#### **Ashow Church News**

Stephen and Kate and all the PCC would like to thank everyone who helped to make the Advent and Christmas Carol Services such a success again this year. We are very pleased to say the church was packed for these popular services. The music was organised by Susan Spencer and the Ashow Parish Singers were excellent on both occasions. The handbell ringers from Leek Wootton added to the musical accompaniment. Barbara Lewis provided lovely home-made mince pies at Advent and Peter Shrimpton prepared and heated the mulled wine after the service.

We had a presentation after the Advent service for the charity "Zoe's Place", who locally offer respite and palliative terminal care to babies and children from birth to 5 years and support their families. We are pleased to report that from the collections at the Advent and Christmas Carol Services, a donation of £341.75 plus Gift Aided envelopes has been sent to this charity.

This is a reminder that any donations to the church, which is a registered charity, can be gift aided by putting the money or cheque into one of the envelopes in the pews or by the door, and ensure that you fill in your address and sign it. We can claim an extra 25% back from the Inland Revenue. Last year this amounted to almost £2000.

As you will have noticed, we have recently bought some new Hymn Books- "Mission Praise". These have cost us £5 each or £20 for the full music editions. Again we invite people to buy one perhaps in memory of a loved one, or for their own use, and if you decide to gift aid these please mark the envelope "Hymn Books" if the donation is for this purpose.

The church looked wonderful over Christmas with flower arrangements by Diana Holt and others, and we are grateful to all who helped decorate the candle poles, and Stoneleigh Estate managers who again generously donated the Christmas tree.

We are a small church, but we have a lot of excellent support. Philip Jones organises the Sidespersons' rota and readers, and Bob Burdett the hymns. Thanks also to our organists, Barbara Lewis, Peter Bernasconi, and Susan Spencer. Diana Holt organises the flower and cleaning rotas, and we would like to thank all those people who took part in these activities, and we would welcome any additional volunteers who wish to go on the cleaning, flowers or sidespersons' rotas. Neil Collett continues to wind the clock which has chimed in the village for numerous years. George Horton and Tony Gregory have kept the churchyard in very good trim. We are very grateful to the volunteers who open and close the church every day, and we know from what people have said or written in the visitors book how much the access to the church is appreciated.

Lastly, our vicar Sharon, continues to inspire us and we continue to be pleased to see her so well behaved children often in Ashow Church.

#### **Stoneleigh Community Orchard update**

The 'Country folk' of the Radio 4 serial 'The Archers' went wassailing in the Ambridge orchard recently. This waes hael or good health ceremony is supposed to preserve the trees in the subsequent season. We haven't (yet) revived this tradition in the Stoneleigh community orchard; our first pressings of cider are regarded as too rare and precious to be slopped around on the ground, and the trees are not yet sturdy enough to stand even the tiniest 'Wassail Queen' being hoisted into their branches. But maybe nextyear.....are there any volunteers to wear leaves and carry flaming torches?

Ancient traditions are not absent from Stoneleigh however. As usual on Boxing Day the Coventry mummers wove their motley way round the village with the 'Stoneleigh Christmas play' featuring a good doctor who can cure everyone from a slain knight to a headless magpie. We are most grateful that the mummers chose to give the orchard group a generous £50 from their collection box. This will certainly help preserve the trees!

In our orchard, the winter activities have been more down to earth. In November some yellow rattle was sown. This is a native wildflower which suppresses the vitality of the grass and therefore promotes tree growth and diversity of other wildflowers.

The other main activity of this winter was the planting of 12 new cider apple trees (mostly Dabinett) Pete Freeman reports that the trees were obtained at a good price but had to be collected from Somerset. Rory O'Connor kindly lent his van and Rory and Pete had a long and quite challenging journey. The van is only 8ft long and the trees were 11 ft. This meant that progress up steep hills was particularly ...er...

interesting, and an ancient TomTom sent our doughty pair up a few more hills than was actually necessary.

Once the trees were safely in Stoneleigh several hardy volunteers turned out on 5th December to dig holes, plant, stake and protect the new trees. As it was one of the few really chilly December days, the bacon baps and hot coffee by Amanda Gibbs were much appreciated. We hope the new trees get off to a good start despite this atypical winter weather.

#### **Stoneleigh Church Building Update**

You may well be reading this after attending the information meeting held in church on 31 January. If you weren't able to attend, this is a brief update. We felt it was important that everyone has an opportunity to find out about what is happening in their church and building. Sharon has already explained in her message that as part of the second stage submission to the Heritage Lottery Fund we are required to consult with the community.

This has been a long process which we are hoping is now coming to a conclusion. Back in 2011, when my father was still treasurer, we were turned down for a grant by English Heritage, as it was known at the time, because our repairs were not seen as urgent. Three years later, November 2014, we submitted another application to the renamed Heritage Lottery Fund and were granted permission to carry on to the second stage. Eighteen months later we are now moving into the final stage of the second submission which has to be in by the 18 March.

A team made up from the PCC, villagers and various professionals has been working to fulfil the strict requirements of Heritage Lottery Fund applications. This has not been an easy process as they have so many conditions to fulfil and everything has to be presented in the correct format; this alone was alien to most of us and it has been a steep learning curve! We have been very fortunate to have Niki Molyneux, who lives in the parish, as member of the PCC. This is her area of expertise and she has been invaluable in particular to the community aspect of the application.

If the next stage in the application is successful and we get awarded the full grant we plan to begin repair work on the building at the beginning of August. There is still a shortfall of £80,000 if we are to get all the work done at the same time. Applications and letters are currently being sent to other grant giving organisations.

Whilst the repairs, which will take a number of months, are taking place we have been advised that there will be limited access to the building. We are exploring various options within the village where we can hold our Sunday services.

Thank you to everyone who has helped us so far. There have been so many of you who have contributed in so many ways. We really appreciate everything you do and value all your comments. There are exciting and challenging times ahead for us all!

#### "The Heart of Stoneleigh" Defibrillator



Donations from Stoneleigh United Charities and the Male Voice Choir took us over the line and gave us a buffer for unforeseen expenses. As with all the donations, I am extremely grateful for those. Unfortunately, an unexpected expense has arisen sooner than we would have wished.

The phone box door is badly twisted and is letting in cold and rain. Repair will cost at least £250.00 and a replacement door at least £950.00.

It is hoped that the Parish Council, which owns the phone box, will meet the cost of those repairs, so that the defibrillator can be installed.

On a brighter note, we have a potential Community First Responder (CFR) but we need more volunteers for the basic CPR and defibrillator training. The generosity of donations has been excellent. Can it be matched by more people giving just a little time to do the training?

#### **HS2 UPDATE**

HS2 has remained in the news throughout the holiday period, not least given the comparatively small amounts of money being allocated for flood defences compared with the many £billions for HS2.

StAG (in particular yours truly) has had to spend a good deal of time preparing our challenge to the claims made by HS2 Ltd that we had no particular right to challenge statements made in documentation about the route and its implications for our area. The challenge was heard by the Select Committee in the House of Commons on HS2 on 5 January and I was accompanied by Cllrs Mackenzie and Fryer representing the Joint Parish Council's petition at the same afternoon session. It was an interesting session in that many of the people heard raised the same concerns over congestion on busy road networks during construction, but to no avail.

I am afraid to report that our challenges were also not successful, and we have not been given leave to appear before the Select Committee again to present the community's concerns over this project. Our case has however been presented to the Select Committee by our MP, Jeremy Wright, Warwick County Council and Warwick District Council, but it is always good to have a very specific locality representing their concerns.

Our concerns ranged from the lack of appropriate mitigation against noise, to the disruption to Stoneleigh Park, and to the impact on the A46, B4115, A452 from the construction works. Warwickshire County Council are pursuing their own agenda to construct a roundabout on the A46/C32 Stoneleigh Road junction, but to bring this forward so that it is in place before HS2 construction works start. Whether this is achievable is to be seen, and I have to urge caution here. There is some work to be done on construction traffic routes to and from the proposed compound area.

It may be premature to say too much until further information is available, but if anybody would like to know more in due course, then please contact me and we will see if further updates can be made available. If there is more to say then we will of course use these pages in future editions.

#### Vacancy Parish Councillor - Stoneleigh Ward




