued in the following months, culminating with the publication of the report of the Transport Select Committee on 8th November. Although most newspaper and TV headlines intimated that this Committee fully supported HS2, nothing could be further from the truth. The Committee makes many serious criticisms of the project as currently envisaged, including flaws in the economic arguments used in its favour. the lack of a coherent integrated transport plan into which high speed rail might fit, and the need for much more work to gauge the likely impact on communities along the route. The majority of national, and many local, newspapers, radio and TV stations gave extensive coverage to the findings, which can be read in full on www.publications.parliament.uk/pa/cm201012/cmselect/ cmtran/1185/118502. Well worth a look. Apologies to those readers who don't have internet access.

During October, Philip Hammond was replaced as Secretary of State for Transport by Justine Greening, who is expected to announce the results of the public consultation, her reaction to the TSC's report, and her subsequent decision on HS2 in particular on or around 14th December. Prior to that, she has agreed to meet with MP's to listen to their concerns about the project. Representatives of the action groups in South Warwickshire, including the Stoneleigh Action Group, met our local MP, Jeremy Wright, on 17th November, and it is hoped that our views will be transmitted to the Secretary of State and that she will take these views into account.

Much uncertainty remains. In the event of the Government approving proposals for HS2, the Stoneleigh Action Group has made provisional plans for an information evening on Tuesday  $10^{th}$  January 2012 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. It is hoped that Jeremy Wright and key local personnel can be present on that occasion. As there is no January edition of the Stoneleigh & Ashow News, details will be distributed separately to residents if it is necessary for that event to go ahead.
