Announcement made by Reverend Sharon Goble on Sunday 14th May in Stoneleigh and Ashow churches:

For some time I have known of changes for us all, but until now, for various reasons, have only been able to tell you about those changes today.

I have a new appointment to become Rector of the Stourdene Benefice. It is a multi-parish benefice of six communities: Halford, Newbold-on-Stour, Alderminster, Ettington, The Pillertons and Butlers Marston.

If you know South Warwickshire you might realise that the end of the Stourdene benefice is about a mile and a half from where I live in Ilmington. I travel through half this benefice and then on for a further half an hour to get here to Stoneleigh and Ashow, so I hope you understand why I had to explore the vacancy when it came up.

My last Sunday in Stoneleigh and Ashow parishes will be 6 August when we celebrate the Holiday Club. I have been praying for you all throughout this discernment and continue to do so. I would also appreciate your prayers for myself, the family and the Stourdene Benefice.

Prayer of Blessing: God, go with us on our journey of faith - revive us when we grow weary, direct us when we go astray, inspire us when we lose heart, reprove us when we turn back. Keep us travelling ever onwards, a pilgrim people, looking to Jesus Christ who has run the race before us and who waits to welcome us home, Amen.



I am so glad that running the Holiday Club has helped us connect with more families locally as well as being a really great collaboration of skills and experience from across both our congregations and community.

Details below of my last hurrah as part of the Holiday Club but as part of what I hope will be a continuation of years of offering fun, friendship and faith in such a relaxed and accessible way.

Another film that has resonated with me recently is also a recent choice of the film nights run by the church. The film *Florence Foster Jenkins* is based on the true story of an aspirational soloist whose musical ability and prowess would not be agreeable to everyone, shall we say?! In the film about her singing career, this quote that she says about herself chimes with my own experiences and feelings in ministry: *some may say I can't sing, but no one can say I didn't sing.*

I hope that both the villages feel that they have been loved and that ministering in the size and shape of these communities and congregations is worth every effort. In spite of the different shape of commuting such a distance, I have tried to bring energy and commitment – to sing a new song in a strange land, recognising that we don't all like the same music.

HS2 UPDATE

The fact that a General Election has been called means that there is a moratorium on comments from public bodies, including HS2 Ltd. and the Department of Transport. This did not stop comments in the national and local press and indeed there was a concerted campaign to influence the party manifestos in the hope that the unpopularity of the project, and its low priority as far as public expenditure is concerned, might have some impact. It seems these efforts were in vain as the building of HS2 is included in all the main party manifestos.

As reported in the last News, the attendance of the HS2 Ltd's local 'engagement officer' at the Parish Council meeting on 13 April did little to allay concerns and those who attended were frustrated at the somewhat dismissive attitude taken. As reported in the News some months ago, HS2 has established a Community and Environment Fund to which local community groups (parish councils, village halls and suchlike) may apply for modest funds. An information event hosted by Warwickshire County Council had been arranged for 18 May but due to the General Election this was postponed to 6 July at 2 pm in the Council Chamber, Shire Hall, Warwick. There will be speakers from HS2 Ltd and Groundwork UK (the organisation who are administering the Fund). Attendance is limited to likely bidders.
