Cessation of Ecclesiastical Patronage David Clark - Ashow

The Lord Leigh has formally surrendered his patronage, or advowson, of Ashow and Stoneleigh thus ending a long association between the family and the two parishes.

The advowson is the right in English law of a patron, or advowee, to present to the diocesan bishop, a nominee for appointment to a vacant ecclesiastical benefice or church living. Historically, advowsons were valuable assets which could be bought and sold. They were commonly acquired by the lord of the manor as a means of exercising influence and control over a parish. A benefice normally included the use of a vicarage and the proceeds from glebe and tithes. The advowson was often used by the lord to provide a career and income for a younger son who, due to the custom of primogeniture, was unable to inherit paternal lands.

The advowson of Ashow has been with the Leighs since 1562 following the dissolution of the monasteries, and of Stoneleigh since 1840 when it was acquired from the Crown. Appointments to ecclesiastical vacancies will now be the sole responsibility of the Bishop of Coventry.

HS2 Update

Whilst a main contractor for the route has been appointed, there is expected to be no sign of "boots on the ground" for a while as the contractors develop their scheme design.

We were advised that further investigative works are to be carried out in Stoneleigh Park, and at the time of writing ground investigative works should have started mid-September.

Concern over the cost of HS2 does not abate. Freedom of Information Request (FOIR) are taking some 2 / 3 years to be released, and not always released, and the information from previous reports has in some cases been redacted, or in plain speak, struck out in sections. The official cost stands at £56 billion but it does not bode well that the Government considers some information too sensitive to be released to the public.

When I was on holiday in France, I read newspaper reports on the Paris to Bordeaux LGV (ligne a grand vitesse) which has now been running for about 2 months. One of the areas looked at was a village called Courcômbe, in the Charente, where the older TGV line runs to the east of the village and the LGV to the west. It might be compared to say Water Orton which has more major traffic schemes surrounding it. Opinions differed on the issue of noise, although it was clear that the perception of noise had increased. Certainly there was an opinion that if the line had been sunk up to 5m lower, it would have helped. As for the operational future for the line, it is too early to say if take up and usage is meeting expectations. I did do a rail price search and one can travel one way for 100 Euros at short notice. The travel time is 2 hours 4 minutes. As has been said many times before, the argument for increased speed may have more aptness over greater distances, although the environmental pollution in terms of noise, increased energy usage, higher rail wear and the need to repair has to be factored in.

It is the intention of the Freeman family to hold an exhibition to display the Art of Pat Freeman at Stoneleigh Village Hall on Saturday, November 18^{th} 14:00 – 21:00. This was a promise that my sister Jackie, brother Jonathan and I made to her during the latter stages of her life and that would celebrate a life immersed in artistic creativity.

Pat our mother was indeed a talented artist who encouraged by her teacher "Miss Parncutt" at an early age won a scholarship to attend Art school in 1943, an opportunity that was to change her life in so many ways, as it was whilst there that she first met fellow artist and her future husband Peter, our father.

Whilst at Art School mum received some teacher training, a discipline that she used to teach art at evening classes and from which she earned 10 shillings a week which she later described as a lot of money in those hard times! On leaving Art School in 1948 she initially gained employment dressing shop windows for Smiths in Nuneaton then Arthur Hammond in Coventry city centre followed by work in Sasha Richter's Art studio, centred on display art.

Following the raising of a family mum's art teaching talents saw her working as a lecturer at the Butts technical college as well as going on to gain a BA in Art and to become a member of both the Coventry & Warwickshire Society of Artists as well as the East Cornwall Society of Artists.

Our mother's work is both diverse and prolific ranging from traditional oil, pastel and water colour to pottery and ceramics. Her work demonstrates a wonderful sense of colour particularly her drawings of flowers and is varied in subject matter, indeed her work is displayed all over the world.

On account of the quantity of work, the family have decided to offer much of the work for sale with the proceeds going to various charity centred services such a Macmillan Nurses and Myton Hospice.

It is intended that sealed bids can be made for the work with a minimum bid price being set to be both affordable and to reflect the quality of the work, so there will certainly be the opportunity to undertake some Christmas shopping irrespective of budget!

Everyone is welcome so do come along, enjoy the exhibition and perhaps you may wish to purchase a piece of our mother's work?
