## **HS2 UPDATE**

Despite all the expressions of concern about the shortcomings of the HS2 project - not least the rising costs and the adverse effects it will have on communities and the environment along the route – there are no signs that the Government will remove its support. Indeed, at the end of January the second reading of the Hybrid Bill (for Phase 2a between Birmingham and Crewe) was passed with only half the House voting and unfortunately a mere handful of MPs objecting – What does that say?

As announced in the last edition of the News, the HS2 Ltd ‘Area North Engagement Team’ and the contractors for this part of the route addressed a meeting of the Parish Council and residents on 8 February. This proved to be a very complex and frustrating meeting, partly because members of the team were unable to answer myriad questions which the community has been asking for several years, but also because now that contractors have been appointed, they have to re-visit all the issues included in HS2 Ltd.’s proposals and report on the implications (including cost implications) of their subsequent recommendations. This means that few further details are likely to be known until later this year (at which point another joint meeting will be organised) and little work is likely to begin until late 2019.

The good news for Stoneleigh is that assurances were given that lorries would not be allowed to drive through the village and the protection of Stare Bridge was confirmed. Unfortunately, there was far more bad news. The compound, adjacent to the A46 on the village side, will house approx. 400 personnel, storage, supplies and management offices. Traffic management will be a huge challenge as traffic to and from the compound will compete with existing heavy traffic to/from the University of Warwick and the Westwood Business Park, and increased traffic from various planned developments in the area, including the re-located Farmers’ Market (on the field opposite the compound) and the proposed housing developments at the junction of Glasshouse Lane and Crewe Lane, Thickthorn, Common Lane and Kings Hill plus the largest school in Warwickshire on Glasshouse Lane. All this is on top of the disruption – including road closures - caused by the actual building of HS2. The meeting expressed its concern about the impact of these developments in no uncertain terms!



On behalf of the Parish Council and StAG, Anthony Bianco has been extremely active liaising with other groups, lobbying on the community's behalf but – as elsewhere along the route – there are few signs that HS2 Ltd is actually listening to our concerns, an added problem being that their personnel are constantly changing. Efforts continue to gain greater interest and support from Warwick District Council and Warwickshire County Council in our plight. The detailed minutes of the 8 February have been sent to Jeremy Wright MP so that he too is alerted to the increasing complexity of the issues we all face.

## **Stoneleigh Village Hall Trustees Prepare Plans for Permissive Footpath.**

The Trustees of Stoneleigh Village Hall and Playing Fields wish to ensure that the competing uses to which the Village Hall Playing Fields are put live happily with each other. Football and other games are played and dog walking and walking for its own sake takes place; all different ways of enjoying fresh air and the green environment.

As well as promoting harmony between usages/users, the Trustees need to protect the status of the land for current and future generations and one of the ways this can be done is to grant a Permissive Footpath for those of us who wish to walk with or without dogs on the Trust land.

The Permissive Footpath is intended to be indicated by a number of wooden poles positioned along the route which, in the main, is to follow the boundary of the land.

The Trustees are considering applying a number of conditions of use of the PF such as limiting access to daylight hours and to when there are no formal games of any type being played on the Playing Field. Also, to reflect what is universally accepted as standard practice for walking dogs, a requirement that they be kept on leads and all dog mess be removed to the bins provided.

Also the Trustees may - on rare occasions - need to close the footpath for a variety of reasons relating to the maintenance of the land. Any closure would last only for as long as necessary for the purpose of the closure.

So as to avoid misunderstandings a Notice is to be placed conveniently on the Trust land for persons to read about the Permissive Path and its use and we would ask everyone to employ a spirit of cooperation and coexistence in the adoption of the conditions so as to make the amenity a special place for everyone and keep the task of managing the Hall and land as easy as possible for the volunteer Trustees and especially our

Administrator who cares for and looks after the Hall and Grounds in a conscientious and courteous fashion.

The above arrangements help to ensure that the use of the Trust land is safeguarded long into the future for the benefit of all persons concerned.

Should any resident in the village wish to comment on anything to do with the Permissive Path or require further clarification there will be opportunity for this at the Annual General Meeting to be held on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2018 in the Village Hall. ## WI REPORT

Most workers owned their own looms and silk was distributed to them by silk merchants. In the 1850s the Cash brothers built rows of weavers’ cottages with well lit upper storeys housing the new Jacquard looms. These weavers produced ribbons, which were often used to trim the dresses of fashionable ladies. They also produced woven silk pictures.

The current Warwick Rural East Safer Neighbourhood Team community forum policing priorities were set at the latest forum which was held on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2018 in Cubbington..As voted for online and at the forum, the new WRE SNT community forum policing priorities are:

Speed Checks/Monitoring - Sandy Lane, Blackdown: To prevent/deal with speeding motorists, promote speed reduction/awareness, educate motorists and provide reassurance to the local community conduct a minimum of 10 speed checks/monitoring sessions.

Crime Reduction Patrols - Stoneleigh: To prevent/deal with offences and to provide reassurance to members of the local community conduct a minimum of 15 dedicated high-visibility patrols.

## Neighbourhood Watch

Cold calls are not only annoying, but can also lead to many of the rip-offs you tell us about. Some simple do's & don'ts.

### Do:

· Ask cold callers to remove your information from their records. They must do this by law. If the same company calls again, complain to the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) on 0303 123 1113, or visit [www.ico.gov.uk](http://www.ico.gov.uk). Find out the caller's number from a landline by dialling 1471 after the call. Check with your phone company if your number can be made ex-directory. Register for free with the Telephone Preference Service (TPS) to reduce the number of sales and marketing calls on 0800 398 893 or register online at [www.tpsonline.org.uk](http://www.tpsonline.org.uk). Be careful when signing up to services which box you tick. Decide if you really want your details to be used for marketing, or passed on to other companies.

### Don't:

· Don't give away personal or financial information to cold callers, even if they claim to be from a company you know. If in doubt, look up the number of the company and call them back. Don't lose your temper. Be polite but firm. If the caller refuses to go away, hang up. If you are worried about a call tell your friends or family, or get some advice. Don't call back phone numbers left on your voicemail, or reply to text messages you don't recognise. The cost of the call could be excessive, or it could be a scam.
