#### The Grand Opening of Stoneleigh Village Hall Leisure Facilities



On Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> September Stoneleigh's new leisure facility was opened by our area's greatest athlete David Moorcroft OBE. It was most gracious of David to perform this act; he has been a very keen supporter of the Male Voice Choir at both the musicals in the Spring and at the Summer Serenades.

The project was completed on time and to budget by our major contractor "PrestigeSportsPitches" of Towcester.



The 5-a-side football pitch was put to much use on the first day it was serviceable at the beginning of August and the tennis area was completed at the beginning of September; the feed back reports from both areas have been excellent. The tennis area has a netball court marked out with portable net posts. As the tennis area is locked it will be necessary for anyone hoping to use the court, to contact Janet Charlesworth on

It is hoped that the provision of an official play area will encourage our younger villagers to reduce their use of car parks and roads, so overcoming possible boredom and the possibility of personal accidents and anti-social behaviour. We ask the young ones to look after their area, ensuring that they keep it tidy for others.

The facility is under the control of the Village Hall & Playing Fields Trust who wish to point out that it is for the use of anyone living in the village and its surrounding area.

The total cost is £63,500 of which £61,000 has already been donated, the remaining is promised to us.

The Stoneleigh Village Hall & Playing Fields Trust Committee wish to thank all the Charities, Trusts and personal contributors for their generosity and also to the WI for providing the refreshments on Sunday.



## High Speed Rail Latest September 2012.



As I write this, the political chairs have been moved with the appointment of a new Secretary of State, Patrick McLoughlin. Our MP, Jeremy Wright, should know him well since he was Chief Whip and Jeremy served in his office.

What this means for Transport policy we cannot tell. Much speculation has been made about a review of the case for the third runway at Heathrow. There has been a lobby for a Heathrow Spur for HS2, currently omitted from the first phase, since the outgoing Secretary of State, Justine Greening, was opposed to a third runway at Heathrow.

The fate of HS2 as a project may hang in some balance, but we must continue to take this major project seriously. This country has not seen a railway designed to this specification before. I must stress that the moment for thinking that common sense will prevail, since the business case is flawed, the route selection is wrong and the design specification is far too ambitious and unnecessary, has long passed. Present economic considerations are also being ignored.

We have had the third Community Forum and await a further meeting with the HS2 team on 24th October to discuss specific local details and get some feedback from our mitigation proposals. Our concerns are to provide visual, vibration and probably most importantly noise protection from aerodynamic noise sources on the trains, due to the proposed speed.

Some other details are coming out, e.g. we know that there will be substations along the route every 4-5km and that one of the main

power feeder stations will be just outside of Burton Green where the National Grid station is located. We were also asked for our opinion to site a contractor's compound just outside the village. I must stress that was a preliminary idea, and we have responded in the strongest possible way back to HS2 that the area just cannot take any more traffic flow in the light of other proposed developments and natural growth of existing users, e.g. University.

The Community Forum idea in theory is good, but ours has a large number of interest groups and individuals in attendance, which means that progress is slow. Some members could do with remembering that there are many facets to these and much to get through in 2 hours every two months, and time is spent asking questions to which there are no answers available. That is just a fact. HS2 suggest that these will continue for as long as the Communities along the route require them to be held and need a voice to be heard.

Membership of the Stoneleigh Action Group has fallen over the past two and a half years since the group was formed. It is only understandable that attrition of membership takes place, especially since this project is over such a long time period. #### STONELEIGH PARK

I make no apology for speaking in support of Stoneleigh Park's masterplan. Outline planning permission has been granted and the future of the Royal Agricultural Society of England secured. I have listened to my residents and have had meetings with Colin Hooper, Estates Director, La Salle Investment Management (LIM), always seeking to influence plans and projects. I neither took part in the debate nor voted. I can assure you that much thought has gone into planning of building dimensions, locations, densities and into improved infrastructure. They have listened to concerns about the impact on Stoneleigh Abbey; traffic management and maintaining the dominance of agriculture, equine and rural. Our Ward residents influenced two important changes. Disappointment at a lack of design style led to the appointment of a reputable architect; suspicions about an invasion of general office space led to a voluntary cap on the volume, enshrined in a Condition. The B4113 past Gate 1 will be improved; the single lane bridge after Gate 3 will be widened and the traffic from the A46 will be directed as far as possible to Gate 3, avoiding the village.

Events are controlled by a separate company on a 25 year lease from RASE. Car parks 4, 4A, 5 and 5A are leased by Stoneleigh Abbey. I shall continue a constructive dialogue with LIM and continue listening to residents. Please contact me with concerns of ideas.

#### The Nave Roof Appeal

We were hugely disappointed to hear from English Heritage that they had rejected our application for a grant of £280,000 towards to cost of replacing Stoneleigh church roof. They have suggested that we re-apply next year. Because of this we have had to set aside in a designated account the amount we have raised so far, the total of which was, at the end of August, £19,726. This includes the £2,623 raised by the stupendous concert by the Stoneleigh Male Voice Choir and their Welsh Choir colleagues. We must however, continue to raise money so that English Heritage can see that we are enthusiastic in our determination to see the project completed.

#### St Mary's Social Events

The latest Stoneleigh film night was on Friday 7th September when the film 'The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel' was shown. This broke all records with 42 people attending, many of whom were 'first timers'. Please keep an eye out for details of our forthcoming events and join in if you would like, you will be warmly welcomed.
