FROM THE VICARAGE

The season of Lent is on us once more and it saddens me that for many it is seen as something negative, designed to load us with guilt and to stop enjoyment. For me, Lent is a special opportunity. Yes, it is a time to reflect on our lives and our lifestyles as we 'join' Jesus in his 40 days fasting and praying in the desert region as he prepared himself for the start of his public ministry. Yes, it is a time to be more open to God's presence and guidance and a time to be more aware of the schemes of the evil one as he seeks to derail our relationship with a loving God and Father. But an emphatic NO to doom and gloom and token gestures of 'giving up ... for Lent'!

I much prefer to see Lent as a time for positively 'taking up' something which will help to develop our relationship with and understanding of God, and will also assist our fellowship and friendship with one another – for example joining one of the special groups which meet during the period of Lent. There are weekly home groups on a variety of evenings meeting for five sessions for discussion and bible study with people from around the different church fellowships in Kenilworth and the villages; there are midweek short Communion services followed by simple Soup & Bread lunches at Stoneleigh, and also the Saturday morning Lent Breakfast studies at Stoneleigh Village Hall. All these are open to everyone – whether a member of the church or not – and a far better idea than giving up chocolate!

Of course, if your lifestyle has destructive aspects to it then maybe it would be a good idea to use Lent as a positive encouragement to 'give up' such habits – just ensure that once Lent is over, the bad habits stay 'given up'.

Wishing you a positive, fulfilling and blessed Lent as we prepare ourselves for involvement in the great drama which is Holy Week and Easter.

A LOCAL BID FOR SUPERFAST BROADBAND

I promised you a quarterly update of Stoneleigh Park's news in the December issue of this newsletter. I haven't changed my mind! Expect a full update in the March edition. In the meantime, I was hoping I could enlist your help ...

Rural Community Broadband Fund

This area has a very narrow opportunity – in terms of funding and timing – to apply for superfast broadband under the Rural Community Broadband Fund. The area is in line to have minimum speeds of 2Mbps under the Government's core programme. We now have an opportunity to go for minimum speeds of 24 Mbps.

LaSalle's supporting role

Warwickshire County Council is leading on the application. LaSalle has become involved as manager of Stoneleigh Park. We are putting resources into the application process and will be pressing to ensure that the local area – including Stoneleigh Park and the parishes covered by this newsletter – get maximum priority. (The exact area that would be covered by superfast broadband is decided by the rules of the Rural Community Broadband Fund and is outside the control of either Stoneleigh Park or Warwickshire County Council.)

Demonstrating demand

The objective of Stoneleigh Park and local residents working together is fairly simple: the funding and the prioritisation will go to the areas that show greatest demand for superfast broadband. Evidence of that demand cannot be estimated. It must come directly from the residents and businesses of the area. We have to show that enough people in this area would definitely pay for superfast broadband if it were available and that what they intend to use it for does actually require superfast speeds.

How you can help:-

Your broadband use: Everyone in the area covered by the joint parishes can help. In fact, we really need everyone to get involved by completing the county council's questionnaire at

www.warwickshire.gov.uk/superfastbroadband

Please fill it in yourself and then pass on the details to as many people as you can think of – individuals and businesses – in the area who use the internet. It doesn't matter whether they would use the superfast speeds. We just need as complete a picture as possible of the problems, need and demand in the area.

The first round of bidding closed on 31st January. The deadlines for the second round of bidding had not yet been confirmed when I wrote this, but it is safe to say that the questionnaires must be completed by the end of March in order to give the county council a chance to prepare their application.

Finding BT's cabinets: There is an additional task for us in locating all of BT's cabinets in the area. These are the green boxes in public places. This is apparently a more difficult job than you might assume! There is a website where we can record any we come across:- <http://4sfb.crowdmap.com/> and there are smartphone apps that can help too. The more of these cabinets we find, the easier the job looks to the engineers and the more likely the upgrade is to happen.

HIGH SPEED RAIL LATEST

A village meeting was held in Stoneleigh Village Hall on 7th February at which the immediate implications of the Government's decision to press ahead with the HS2 project were discussed.

Various forms of mitigation have been proposed by HS2 Ltd, notably cuttings across Stoneleigh Park, and these would be taken forward by StAG (notably requesting 'cut and cover' which would reduce noise for the surroundings and cause far less disturbance to the enterprises at the Park).

The Government, through HS2 Ltd, has decided to establish a series of 'Community Forums' through which interested parties can put forward their views. The exact nature and structure of these bodies have yet to be announced, or which of the action groups Stoneleigh/Ashow/Stareton/Stoneleigh Abbey and Park will be 'twinned'. Watch this space! Whatever happens, the StAG will continue to argue the case for mitigation in this area.

There is to be a consultation about the form that any compensation might take, both in the short or long term. Again, the details have yet to be announced but there will be a tight time-table. One issue will be property blight which occurred as soon as the route was announced in March 2010. In order to assist a strong case being made for compensation in the short term rather than after the railway is up and running (c2026), it would be helpful if anyone who has had difficulty selling their house, or feels unable to move, because of property blight, would send details - in confidence - to Martin Smith, 23 Birmingham Road, Stoneleigh, or architect_smith@yahoo.co.uk.

Various groups which oppose HS2, including the 51M Group of county/district councils along the route, are considering the possibility of a Judicial Review, questioning several aspects of last year's consultation exercise. Again, further details are awaited.

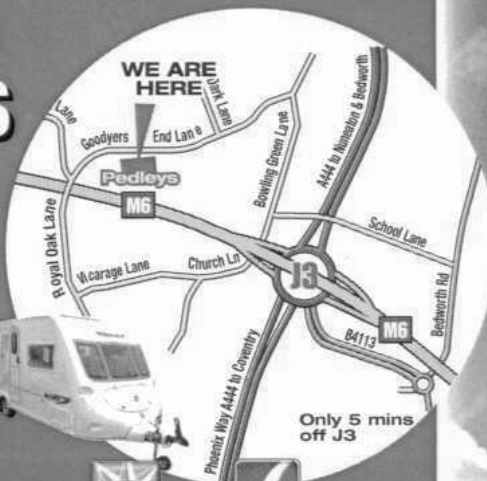

LEEK WOOTTON LINK-UP

The congregation at Leek Wootton are trying to deal with a problem this month. There isn't enough space for the Children's groups to meet during the Communion services and some families have begun to stop coming because of the squash! We are experimenting with three different options in the run-up to Easter and asking people for their opinions of what works best: Use another room at a neighbouring house (by kind permission of the owners!), stop the groups and just have a crèche and then have a children's service in the afternoon, or have all groups meet at the school and then walk up to church to join in the end of the service. These will be tried in turn at the 9.30 a.m. communion services on February 26th, March 11th and 25th. Other 9.30 a.m. services are All Age Worship (including Parade Service on Mothering Sunday), and there is a traditional language 8.00 a.m. communion each week.
