HIGH SPEED RAIL UPDATE

There has been a flurry of media activity on the subject of high speed rail. Numerous newspaper articles, television and radio broadcasts and social media exchanges on the HS2 project mean that more people are now aware of the issues involved. An excellent summary of the arguments against HS2 appear on the village website www.stoneleighvillage.org.uk

The timetable for mitigation and compensation consultations has slipped considerably and there has been a delay in announcing the dates for the second meetings of Community Forums . The Stoneleigh -Kenilworth-Burton Green Forum is likely to be on 13 June but at the time of writing (17 May) this is yet to be confirmed. Meanwhile, StAG members and Stoneleigh Park have been preparing documentation for a meeting with the HS2 Ltd. engineer assigned to this section of the route and it is hoped that detailed proposals can be discussed with him in the near future.

The campaign to bring to national attention some of the financial liabilities associated with this project is going well. This is being spearheaded by campaigning groups such as the HS2Action Alliance www.hs2actionalliance.org, AGAHST (the federation of action groups against HS2, www.betterthanHS2.org) and Stop HS2. Readers can contribute financially, or otherwise, directly to this by contacting the respective websites or through StAG (email: stagagainsths2@live.co.uk).

YouTube enthusiasts might care to look at several clips on http://stophs2.org, notably proceedings of the Public Accounts Committee during which it was divulged that the Major Projects Authority had designated the HS2 project as Amber/Red in its' current form (i.e. far from satisfactory, failing to meet various criteria etc.).

Scams – Please be very careful if someone is calling you reporting your bank account or internet account has been hacked. No matter how plausible, do not give your bank details to anyone over the telephone. Your bank already has this information and to verify who you are, have a list of familiar security questions that do not include account numbers or sort codes.

Do not hand over bank cards to prank callers or bank details to anyone no matter how official if the call to your home as the banks do not operate like this and simply de-activate cards electronically via computer. Please be careful. Such people say they are from your bank or television license companies and will be very believable; refuse to give them information. If you are in doubt go to your local branch and speak to an advisor.

No crimes to report this month. However, summer is on its way so please be careful and secure your property - do not leave windows wide open unattended in your homes or cars. Do not leave anything of value in clear sight in your car - lock it in the boot. N.B. There is a team of three lads visiting local communities and villages in a silver Ford Fiesta registration W68 VOJ breaking into cars in the early hours of the morning; if you see this car please report it to the police immediately.

If you see any traffic incidents or ASB caused by motorist passing through the village please make a note of the registration number and report these incidents to the police; this includes HGV that are not suppose to cut through.

If you think somebody is acting suspiciously they probably are so do report anything unusual to the police. Let's remain vigilant and keep up the strong crime prevention in our area.

The petition to close the Birmingham Road at the Coventry Road end was officially handed over to Councillor Doody at the East Warwickshire Community Forum meeting at Offchurch and received the unanimous backing of the delegates who attended.

W.C.C.have now replied to us confirming they have formally accepted a petition from the village with 215 eligible signatures supporting the proposal. The petition was also supported at the village meeting by a majority of 17-4. We have also received a letter of support from Jeremy Wright M.P. who is well aware of the dangerous and damaging effects the problems with the Birmingham Road are having on the community having supported the same campaign 7 years ago. We are now awaiting W.C.C.s response to the petition and that the overall majority of villagers.
