TREES AND FLOWERS FOR STONELEIGH

If you have walked along the riverside in Stoneleigh Village Meadows recently you will have noticed some newly planted trees. These trees - along with all the equipment like protective guards, stakes and ties - were purchased with the generous help of the Environment Agency. On 1st April three volunteers from the Village Orchard Group and two stalwarts from the Environment Agency spent a long day digging holes, planting and supporting the trees. Especial thanks are due to the people in the Biodiversity Office of the EA who initiated and drove this project to enhance our already lovely riverside.

Apart from the amenity value of the trees, the additional aims of the planting are to increase habitats for wildlife, to help stabilise the riverbank in places and to build on the great work that the Stoneleigh Meadows Society has done in previous years. It is good to see the trees they have previously planted doing well.

The newly planted trees are all British natives and include oaks, limes and hazels. Near the village orchard we have planted wild fruit trees - cherries, pears and apples - that will provide blossom for bees. On the Motslow Hill side of the river there are some new wild fruit trees and two young silver birches.

We hope all the trees will provide pleasure for walkers in the meadow for many years to come.

You will also notice that there has been activity in the vicinity of the 'Victory Oak' within the Orchard at the end of Church Lane. This is the Orchard Committee's response to an idea first proposed by Sheila Woolf of the History Society that we should commemorate the centenary of the start of World War One. Members of our group, led by Nora Blagburn, have planted an area of wildflowers here. We even managed to recruit a passer-by who brought his own rake; that's the kind of passer-by we like! We are grateful to local businesses TCL tool hire and Smiths Nurseries for their assistance in preparing the area. The emphasis has of course been on poppies which have become an emblem of the fallen in the Great War. Many other native flowers have also been sown here. Let us hope that nature rewards us with a fitting floral tribute during the summer months.

STONELEIGH HISTORY SOCIETY

A great deal of coverage is being given in the media to the World War One Centenary Commemorations, which will continue through to 2018. In Stoneleigh, too, a great deal is happening! To begin our commemorative events, on Tuesday April 29th our meeting will be a talk on "When Stoneleigh Went to War", examining the life of the village when war broke out in 1914. This will anticipate both the May 9th Commemorative Evening held at the church and the Society's display. Everyone is welcome to come along to the village hall at 7.30pm and discover more about Stoneleigh, the way its people lived 100 years ago, and how they responded to the outbreak of war.

HS2 LATEST

We now face the final stretch before the parliamentary go-ahead is given for the building of HS2. The second reading of the 'Hybrid Bill' is scheduled for Monday 28 April. When (and if) that Bill eventually becomes law, building can begin. However, after the second reading any individual or organisation who wishes to object to any proposal embodied in that Bill can petition a specially-appointed committee whose role it is to hear evidence and make recommendations to Parliament before the final reading of the Bill can take place. There will be a very brief period after 28 April when petitions can be submitted so the advice is to get in early; the deadline is 28 May. The Secretary of State has already stated publicly that he expects the petitioning process to be so lengthy that the final reading of the Bill in the House of Commons (and thence to the House of Lords) cannot take place before the next general election. So, the suspense will continue for a while yet.

The Parish Council placed a notice in the April edition of the News announcing that a Village Meeting would be held in Stoneleigh on 24 April; a motion against HS2 will be moved at that meeting which will have been held by the time this News is distributed. Readers might therefore like to know that at the Parish Council meeting on 8 May the Parish Council will formally announce its intention to petition. The Stoneleigh Action Group (against HS2) also intends to petition on your behalf BUT that does not stop other organisations, individuals or families from submitting their own petition. 'All' that is needed is a cover sheet, £20 and a willingness to deliver four copies of the petition personally and perhaps eventually to appear before the committee to state one's case in person. N.B. Simple statements such as "I am totally against HS2" are unacceptable. A specific issue (or series of issues) has to be listed with a possible solution or mediation e.g. "I am concerned about the impact of any temporary closure of the A46 in this area; surely it would be cheaper in the long term to take the railway under the A46?" Or "Traffic congestion around this village will be intolerable during construction and will severely hinder normal life and may be a threat to life if emergency vehicles are unable to get through; the implications of the siting of proposed construction sites should be much more sensitively considered." Lengthy submissions are not necessary. A succinctly argued page of A4 on any particular issue is more than adequate.

Other developments in the past month include the announcement of the compensation scheme (see above sites for details) which is considered to be totally inadequate. The summary results of the Environmental Consultation have been announced but full results will not be available until *after* the decision in the House of Commons on 28 April. The House of Commons Environmental Audit Committee has recently exposed numerous flaws in the consultation and these received widespread publicity in the media. Simultaneously, efforts continue to lift the Government's embargo on the publication of the very critical report on the HS2 project by the Major Projects Authority; the only precedent for such an embargo is the decision to withhold the report on the Iraq War!

From the above it is obvious that many aspects of challenging the HS2 proposals are complex and time-consuming but we hope readers will be prepared to take the trouble to make their own submissions. At the very least, it is not too late to let your views be known to our M.P. Jeremy Wright who has agreed to assist with the petitioning process.

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LOCAL RURAL OIL SYNDICATE GOES FROM STRENGTH TO STRENGTH

We've had a very exciting start to the year and have three lots of news to share.

Firstly, we decided that 'Warwickshire Community Oil & LPG Syndicate' had become rather a mouthful so have changed this to Energy Warwickshire with a dedicated website at www.energywarwickshire.org.uk. Anyone who is interested in cheaper oil can now both sign up and place an order at their own convenience. Look out for new posters too.

Secondly, thanks to the syndicate we have been able to reduce the price of bulk LPG from an already low 43pence per litre to just 41pence per litre with a £100 fuel discount for new domestic members. People power works!

And lastly, when did you last pay less for your oil in the Winter than in the Summer? Well, that's what our members have achieved over the last couple of months, paying just 51.95ppl in March and less than 50ppl in April. We don't think we shall ever get to grips with how the pricing works but so long as it works in favour of our members we'll not be too worried. Over the last 12 months our members have saved an average of over £52 per 1000 litres against the average market price and a whopping £142 against the market high. How does your oil supplier measure up?

SIGNPOSTS OR WEATHERVANES...

The late Tony Benn described his fellow politicians as falling into two basic groups: the weather vanes, whose focus and direction fluctuated with the wind of change; and the signposts, who were steadfast in their focus and unswerving on their course. I don't know the context in which he was speaking, but to my mind, the best way forward is probably to have an element of both. We need the flexibility of a weathervane, able to adapt to the current climate and not drive through unfavourable or even dangerous conditions; but without the correctly placed signposts, we would be liable to wander aimlessly and fruitlessly, never reaching any destination.



Early in May I am going on a guided retreat in Exmoor and will be very much relying on the signposts to help me find my way! The last time I went walking in Exmoor was in extreme conditions on my hike for the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme, spending an unforgettable night which was the closest I intend to get to knowing what it's like to try sleeping in a river!

Whilst on retreat, I will be reflecting and praying and planning what directions we might head in together as churches and communities in Stoneleigh and Ashow. In the context of a retreat I hope to be open to the wind of change prompted by God's Holy Spirit and also strengthen my resolve of faithful discipleship in Jesus Christ through whom I come to know the God who loves me.

Already in Stoneleigh and Ashow churches we have planned some opportunities to consider significant points in our lives where, like signposts or weathervanes, they have, do, and will mark out for us the direction our lives could be taking. On 11th May at 11a.m. in Stoneleigh church, we will be celebrating baptism; on 17th May the six couples getting married in our churches in the coming year will be gathering for a day set aside for marriage preparation; on Sunday 25th May, (weather permitting!) the church services will take a walk outside of our buildings and into our communities and beautiful surroundings, please see our website and notice boards for details.

In a recent conversation, a retired person was describing to me how at this point in their lives they were attending a course exploring Christianity in their local church because they wanted to awaken the reasons they got confirmed in their teens. When asked in the first session why they were attending the course, they answered: "I am here to try to find out why I am here".

Perhaps there is a wind of change blowing in something new into your life, as the moving story of P L Travers told in the film 'Saving Mr. Banks' might put it. Perhaps looking back at past markers, the signposts that influenced the course of your life will help you on your journey of exploration.
