I learnt a new word recently: **NOVENA**. I've discovered that this word is used to describe the nine days between Ascension and Pentecost. This year that period of time falls **between 6th and 15th May.** There are two really exciting ways we can join others in marking this period in 2016.

Nationally, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York have called the country to pray and have written to every serving parish priest in the Church of England expressing their longing "to see a great wave of prayer across our land." This call to prayer is at the

time in the Church's calendar when we remember the first disciples waiting on God, as Jesus had asked them to, to be "clothed with power from on high" before they experienced the outpouring of the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. What a great experience it will be if churches across the country are re-energised to pray for our country and the people we share it with, and to pass on the invitation we have to share in responding to Jesus.

In their letter the Archbishops said: "At the heart of our prayers will be words that Jesus himself taught us — 'Thy kingdom come, thy will be done.' It is impossible to overstate the life-transforming power of the Lord's Prayer. It is a prayer that is reassuring enough to be on the lips of the dying and yet dangerous enough to be banned in cinemas. It is famous enough to be spoken each day by billions in hundreds of languages and yet intimate enough to draw us ever closer into friendship with Jesus Christ. It is simple enough to be memorised by small children and yet profound enough to sustain a whole lifetime of prayer. When we pray it with sincerity and with joy, there is no imagining the new ways in which God can use us to his glory."

In Stoneleigh and Ashow churches you will find **prayer stations** that week for you to use, both churches being open every day. A prayer station is a creative and user-friendly way of praying that suggests words, invites reflection through symbols and pictures and sometimes actions to help you. We will also respond to this call in our regular prayer times in Ashow on Tuesday from $5-5:30\,\mathrm{pm}$ and in

Stoneleigh on Thursday from 9:30 – 10am. On **Ascension Day** itself, **Thursday 5 May**, I invite both parishes to join me in a **day of prayer**, to begin using the prayer stations in both our church buildings, and with times to pray in a more structured way together from 9:30 – 10am in **Stoneleigh**, in **Ashow at midday and for evensong at 6pm in Stoneleigh**.

Coventry Cathedral will be one of the venues for a beacon event to support this nationwide movement of prayer at 5pm on Pentecost Sunday

15th May, at which our oldest son, Ben will be confirmed along with others. In the same week, Coventry Diocese is organising a pilgrimage with prayer and Biblical reflection.

The main focus of the pilgrimage will be a chance to walk all or some of the Coventry Way footpath around the City from Friday 6th May culminating in a Pentecost gathering at the Cathedral on Sunday 15th May and on routes accompanying different Bishops around the Diocese.

On Saturday 7th May, the route comes to Stoneleigh from Burton Green at 2pm via Kenilworth arriving at 5pm for a short act of worship and prayer. It then leaves on Monday 9th May from Stoneleigh at 5pm and goes to Ryton-in-Dunsmore via Bubbenhall.

Some events from history which happened in May:

May Day, 1st of May. Spring celebration which became a National holiday.

May 4th 1929. Birth of Audrey Hepburn.

May 6th 1937. The airship, Hindenberg caught fire as it approached its moorings in New Jersey.

May 7th 1945. Unconditional surrender of German forces.

May 12th 1937. Coronation ceremony of King George VI.

May 27th 1937. Opening of the Golden Gate Bridge, San Francisco.

May 29th 1660. Restoration of the Monarchy with the accession of King Charles II.

HS2 Update.

As expected, the House of Commons passed the third reading of the HS2 Hybrid Bill on 23rd March. It was passed with a very large majority. MPs on the whole would have voted on the principle of the HS2 proposal, and would not have concerned themselves too closely with the details, with which communities on or near the line of route understandably have greater concerns.

The Hybrid Bill now passes to the House of Lords, who will have three readings and who will also convene their own Select Committee to examine details of the proposal. As for the House of Commons, the Select Committee does not have the right to dismiss the proposal, but can concern themselves with the detail and make recommendations.


Anthony Bianco of the Stoneleigh Action Group has prepared and submitted a petition to their Lordships on behalf of Stag. It is to be seen if their Lords and Ladyships are more sympathetic to some of the issues which communities have raised, and which on the whole the Select Committee in the House of Commons rejected. One recommendation which did come out of the first process was that a review of the Compensation process is carried out, and this is being undertaken by HS2.

We will continue to update the Community on developments and progress. The timescale for hearing petitions is to be announced after the composition of the Select Committee is announced. I also understand that the Joint Parish Council has submitted a petition, along with our MP, Jeremy Wright, who has also submitted a petition. Jeremy abstained in the vote at the Third Reading in the Commons.

Finance

Precept levied for the financial year 2015/2016 was £15,999. Other income during the year was Bank interest of £25.03, concurrent expenditure £180, Grant £6,000 for the Joint Neighbourhood Plan with Baginton & Bubbenhall Parish Councils, Donations towards purchasing a Defibrillator £2,038, Federation Colliery Opposition Group £315.76 and Stoneleigh Park £200. Total income for the year being £24,757.79, which when added to the accumulated balance gave a working total of £48,170.75.

During the year total expenditure was £23,607.67 which results in a surplus of £24,563.08. Included within this figure is £12,800.42 of Ringed Fenced Money.
