#### HIGH SPEED RAIL - A PERSONAL CRISIS FOR US ALL

There have been several worrying developments since the February edition of the News. A few days before the 31st January deadline for submissions on the compensation consultation, the Government announced the route for the next stage of the HS2 project - 'The Y Route' which takes the route north of Birmingham towards Manchester and Leeds.

A lengthy debate followed in the House of Commons during which it became clear that the Government (with the support of the Labour Party) is determined to press ahead with the project, regardless of the overall costs, the weak business case, environmental damage AND many years of property and business blight, stress, noise and disruption to thousands of households, including *all* those in this area.

Note that very few properties in this area will have to be demolished and therefore qualify for full compensation; the vast majority cannot claim any compensation until after trains are running (2026 at the earliest) - meanwhile, we are just left to grin and bear it!

Arguments continue about the exact route and its impact, the number and location of stations (definitely not in Coventry) but objections are being disregarded by central Government, the Department for Transport and HS2 Ltd. with little sign that the bilateral meetings on local mitigation or the Community Forums are performing the role they were set up to play, namely listening to local communities.

Certainly we in StAG have become increasingly frustrated that very little notice is being taken of our comments/objections, despite strenuous efforts to produce well-researched documentation, and to engage fully and politely with the officials involved.

The results of Judicial Reviews are awaited but we as a group are now pessimistic about the outcome of our own efforts and those of the other action groups up and down the proposed route. Construction work will have a severe effect on communities. Thus, every road west of Stoneleigh will be severed and this, taken together with proposed contraflow roadworks on the A46, will make communication by road to Kenilworth, Leamington, Warwick etc. difficult,

affecting commuting traffic, private journeys, school buses and - very importantly - emergency services. The recent traffic chaos caused by the Shooting Show at Stoneleigh Park will be nothing compared with what lies ahead for us. There is also a very recent proposal by HS2 Ltd. to site a large spoil dump, compounds and worksites together with temporary accommodation for construction workers of 11,000 square metres between the B4115 (Ashow Road) and the A46. All this will be in addition to the more immediate impacts that the proposed expansion of Stoneleigh Park and the implementation of the Gateway scheme will have on us all (if indeed they go ahead).

The Government still plans to introduce a Hybrid Bill in Parliament before the next election (possibly later this year). This will give the legal go-ahead for the project. Warwick District Council remains opposed, Coventry is wavering.

# THE STONELEIGH HISTORY SOCIETY DROVE ROADS

How were the animals taken from their pastures to markets before the age of train and lorry? They walked!

The longest and hardest drove route, the route that required the most skill, started in Wales from the far north west and passed nearby - possibly even across the 3rd tee at Coventry Golf Club.

If one sees the drove as a river, the Welsh end was a mass of tributaries which converged in the Midlands then split up again as it neared the South-East. Locally the drove road passed Meriden, Kenilworth, Cubbington, Offchurch and Southam. Thereafter, the destinations included Northampton, Kent, Essex and the London markets.

From the late 16th century, geese and turkeys walked the hundred miles from Norfolk to Leadenhall market in London each year. The journey would take three months and the birds wore special leather boots to protect their feet. Sometimes cattle would give birth along the way, and walk the remainder of the journey with their calves slung beneath them.

What does all this mean to us, here in Stoneleigh and Ashow?

Bruce Smith, historian and expert on Drove Roads, will talk about this ancient tradition at The Stoneleigh History Society meeting on Tuesday 26th March at 7:30 pm in the Village Hall. The talk will be preceded, briefly, by the Society's AGM.

It promises to be a lively presentation, with particular reference to our local drove roads. Find out where the route went near you and how to recognise the old routes, which you may well have driven along in a car recently!

Non-members are also most welcome to attend.

### Stoneleigh Park Farm Walk Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2013 at 10 am – 12.30 pm

As part of the Friendly Farmer project to help inform communities about local farming, food production and rural management, **Warwickshire Rural Hub** has organised a farm walk around parts of the Stoneleigh Park estate.

The **free of charge** walk will include examples of grassland, woodland and shoot/game management on the estate, the Livestock Market, the sites for the Grasslands and Muck event and the planned Equine Centre. The walk should be of interest to all ages, including children and will be led by Alan Hunt, Stoneleigh Park Farm Manager and Colin Hooper, Estates Director.

You are advised to wear suitable clothing and footwear (wellingtons or strong boots) as the walk may involve walking through fields/woodland and uneven surfaces. Mini buses will be available to transport visitors between the various sections of the walk.

Car parking will be available next to the St. Johns Ambulance building just inside the main gate and the walk will commence from there at **10 am**.

The programme will conclude at the Farmers Fayre shop at Stoneleigh Park to hear about locally sourced food. There will also be an opportunity to purchase local produce and refreshments.

#### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING



The March Ordinary Council Meeting will be held at the Ashow Village Club, Ashow at 7.30 pm on 14th March 2013.

#### WDC - New Plastics Recycling Scheme

From the 1st April you will be able to recycle plastic pots, tubs and trays through the red box and bag scheme. Between the 11th and 22nd March refuse crews will be putting a collection calendar on all grey bins with further information about the new scheme. A leaflet will be sent through the post to properties without a grey wheeled bin.

WDC plan to deliver an additional recycling bag to all properties between 25<sup>th</sup> February and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2013. The new bag will be exactly the same as the current recycling bags. It can be used for cardboard and plastic pots, tubs, trays and bottles - mixed together or preferably separated into separate bags. The new bag is purely to provide extra space for the new plastics that can be recycled. WDC will only deliver 1 bag per property and are therefore asking residents to trial their new bag throughout April. If you still need extra bags after this time please contact WDC to order one in May.

#### WARWICKSHIRE COMMUNITY OIL SYNDICATE

Some readers of the Stoneleigh & Ashow News already participate in very effective oil-buying syndicates but some of those that do not may be interested in The Warwickshire Community Oil Syndicate, run by Warwickshire Rural Community Council.

One of twenty-two Rural Community Councils (all long-standing independent charities) across England, running an oil syndicate.



They have no connection to any oil supplier and are simply interested in obtaining the best possible price per litre.

People join the oil syndicate by paying an annual membership fee, currently £20 per annum, directly to Warwickshire Rural Community Council, which will cover as many oil orders as you need during the course of the year.

A recent deal was negotiated with oil supplied at a price of 61.95 pence per litre, giving a saving of 6.42 pence per litre against the average market price. (Results from their latest survey were: market high 77.5 ppl; internet average 63.95 ppl; market average 68.37 ppl).

### ST. MARY THE VIRGIN STONELEIGH ANNUAL ACCOUNTS 2012

As I write this report the draft accounts have been passed to the examiner, for him to give his seal of approval. It is every treasurer's expectation that if any errors are found they will be minor ones! The draft accounts show that we had a trading surplus of £2,536 at the end of the year.

The rejection by English Heritage of our grant application, to support our own efforts to raise the estimated £280,000 total required for the replacement of the nave roof and repair of the stonework, has overshadowed our activities in 2012. However, our efforts to raise money have continued. We now have £26,999 in the designated roof fund compared to £19,726 at the end of 2011.

Income raised through gift aided personal giving has increased year on year as have our other collections. Given that in 2011 the total gift aid recovered was inflated by money raised from one off donations, the 2012 total figure, of £23,548 for income from giving, is very encouraging.

Overall expenditure is down £1,628 and this is positive. There are headings that reflect an increase over 2011 but most of those are the outcome of increased VAT and costs generally.

This is a brief summary of last year's accounts. If you want more of the detail come along to the church on 23rd April for the Annual Parish meeting.
