HS2 UPDATE

There has been widespread press coverage of issues relating to HS2 throughout the summer - including escalating costs, high salaries for staff, delays in compensation and ineffective liaison with local communities - with increasing calls for the project to be abandoned. Despite much-publicised problems throughout the existing rail network, there are no signs that this will happen.

Locally, ground investigations around New Kingswood Farm began during late August/early September. HS2 Ltd has released a video describing how and why these investigations are being undertaken all along the route. One can only speculate what will be found and the extent to which adjustments mean further delays. To see this video, search online for 'HS2 ground investigations video'.

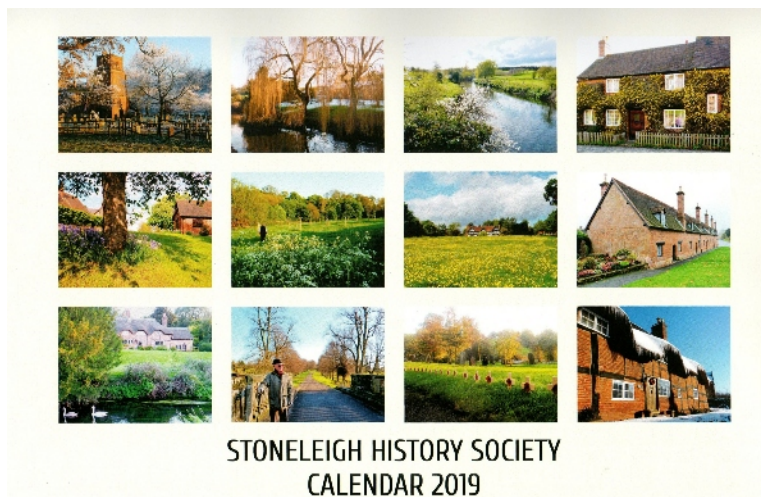
It is important to note the significant ground investigation contracts for 6 months additional work have been placed by the Main Works Contractor (MWC) (Balfour Beatty Vinci) in our sector, i.e. Long Itchington to Lichfield (N1 and N2), and similar work required to the south of us at Old Oak Common by other consortia. This work is required to clarify and augment the very limited data handed over by HS2 Ltd to date. HS2 Ltd has so far spent over £4 billion of public money with little to show in this area apart from newt ponds near Dalehouse Lane and the Stoneleigh Park Bat House (recently completed!) The effect is that without accurate data it is impossible to design, plan and cost work with any accuracy. Inevitably this will lead to delays in the contract negotiations and notice to proceed by the Minister and the Department for Transport at least until mid-2019.

Meanwhile, the Early Works Contractor (Laing O'Rourke/Murphy) will be continuing minor works in our area for the next 6 months e.g. B4115 site work and Kingswood Farm. The Parish Council has requested updates from the MWC and the enabling works contractor (LM) on 18 October, when it is hoped that there will be some planning data to share and members will be allowed some input. The Parish Council has been grateful to Colin Hooper of Stoneleigh Park, who has provided updates on HS2 Ltd activities in the Park and associated land.

The local press reported that planning permission has been given for substantial roadworks designed to improve the junction with Stoneleigh Road and the A46. Warwickshire Council Council highways staff will be updating the September PC meeting on A46 progress and timetables. Quite how work associated with HS2 and the proposed transfer of the Rugby market from Stoneleigh Park to the same area can be co-ordinated remains to be seen.

Parking in Stoneleigh

Dear Resident,

Over the years we have talked about "Considerate Parking" and have put a lot of effort to try to get all residents thinking about where they are parking and the impact it might have on other neighbours and friends.

Whilst appreciating that the number of cars that require parking in the village has increased, we do feel that many residents and visitors perhaps don't think of the impact they are causing when they park where they do.

We all like to park as close to home as we can, but there are certain areas that it really isn't safe to park. Parking close or on road junctions is probably the most dangerous place to park: not only are you preventing certain pedestrian users (wheelchairs, pushchairs etc.) from using the footway, you are also forcing them to cross roads where it just isn't suitable and visibility is not so good.

Before we injure one of our own, can we please ask that you all consider where you park and find somewhere safer and less disruptive.

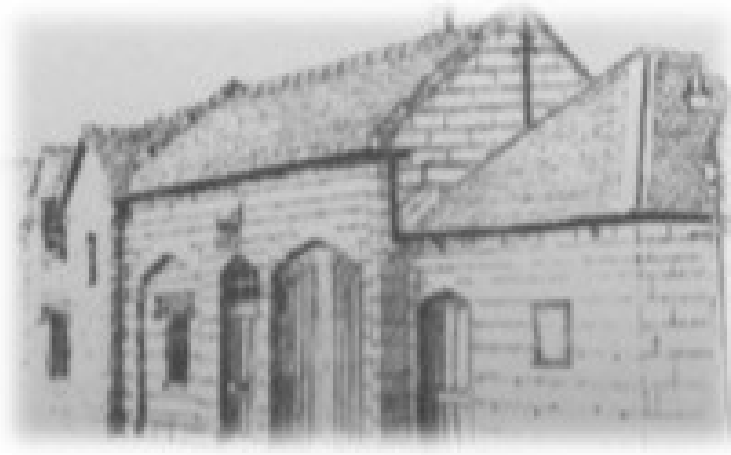
Parking on the footway is a contradiction of the Highway Code. Although it is not feasible for the police to act on every vehicle that contravenes this they will take action where such parking causes safety concerns. We do not want to get the police involved but in the interest of safety and protecting residents if you continue to park in an inconsiderate and dangerous location then we will.

The final step is to get double yellow lines painted around most junctions. This is the last thing we want to do so please think as you walk away from your vehicle: is it parked in a safe place, and not likely to place others in danger?

Just two examples of poor parking are the junctions of Hall Close and Stoneleigh Close with the Birmingham Road. The route from most of the village to the Village Hall and the playing facilities means that children have to cross both these roads on their route to and from the facility. Crossing any road is dangerous but where you are crossing between or behind a parked car makes it extremely dangerous - please don't!

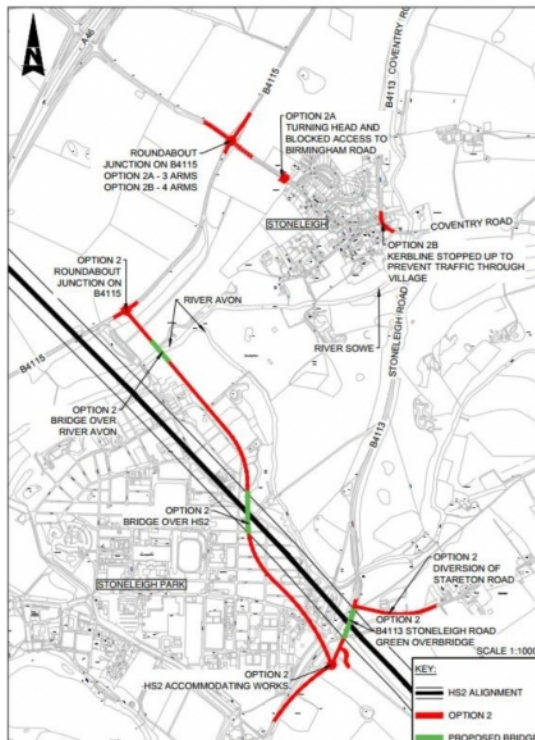
