Stoneleigh Community Orchard

he Orchard Group would like to thank all those who attended Stoneleigh Village Club back in October for our quiz night as well as those who helped make it yet another successful and entertaining event! We also hope that those of you who tried our prototype Stoneleigh cider found it a pleasant experience.

It is a tradition at this time of year to reflect on the past as well as consider possibilities for the future, which are best described in an article that has recently been written for the December edition of the Warwick Natural History Newsletter.

Stoneleigh Community Orchard started as a project in 2011 and offered a means of achieving several objectives. The principal objective was to act as a community resource and focus. Stoneleigh, in common with many other villages throughout the country, has seen a gradual erosion of resources such as village shops, garages, pubs etc. and so it was the intention of this project to, in a small way, reverse that trend and offer the local community a stake in a natural resource that should ultimately be self-sustaining as well as produce an area of beauty and recreation. It has also been a lot of fun to work upon. The underlying theme of the orchard is based upon the production of cider and perry, with trees chosen to reflect this bias and varieties such as Dabinett, Tom Putt and Yarlington Mill originating from the West Country, mixed in with more local varieties such as Wyken Pippin named after an area in nearby Coventry. Warwickshire doesn't have a tradition of cider apple orchards but, to our astonishment, the trees have thrived along the river valley that runs through the village and are already producing a bountiful harvest. We are now in the process of creating a small cottage industry based on cider production, with the intention of the orchard paying its way in the world as well as helping to meet another objective of creating a wild flower area to complement the trees. Each year, the Orchard Group who manage the orchard seem to be on the threshold of achieving something new. This year, we intend to broaden the orchard to encompass the entire field, which will involve the planting of further cider apple trees in December. A Stoneleigh cider is also close to completion!

Given the above, we hope that those of you who have the time and the interest in this project come down to the meadow on the morning of Saturday 5th December for a tree planting event aimed at incrementing the orchard and helping to create an area that we, as a community, can be proud of.

The orchard friends' subscriptions comes up for renewal at the start of the new year. Renewals of £10 can be made to Pete Freeman as Chairman or to Richard Hancox as Treasurer. Cheques should be made payable to Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard. However, why not become a long-term friend and set up a direct debit?

Finally, the group would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

POSADA - Making Room for Jesus

s the Christmas season is upon us, many of us are making our homes festive with decorations as well as preparing and opening our homes to receive visitors as families, friends and neighbours get together. I'd like to invite you to share your hospitality a little differently in a Posada project, which I hope will enhance this often busy season for you and our communities, and will give a focus to remembering the Christmas story of Jesus.

Posada is a Spanish word meaning 'inn'. Posada celebrations originated in Mexico where young people, dressed as Mary and Joseph, travelled from house to house, telling people about the imminent arrival of Jesus and asking for a room for the night. At each home, they shared the Christmas story and joined in worship with their host family. On Christmas Eve, they would visit the local church to re-enact the nativity and place figures of Mary and Joseph in a crib.



The modern day Posada is based on this concept and encourages us to give a home to the nativity figures of Mary and Joseph for a night. This symbolises making room for Jesus in our hearts, homes and communities. Each night during Advent, it is hoped that the figures will visit a different house in our communities. Each host chooses who to contact and pass the nativity set on to for the next night.

On Advent Sunday, 29th November, the Stoneleigh crib set will begin its journey at the 11.00am all-age service, and the Ashow crib set will begin its journey at the 4.00pm Advent carol service.

Each nativity set will go home with someone from church who will then decide who to contact and take the figures to on the next day. The figures will arrive with:

- An Advent candle to light long enough to burn down to the next number;
- A notebook in which to log where the crib set has been. This could be simply your name and address, but may include who was involved, a photograph, your own thoughts, conversation about the meaning of Christmas, and prayers. If you use email, please send one to me at sharon.goble@btinternet.com and I will remember you in my prayers that night too.
- A prayer card. If you have time, visitors and receivers of the set could share a drink together (anything from a cup of tea to mulled wine!) before sharing the prayer card.
- A bag of glow-in-the-dark stars. Please keep one star of wonder and use it to help you continue thinking and praying about the story of Jesus and the meaning of Christmas. If you are able to join us at the **crib service at 5.00pm on Christmas Eve in Stoneleigh Church**, bring it with you. It should look great to see them all glowing in church! You are welcome to keep your star as a reminder that Jesus' birth in Bethlehem has lasting meaning for the whole of our lives and there is always more for us to wonder at when we think about God coming to us and how we receive and welcome him.

There was a strong feeling that it was not a sensible proposition, given the traffic problems in and around Stoneleigh.
- A traffic survey has begun, instigated by the PC and carried out by WCC. Once this has been completed, we can progress on ways to manage traffic better.
- A petition has been submitted by the PC on the latest HS2 proposals.
- A Housing Needs Survey is being delivered to all properties in the Parish of Stoneleigh this weekend. Please complete, as the information you provide will help us to plan for the future.

HS2 Update

hanks to Martin Smith and Anthony Bianco, StAG has submitted evidence on AP4. We continue to campaign for the preservation of Stoneleigh as a medieval village, especially Stare Bridge which will be badly affected by HS2. Stare Bridge was featured in a recent BBC News England Online article which highlighted the damage that HS2 will do to many ancient monuments and woodlands along the route.

StAG and the Parish Council have strongly opposed the proposed use of the B4115 as a 'trucking route' and the use of Stoneleigh Bridge for any traffic associated with the building of HS2.



Of great significance is the recent belated recognition by HS2 Ltd that an 'enhanced junction' (road widening or a roundabout) is needed at the junction of the A46 and Stoneleigh Road and that this should be part of the overall plan in this area. However, as yet such a junction is unfunded by HS2 Ltd, but it has the support of Coventry City Council, Warwickshire County Council, Highways England, Jeremy Wright MP and, of course, the Parish Council and StAG. Negotiations about this and other necessary works along the route are ongoing.

Thanks are due to all those who have worked so hard through numerous meetings and negotiations to get to this point.

It is expected that HS2 will feature in the Chancellor of the Exchequer's forthcoming Autumn Statement. The Cubbington Pear Tree, threatened by HS2, has won the Woodland Trust's public vote for England's Tree of the Year.



"The Heart of Stoneleigh" Defibrillator

ince last month's issue, we have been helped almost over the line by further contributions from the Parish Council and offers from other bodies, and I have been touched by individual donations from residents. Thank you all very much indeed. The money will be administered and overseen by the Parish Council, but will be ring-fenced so that it can only be used for the defibrillator.

To give familiarity with the device and with CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation), West Midlands Ambulance Service will train up to 12 of us free of charge. Ideally, those will be spread through the village and the surrounding areas: Stareton, Stoneleigh Park, the Abbey and generally.

In addition, Bubbenhall have four Community First Responders: volunteers who have more than just the basic training and can give much broader-based emergency assistance. To save vital minutes and seconds in an emergency, each is equipped with a defibrillator.
