#### RESIDENTIAL HOUSING VACANCY

The Dame Alice Leigh's Almshouse is a Charity providing housing accommodation in ten sandstone cottages in the centre of Stoneleigh, a quiet rural village in Warwickshire.

A residence in this 16th century Almshouse has become available.

On the ground floor of each home there is a hall, leading to a sitting room with kitchen. A door to the utility room leads through to a cloakroom with washbasin and toilet. A dog-leg staircase from the hall leads to the first floor where there is a bedroom and shower room with washbasin and toilet.

Outside there is a small private patio connected to large communal gardens where there is a useful storage building with dedicated space for each resident.

Cottages are equipped with cooker, fridge & washing machine, phone line, emergency assistance-call unit, carpets, electric storage heaters, smoke & heat detectors, hot water immersion heater, and TV point. A communal digital TV aerial and mast is also provided.

The Dame Alice Leigh Charity repairs and maintains the fabric and services to the building, as well as the outbuildings and communal gardens.

Applicants must be needy, of retirement age, capable of independent living and have a genuine need of Almshouse housing.

Preference is given to residents who live in or have connections with the parish of Stoneleigh. However, Trustees welcome applications from other qualifying persons.

#### **HS2 UPDATE**

The Royal Assent has now been given so Phase One HS2 construction will begin this year. This will not be a straightforward process as planning permission now has to be obtained from each of the relevant local councils! Myriad issues still need to be resolved. For example, our local press has already reported that land in Dalehouse Lane will have to be accessed to undertake 'vegetation and environmental mitigation works', including replacement tree planting and creating new habitats for displaced wildlife.

Media attention has not waned and the numerous shortcomings and lack of 'joined up thinking' of the project continue to be highlighted.

Thanks to intensive lobbying by HS2AA a last minute concession was given regarding compensation/house purchase and 'effect on retirement plans' is an additional circumstance which HS2 Ltd. will now consider.

On 24<sup>th</sup> March, representatives from StAG and other local action groups met Jeremy Wright MP to discuss next steps regarding construction and the building process. He promised to take steps to ensure much more effective contact with HS2 Ltd and the contractors for our area and agreed to meet again on 31<sup>st</sup> March to report back; Anthony Bianco and Martin Smith will attend this meeting.

As reported in the last edition of the News, projects are being considered under the Community Benefit Fund and these will be submitted to HS2 Ltd. in due course. Our local HS2 Local Community Engagement Officer, Susan Bridges, will attend the Parish Council meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> April at 7 pm in Stoneleigh Village Hall to answer residents' questions about the project and its impact on this area. This meeting will provide an invaluable opportunity to voice our concerns and to find out about the proposed timescale for construction work.

#### **ACORN CLOSE, STONELEIGH**

#### Large Steel Containers placed by the garages

A resident of Acorn Close got in touch with the Parish Council on 14<sup>th</sup> March. They were concerned that two large steel containers had been placed alongside the garages in Acorn Close, no one in the close had any idea what they were for, who had placed them or how long they were staying.

As the garages are rented from Warwick District Council and as the land owner we rang them first.

The housing department have let a contract to decorate the outside of council properties around this area (not just Stoneleigh but surrounding villages as well). Unfortunately this was the only land they had to place a store room for materials and a mess room and toilet facilities for the staff carrying out the work, all required by current Health and Safety Regulations.

Ian Williams is the company carrying out the work and they will be using the containers on weekdays until the middle of April.

They have stated they will not block in or cause a nuisance to the garage users, the generator they use will only be on for a short while at the start of the day and then again before they all go home in the evening. If it is causing a problem we suggest a call to the housing department to let them know.

At the time of writing this article the housing department has agreed to write to all residents of Hall Close and Acorn Close explaining what is happening and why, and apologising for not having informed residents sooner.

#### STONELEIGH CHURCH BUILDING NEWS

As I anticipated last month all work on site was completed on 10<sup>th</sup> March on which day our Architects issued their Practical Completion Certificate to the Contractors, Croft Building and Construction Ltd. The original 21 week contract had been extended by 7 weeks to enable further essential masonry work and internal decoration work not covered by our Grant from Heritage Lottery Fund to be carried out. Monies raised through the Appeal were utilised for this purpose.

Under the contract there is a maintenance period of 12 months ending on 10<sup>th</sup> March 2018 when the Architects will inspect the work for any defects which have to be made good at the Contractor's expense before a final balance of 2.5% of the Contract fee is released.

As a result of an inspection of the roof, rainwater goods, stonework and other key elements of construction made by Architects for Historic England in August 2015, the Church was placed on its Historic at Risk Register since it was felt that at least part of the historic fabric of the building was at risk of failure or loss. The building work which commenced 7 months ago has now concluded. Since HLF would only offer a grant for "structural repairs urgently required within a two year period" I believe we have complied because the works comprised in the Contract were briefly:- "To provide a new copper roof to the nave and associated new ceiling below, replacement of parapet copings and urgent stone repair/ conservation/ replacement to all elevations and the Tower, Nave, South Aisle, Vestry and Leigh Chapel whilst generally putting the building into a watertight and structurally sound condition to retain the character, ambience and historic integrity of the building".

Throughout the contract I have kept daily contact with the workforce and our Architects. This, coupled with the close inspection I have been afforded at all levels, makes me realise that, somewhat like the Forth Bridge, there is always work to be done.

I highlighted the problems with the South Aisle ceiling last month but the Contractor's main concern has been the stonework of the Leigh Chapel which is deteriorating more quickly than the main building.

However, for the moment, the work of the PCC's Maintenance Committee can return to more mundane matters.

#### STONELEIGH COMMUNITY ORCHARD UPDATE

The early spring months can be considered a time in which the structure of the orchard and trees comes into focus. Decisions can be made based on the experiences of the previous year as to whether to aim for growth or maximizing a crop in the coming seasons. If one aims for a large crop on young trees then, without a lot of crop thinning, there is the potential for damage to occur as the branches strain under the weight of fruit, which from experience is particularly acute during late season storms. Indeed last summer the group witnessed several trees lying horizontal, which required some ingenuity to recover them back to the vertical. Needless to say this year will be deliberately aimed at pruning for structure at the expense of crop.

The structure of the Orchard group is also coming under focus with its transition from an informal group of volunteers to a Community Interest Company, presenting many challenges to overcome. This is a piece of work that can presently be considered as on going.

The focus of the project has also shifted from tree planting to the processing of apples into cider, which requires a different set of skills and disciplines and needs to be approached in a considered way. Shortly the cider of 2016, presently residing in fermentation tanks, will be racked off into bags then pasteurized, processed, and packaged for consumption. This year we may also consider the use of barrels owing to the volumes involved. We hope to have some available for the Orchard Quiz occurring on Saturday 22nd April at 7:30pm at Stoneleigh Village Club.

Finally, there will be a return to observe if a small area of the orchard cultivated with a wild flower called yellow rattle has been successful in making a return from the previous years planting. This, as ever, is one of the most unpredictable aspects of the project!

The Orchard friends subscriptions have now come up for renewal since the start of the year and renewals of £10 can be made to Pete Freeman as Chairman or to Richard Hancox as Treasurer. Cheques should be made payable to Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard; however, why not become a long term friend and set up a direct debit.
