#### STONELEIGH LEISURE FACILITIES

A major problem in our village is insufficient facilities available for the YOUNG people to find or to use; this has led to anti-social behaviour.

Towards the Autumn of last year Tony Samouelle(our chairman) and I were close to the tennis courts when we noticed two boys (of no more than 10/11) playing football inside the the supposedly 'locked' area – we asked 'Why they were they there?' They replied that as one of the courts was never used – so why shouldn't they use it? This started a train of thoughts that prompted us to take a petition around the vast majority of the houses in the village, asking people whether they would be in favour of a plan to establish a play area alongside the village hall. The result was a resounding approval, without a single objection.

The outcome has been to change the tennis court area into two by erecting a strong 10ft high welded wire mesh fence between the existing courts and around the perimeter of the area. The northerly court will become a 5-a-side football pitch with goals and subsequently an area for general play. This area is fully enclosed with its own gate and will be opened each morning and locked at night.

The other half, on the south side next to the car park, has a repaired and expertly resurfaced tennis court that will be locked and used only by the playing membership of the tennis club. A pathway has been provided alongside the court from the car park for the use of wheelchair users and others.

The total cost of this work of is just over £61,000. It has been my task to ask, cajole and plead for help from the many charities that I have contacted. The major contribution has been from Warwick District Council who approved 50% of the total. Some other charities/foundations include £10,000 from an International charity; £6,500 from the Leigh Educational Foundation; £1,000 from the Stoneleigh Joint Charities and £1000 from the Stoneleigh Male Voice Choir. The total cost of the project is mainly available – BUT we are short of about £6,000.

## PLEA – ARE THERE ANY OF OUR READERS/FRIENDS WHO COULD HELP REDUCE THIS SHORTFALL?

At some time in September, post Olympics, Dave Moorcroft has kindly agreed to officially open the facility. You will all be invited to be there – date and time to be announced.

## Baginton Village Facilities for Stoneleigh Residents

Baginton have several facilities for toddlers and young people that they wish to offer to people living in Stoneleigh. I have been contacted by Victoria Newman who wishes me to pass on the details to you.

A toddler group is run on Tuesday mornings (term time only) from 10.00 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. at the Village Hall in Frances Road. At present they have a waiting list for people who wish to join but they keep some spaces available for Baginton residents and they have decided to extend these non-waiting list places to the residents of Stoneleigh

They have also just started a new Children's Health Visitor Clinic which will run once a month during the Tuesday toddler group. Veena the health visitor will be available to weigh the children, offer nutritional and development advice or answer any health related questions about the children. A trial session was run on the 17th July and the regular clinic begins in the new school year in September.

They also work with the support of the Kenilworth Children's Centre, of which residents of Stoneleigh are also in the catchment area. Every fortnight a member of their team joins us at the Village Hall to offer information and support to the parents and carers. They provide details of events, classes and clubs that run out of their Kenilworth site and residents of Baginton and Stoneleigh can take advantage of this.

### HIGH SPEED RAIL LATEST

The summer has been extremely busy as far as the HS2 project is concerned and there has been increasing media coverage as more people beyond the current first stage of the route realise the immense cost and other implications, and the flaws in the existing proposal.

There have been strategy meetings between the Warwickshire County Council and the action groups, a meeting on 15 July between Jeremy Wright M.P.and representatives of action groups within his constituency, and an informal local briefing of HS2 Ltd staff by representatives of Stoneleigh, Stareton and Stoneleigh Park.

An HS2 Ltd Community Forum meeting was held on 26 June and another one is scheduled for 5 September. These are rather cumbersome meetings at which it is difficult to get detailed points across as so many interested parties are involved. In an attempt to deal with this problem, a series of local meetings were set up at which different mitigation proposals could be discussed in detail with HS2 Ltd staff.

The further meetings to discuss the two local proposals (one covering the area across Stoneleigh Park, the other from Gate 3 to the A46) were held on 15 August. Should these proposals be accepted the impact of the railway on this area will be considerably (but regrettably not entirely) reduced. The meetings were relatively open and frank but HS2 engineers stated that they have not yet done enough detailed design work to comment or offer solutions to the issues raised. It is hoped that discussions will continue in the coming months.

It has been announced recently that there are sufficient grounds for Judicial Reviews (supported by the '51M' group of councils along the route) in which the various flaws in the proposals can be considered. Of particular concern has been the discovery that over 400 detailed replies to the consultation in 2011 were somehow 'lost'. Thus, the response from our M.P, Jeremy Wright, the Action HS2 Alliance and many other individuals and organisations (mainly those against the project as currently envisaged) were not included in the consultants' report. It is expected that the Judicial Reviews will be held in

December. An announcement about the form in which consultation on compensation will take place is expected at roughly the same time.

As we go to press, the Department for Transport has announced that from 2013 FirstGroup will operate the West Coast Main Line in place of Virgin and that increased capacity is expected. Given that increased capacity is the main justification given for HS2, even further doubts have been raised about the validity of the proposals. Again - watch this space!

We were sad to hear of the death of Bill Tebby aged 84. Bill played frequently for Stoneleigh between 1977 and 1983 and will be remembered for his fitness and enthusiasm.
