# High Speed Rail Latest

The past month has seen a tremendous amount of media speculation about the likely future of the HS2 project. However, there has been very little progress in terms of the promised discussions about mitigation and compensation which HS2 Ltd had originally promised would be introduced in Spring 2012. The second Community Forum for Kenilworth-Stoneleigh-Stareton and Stoneleigh Park had been announced for late May, but will now be held on 26<sup>th</sup> June. We await a date with the HS2 Engineer to discuss our own mitigation proposals. Meanwhile, several constructive meetings have been held between local action groups and Warwick District Council.

And so the focus switches to the coming of the world to enjoy the spectacle which will be London 2012 – Olympics and Paralympics. I will be spending my summer holidays as a "Games Maker" (volunteer), with my main role apparently being helping media people on and off buses in the Olympic Park at Stratford (London rather than 'upon Avon'!) I have done most of the training (the last bit will be between my writing this and you reading it), I have the uniform, I know my shifts and I'm raring to go.

I've always been a sports fan, with the Olympics having captured my imagination from a very young age. My earliest memory is the excitement of British swimmer Anita Lonsbrough winning a gold medal at the Rome Olympics in 1960. I would only have been 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>! I often wondered why I remembered only her, but having had a look at our 'medal winners' in Rome, I discover that our only other gold was won in the 50km Walk, which has never been the most exciting spectator event!

As the years progressed, my being glued to the TV for both Summer and Winter Olympics became the norm. 1964 introduced me to the astonishing sight of Bobsleigh as Nash and Dixon won gold at Innsbruck, while the Tokyo summer event introduced me to early morning TV and the frustration of having to go to school when there was something far more interesting to do. The courage and determination of these athletes really caught the imagination. Sadly, my ability at sport never matched my passion for it, so my 'Olympic dream' never got further than the pillow – until now. The irony, of course, is that I will be so involved with the mundane job that I have been allocated to that I will not get to see so much of the action on TV; but to be involved – to be part of it, albeit a very tiny cog in a huge machine – is special.

Of course, the torch relay will be passing our way on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> July, and one of the runners, Melanie Barratt (née Easter), a Paralympic gold medallist and mother of a child at Leek Wootton School, will hopefully arrive with her torch at the 'opening ceremony' of our "On Your Marks" Holiday Club. The club, for primary-school-aged children, will be at All Saints' School from Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> to Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> August, with the opening and closing ceremonies being our 9.30am services at Leek Wootton on Sundays 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> August. # Ashow's Coronation Chicken

Among the delicious food served at the Ashow Jubilee celebrations was Coronation Chicken. Many guests asked for the recipe, so here it is...

12 chicken joints Some grapes, sliced Some unsalted cashew nuts 1 pint mayonnaise <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> pint sour cream 2 tbsp curry powder 1 medium onion, sliced 1 bay leaf Dry white wine Salt & pepper Watercress for decoration

Remove the skin from the chicken joints and place in a shallow casserole. Cover with dry white wine, a bay leaf and the sliced onion. Cook in a medium oven for 20 to 30 minutes. Leave overnight to cool in the liquid. Remove the meat from the joints. Mix together the mayonnaise, sour cream, curry powder, salt and pepper. Add the chicken stock, a few cashew nuts and a few sliced grapes. Arrange in a dish and decorate with further nuts, grapes and watercress. Serves 6.



# Best of British Choral Music

Beyond the pomp and ceremony of the better-known works, there is a more tender and reflective side to British choral music. *Hymnos*, under the direction of James Barnard, explore this with their programme *Best of British Choral Music*, contrasting both sacred and secular choral music of the Renaissance with works from the Romantic period and the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The programme includes music by Thomas Tallis, Thomas Morley, Edward Elgar, Herbert Howells and Benjamin Britten.

# Stoneleigh Cricket Club

For those who have been hoping for reports from SCC in the last two editions, there is only one word – WET. Due to the bad weather, this has been the most awful start to the season that anyone can remember. At the time of writing, a total of 10 out of 18 matches have been cancelled plus the six-a-side competition and, of those that have been played, many have been on soggy, slow pitches in murky conditions. Credit must go to groundsman, Joe Ball, for heroic efforts to get pitches prepared, often to see rain still intervene at the eleventh hour.

#### South Northants League Division 1

Only four of the scheduled eight matches have been played, with one win and three defeats. Most of the teams have had a similar number cancelled, but pity poor Willoughby and Preston Capes, both of whom have played only two matches in the league.

The one win was a good effort against Afro Caribbean from Milton Keynes, when Dave Beale's 72 and KP Bains' 68 helped us amass 237. Phil Chapman was the pick of the bowlers, with 4-36 as the visitors were bowled out for 143. An entertaining game against Radway saw us fall a few short when chasing 207 to win, with Dave Beale again prominent with 91.

The league season is nearly at the halfway point, but the table is so far largely academic until more games have been played.

#### Friendlies

Although the weather was not great, the match against BBC Midlands was notable for the appearance of former England Test bowler, Gladstone Small. He starred with the bat, making a combative 47 out of BBC's total of 174. We never seriously challenged their total, although Smudger will doubtless dine out for years on having hit Gladstone, bowling at a pace considerably less than in his pomp, for a couple of fours.

Other friendlies were notable for some personal bests. Andy Waite made 70 in the victory over Everdon. In the same match,

new recruit Udara Pieris made 50, while leg-spinner Venkat marked his debut with 6-34.

And finally, congratulations to Phil Chapman who made his maiden century for the Club in the match against Aston Unity. Well done Phil – let's hope it's the first of many.


