Changes to Stoneleigh Bus Services

he Parish Council have received the following correspondence from Warwickshire County Council regarding changes to bus services which will take effect from Monday 5th September 2017:

As you will be aware, the budget for financially supported bus services has been reduced by £500,000 from April 2017, thereby requiring us to find savings across the county. Naturally, we are focusing on achieving this with as little impact on customers as possible.

The Warwickshire County Council contracts for services 539 (Coventry, Bubbenhall, Stoneleigh, Kenilworth) and 580 (Coventry, Ryton, Bubbenhall, Princethorpe, Marton Dunchurch, Rugby etc.), currently operated by Johnson's Coaches, are due to expire on Saturday 3rd September 2017. As such, we have carried out a major and thorough review of these routes that has included assessing loading analysis on all journeys. It has transpired that a number of said journeys conveyed extremely low numbers of passengers. Therefore, the new timetables have been prepared to reflect this.

Service 11 (Rugby Town Flexibus, operated by A & M Flexibus) will take over serving Lime Tree Village. Service 579 is a new Monday and Friday market day service that will serve Lawford Heath and Croop Hill, along with Cawston Grange Drive, an area of Rugby that is quite a distance from the main bus route and from which we have received a number of requests from residents for a service.

Should you wish to comment on the proposed timetables, then please contact Richard Hancox (richard.hancox@kier.co.uk), who will in turn pass your comments on to the County Council. It may be possible to make minor adjustments, but the overall reduction in service levels will need to be maintained.

HS2 Update

midst all the current political upheavals, HS2 is still receiving considerable media coverage. The end of the purdah required by the General Election has meant that HS2 Ltd has released a raft of documents relating to its plans. For a briefing paper outlining the story so far, see:

As the main political parties showed no sign of removing their support from HS2, there is no sign that this situation will change – but who knows?!

Warwick District Council has received the first of what will be many planning permission requests over the coming years. This one refers to mitigation pools in the flood plain adjacent to Dalehouse Lane — three pools are to accommodate wildlife (notably newts!) which would be displaced by eventual construction works. If approved, this work will begin during the summer and there will be some associated local construction traffic.

Warwick County Council is hosting invitation-only (to parish councils) meetings on 28th June (to meet the HS2 Construction Commissioner) and on 6th July (to hear more details about the HS2 Community and Environment Fund).

The Stoneleigh Action Group (against HS2) will continue to co-operate with Stoneleigh & Ashow Parish Council as the project proceeds, the Parish Council being the body through which Warwick County and District Councils and HS2 Ltd will communicate details of future action.



Stoneleigh History Society

ast month's magazine gave details of the church's "homecoming" event on 21st May, in which the History Society was delighted to take part. Since then, our display in the Leigh Chapel has been viewed by a great many people – from all over the world! – and their enthusiasm for our researches makes all our work worthwhile.

On 30th May, we formally launched the exhibition, and several of those who had contributed to the research spoke about aspects which had particularly interested them. We hope that many more people, visitors and residents alike will take the opportunity to see the exhibition over the summer. We are very grateful to the church for providing us with new boards and lighting as well as an extended display space for our ever-growing resources and publications.

In June, we visited the works of Toye, Kenning and Spencer in Bedworth, which was once the home of the UK weaving industry. They have been in business since the seventeenth century making woven insignia, and hold a Royal Warrant from Her Majesty the Queen as "Supplier of Gold and Silver Laces, Insignia and Embroidery". They now make everything from uniforms to ceremonial wear, and manufacture honours, decorations and medals presented



at investitures. A family company, they employ highly skilled craftspeople whose talents have been passed down from generation to generation. It was a most interesting visit.

Our next formal meeting will be at 7.30pm on 26th September in the Village Hall, when Shirley Ball will speak about the village school. All are welcome.



Stoneleigh Community Orchard

t the combined Orchard Group AGM and EGM on Monday 22nd May, the group re-elected Pete Freeman as Chairman, Richard Hancox as Treasurer, and elected Richard Gledhill as Secretary. These are potentially interim positions as central to discussions on the evening were the processes surrounding the group's intention to transform to the more formal structure of a Community Interest Company. During the meeting, a number of decisions were taken in preparation for that transition, the first being the agreement to form a company "Limited by Guarantee", which is a non-profit-making company centred on serving the community. Five directors were selected: the three post-holders listed above as well as John Churchley and Quentin Compton-Bishop. A decision was also made to field out the work involved in setting up the company to an external accountant. We hope to give an update on our progress with this later in the year.

On less formal matters, the cider from the harvest of 2016 has been received very favourably, with feedback overwhelmingly positive. The group are always keen to hear your views of the product as well as the project in general. The harvest of 2017 will most probably be less bountiful than that of last year as a result of our pruning undertaken



earlier in the year to encourage the trees to develop structure. It should also be recognised that some of our varieties, particularly Yarlington Mill and Stoke Red, fruit "biennially", which means that they fruit for one year then take a year off, thereby giving a crop on alternate years. There should, however, be a reasonable harvest, and we are already discussing plans to make the harvest a little more of an event this year, so do follow those plans in the September edition of this magazine.

Orchard friends' subscriptions and yearly renewals cost £10 and can be made to Pete Freeman as Chairman or to Richard Hancox as Treasurer. Cheques should be made payable to Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard. Alternatively, why not become a long-term friend and set up a direct debit?



Damson Gin

f you're wondering what to do with a glut of damsons come the middle of September, look no further than this recipe for damson gin. With thanks to Nigel Slater for recipe inspiration.

900g damsons, washed and picked over **700g sugar Approx 1.5l gin**

Wipe the damsons, discarding any that are squashed or bruised. Prick the fruit all over with a needle and put them into glass preserving jars, layering them with the sugar. Alternatively, freeze the fruit in a sealable plastic bag, then bash them with a heavy object until they are cracked.

Half fill each of the jars with fruit. Pour gin over the fruit to fill the jars, keeping the gin bottles for later. Seal and leave in a cool place for at least three months (which means this can be bottled just in time for Christmas!). Turn the jars over from time to time — I do it every few days - or give them a shake. Filter the gin through a muslin-lined funnel into the reserved gin bottles. Store in the cool, where it will keep for several months. Serve neat or with tonic. The gin-soaked damsons are particularly lovely with ice-cream, whilst packing a definite alcoholic punch!
