Stoneleigh church bells to be rung on the evening of Friday 9th May

We hope that many of you will be joining us for the World War 1 commemoration evening, as advertised in the magazine. This is to give notice that the church bells will be rung at the end of the entertainment, at approximately 9.45pm. We hope this will not cause any inconvenience for you.

HIGH SPEED RAIL LATEST

As reported in the last edition of the News, submissions were made on HS2 Ltd.'s 50,000 page environmental consultation by the Stoneleigh Action Group (against HS2) and Stoneleigh & Ashow Parish Council. A lengthy submission was also made by Warwickshire County Council, with others - including from Jeremy Wright MP, and local councillor John Whitehouse, and other local action groups - so there should be no doubt about the strength of local feeling, not only about the project itself but also about the huge effects during the construction period if it goes ahead.

Apparently there were 22,000 submissions from individuals and organisations. The number may seem small but apparently this is considered a good response and the strength of feeling should not be ignored. Shortly after the extended deadline, the House of Commons Environmental Audit Committee started to further consider the likely environmental impact of HS2. For anyone as yet unconvinced that many serious questions remain either unanswered, answered unsatisfactorily, or ignored, are referred to www.hs2aa.org then follow the link to their evidence.

The next stage before the Hybrid Bill (which will give the parliamentary go-ahead for work to begin and was originally scheduled to be debated by Parliament this spring) is the Petition stage when anyone can put forward a case against the proposal. The fee for petitioning is £20. More details from www.stophs2.org StAG and the Parish Council are co-ordinating responses. Recently, the Secretary of State for Transport has voiced doubts that the Hybrid Bill will get through Parliament before the next election but petitioning will still go ahead this year.

On 17 March, Sir David Higgins, the new Chief Executive of HS2 Ltd., charged with delivering the project, at reduced costs, gave his verdict on the project to date

So far millions £(if not billions) have been spent on consultants, in particular engineering and public relations, and this has meant an increase in assertions in the media about the merits of the case for HS2. Volunteers in action groups, Stop HS2, the HS2 Action Alliance, and many other economic and business experts (including the Institute of Directors) have continued to challenge these assertions.

Postscript:

Events continue to move on this project. Overall clarity on the delivery and the objectives of the project are still awaited. Nevertheless it appears that Parliament on the whole supports the proposal although it is not clear if MPs have actually scrutinised the details, especially if they are "off route" MPs (the majority). There are something like 15 "on route" MPs, mostly Conservative. The Hybrid Bill stage presents that opportunity for scrutiny, but it now depends, obviously, upon the impartiality of that Committee. It is likely that the Committee will be formed after the Second Reading of the Bill but unlikely that such a Committee will make substantial progress before the summer recess, if at all. Thus the prospect for obtaining Royal Assent before the next General Election is minimal, as agreed by the Secretary of State for Transport, Patrick McLoughlin.

Our prospects for influencing matters now is through Parliamentary petitioning. Elsewhere in this Edition you will find a Public Notice for a meeting(s) to discuss this.

Stoneleigh History Society

Our March meeting was our third AGM, and after "business" was concluded we were fortunate to have a particular treat – a talk by Dr Nat Alcock on The Weaver's House in Spon End, Coventry. There will be a follow-up visit to the house itself in May.

On April 29th our meeting will be a talk on "When Stoneleigh Went to War", when I shall be examining the life of the village when war broke out in 1914. This will anticipate both the May 9th commemorative evening held at the church (see advert elsewhere in the edition for details) and the Society's main display of 2014, which will be centred on the men who served in the Great War and who, happily, returned. Please do come along and discover more about Stoneleigh, the way its people lived 100 years ago, and how they responded to the outbreak of war. Sheila Woolf

THE WI REPORT

The title of Paul Betterton's talk at our meeting in March was "Mysteries of the Titanic". He covered the construction of the Titanic, one of four large luxury liners built by the White Star Line, some of the bad omens surrounding her maiden voyage, the sinking of the ship and the rescue of some of the passengers. He spoke about the many myths and mysteries which surround the Titanic. He also talked about collecting Titanic memorabilia and the high prices some items fetch.

On Monday 10th March the Annual Federation Meeting, which took place at the Chesford Grange Hotel, was attended by 21 members from Stoneleigh. The meeting was attended by the National Federation Chairman, Janice Langley, who spoke about the preparations being made to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the first WI in England and Wales in 1915. Tim Hewlett, the former Head of Royal Travel described his experience of organising journeys for senior members of the Royal Family, by plane and train at home and aboard. Sue Bleasdale spoke about the Central England Rehabilitation Centre situated in Heathcote, Leamington. Patients often spend several months there and WFWI has launched an appeal to raise money to buy items which will improve the comfort of long stay patients.

The main speaker, Eleanor Stewart described her experiences in France as a novice nun and in Liverpool as a nurse and a midwife. She explained that after working as a midwife for some time she decided to leave her convent because she realised that she wanted children of her own.

One final reminder that the first day of the Gateway public Planning Inquiry will be held at Leamington Town Hall, beginning at 10am on Tuesday 8th April 2014.

We still need as many of you as possible to attend on at least that 1st day please!

If we do not have a good attendance of local people at the Inquiry on that 1St day, then the opening statements of the QC for the developer, and the Barrister for WDC and CCC, will doubtless make much of that fact by claiming that the Gateway is obviously supported by the vast majority of local villagers and businesses, and that it is only a handful of NIMBYs who are standing in its way, to the detriment of the community at large!

We hope that you managed to attend the evening meeting in Bubbenhall village hall on $21^{S\dagger}$ March to see for yourselves the enormous efforts that your team are putting in on behalf of all the local villages and villagers – and the many devious machinations that we are all up against in this Gateway Planning Application.

Finally, you will doubtless have noticed the large "Against the Gateway" banners and posters on local roads and in the three main villages. These have been put up because at any time from now, the Inquiry Inspector, Mr. Terry Phillimore, will be doing a personal, and probably private, tour around the local area and villages to see things for himself first hand. Be assured that as soon as this is over, we will take them all down again.

Your tongue is the strongest muscle in your body.


The collective noun for a group of vultures is a committee.
