Stoneleigh Community Orchard Update Pete Freeman

Before outlining the activities of the Orchard Group during April I would like to describe a sunny, crisp morning back in late March 2012 when I managed to recruit the services of Fred Oatley and his good friend Barry Jones to the task of scuffling the meadow in the vicinity of the Orchard with the intention of turning it into a haven for wild flowers.

On this morning Fred's talent as a skilled operator of tractor and other agricultural machinery were clear to be seen and all who observed this couldn't fail to be impressed by his and indeed Barry's expertise. Fred showed an interest in the Orchard and could frequently be observed wondering alone but more often with his wife Anne inspecting the trees and offering advice. Needless to say Fred also keenly anticipated the resultant cider ! The orchard group will miss Fred and wish Anne all strength for the future.

The later days of March and start of April have largely been employed in processing cider. This involved racking off the cider from the sediment also known as the lees into a separate containment. From then on the cider is bagged, pasteurised, treated and measured for alcohol content. The process at this point starts to become what can be described as a small scientific experiment combining equipment such as a hydrometer to measure specific gravity as well as a device called a refractometer which measures the way the passage of light through liquid is distorted according to its content. There then follows some mathematics and at the end of the process a figure describing the percentage alcohol content is arrived at !

This year has seen the development of a single apple cider based on the Dabinett apple which number some 21 trees and makes it our main stay variety in the Orchard.

Dabinett apples contain a lot of the tannins that give a cider its bitter taste and will supplement our multi apple cider in the future.

The Orchard friends subscriptions have come up for renewal since the start of the year and renewals of £10 can be made to Pete Freeman as Chairman or to Richard Hancox as Treasurer. 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HS2 UPDATE

HS2 continues to generate much news in the media. Most dramatic this month has been a debacle over the awarding of a contract for the construction of Phase 1. Mace, a company that failed to get this contract, accused the successful bidder, the American CH2M Hill, of a conflict of interest as many of its staff had been seconded to HS2 Ltd and the new chief executive was a former employee. Following the threat of legal action, HS2 Ltd and the Department for Transport said that the bidding process must be repeated although they did not admit any wrongdoing. This means that the timetable for construction will be delayed, possibly by as much as up to two years. Local representatives of HS2 Ltd met Jeremy Wright and action group members from the Kenilworth and Southam constituency on 31 March and this delay was confirmed. There may be 'enabling works' during late 2017 and 2018.

Two representatives from HS2 attended the Parish Council meeting on 13th April, by invitation. One was the Community Engagement Officer and the other the Project Manager for our section of the route.

They made a brief presentation of how the route is divided, a reference to the Community Fund and how the Contractor when appointed is mandated to help the Community. However, upon closer examination of questions from the floor and the Parish Councillors on matters such as traffic routes for construction, they appeared less than accommodating and unsympathetic. As it was announced at the meeting, it can be made recorded here that a contractor for the route will be announced this summer. That contractor will then spend 12 - 18 months working on construction planning, based on the information they will be presented with from HS2 and also on the ongoing site investigations. That also may determine when construction works would actually start, but that is subject to review from the contractor.

At the moment a company formed from an amalgamation of Laing and Murphy is undertaking enabling works, ground investigations, establishing wildlife habitats and so on. We were told they will not be undertaking construction works associated with the main project.

Warwick District Council expects to receive planning applications relating to individual aspects of the project, e.g. ancillary buildings. The Hybrid Bill which was approved by Parliament earlier this year acts as a de-facto "outline" planning approval, and as in the case of the latter, reserved matters need to be approved by application. Warwick DC has agreed to be an Approving Authority for this, whereas other local authorities have not. The hope is that there can be some form of local input, but time-scales will be very restricted. The authority must issue a decision within a defined time-cale: failure to do so means that consent is deemed to be granted, so in that respect it differs from approval of reserved matters. Thus dialogue over revisions of applications may also be difficult to achieve. There is no requirement for Warwick DC to engage in pubic consultation, but they will endeavour to consult with the Parish Council. The Action Group will not be a direct consultee.

From 9:30- 10am join the Thursday prayers in Stoneleigh church.


At 12noon – 12:30 join in Midday Prayers in Ashow church.

At 5pm there will be Evensong in Stoneleigh church.

In both buildings you will also find prayer stations for you to use in your own time. Prayer stations are resources gathered to help prompt or focus your prayers and located in small spaces around the church. You simply read what it says at the "station" – a table or similar – and choose whether to use the words or activity to help you to pray. These prayers stations will be in place and available daily from 24th May to 4th June. For example, this year you will find a family tree on which to hang your prayers about the people you live with and care for; a sorry bin where you can write down your regrets, rip them up and throw them away and receive forgiveness; a prayer globe focussing our prayers for the world; a "disagreeing well" in which to pray about conflicts in your life, in our lives together and in the wider world… and more!

There is also a Prayer walk leaflet available in Stoneleigh which takes you around the building itself, where the flowers will still be looking lovely from our homecoming celebrations on the Sunday before.

And... for those of you who like to make and do and be outside in the fresh air there will be the resources to make a kite and fly it in the meadows. I will have these available at our Homecoming celebrations on Sunday 21st May alongside the food, fellowship and fun (see details elsewhere!) - a great way to remind us to look up and think about God as well as enjoy being together.

- At the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council held on the 12th May 2016 Councillor R. Hancox was appointed Chairman and Councillor Mrs H Fryer was appointed Deputy-Chairman.
- Councillor Mrs E Cole tended her resignation from the Parish Council in October which was accepted.
- Councillor Mrs S Malone tended her resignation from the Parish Council in November which was accepted
- At the February 2017 meeting Mrs Diana Jack was co-opted onto the Parish Council as a Stoneleigh Councillor.

Meetings

During the period 1st April 2016 to 31st March 2017 the following meetings were held: Annual Council Meeting and 11 Ordinary Meetings

Finance

Precept levied for the financial year 2016/2017 was £16,263.

Other income during the year was Bank interest of £11.89, concurrent expenditure £170, a Council Tax Grant of £466, plus £1382 from the Transparency Fund. A grant of £875 was received from Warwick District Council for the Ashow noticeboards.

The total income for the year was £19,167.83, which when added to the accumulated balance gave a working total of £43,730.91.

During the year total expenditure was £16,157.80 which results in a surplus of £27,573.11. Included in this is \pm 10,562.53 of ring fenced money.

Please note: these accounts have not been verified by the Council or audited and may be subject to change at the May 2017 meeting.
