HS2 Update

Once again, national and specialist media have featured many articles about HS2 Ltd. this month, mainly highlighting its shortcomings (potential dramatic overspend and so on, as reported in this column over the years). As the political landscape gets ever more complex with Brexit deadline looming, an increasing number of politicians are also raising doubts about the project although as yet there is no sign that the Government will ditch it.

In an attempt to fulfil their promise to improve communications with people affected, HS2 Ltd is now issuing regular bulletins about forthcoming works along the route.

It is still hoped that representatives of the Main Works contractor and the enabling works contractor will attend the meeting of the Parish Council on 18 October so that further clarification of the likely impact on our area can be given and questions asked/answered.

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC Update

The months of September & October are considered to be the busiest of the year for the Orchard group and given the exceptionally hot weather experienced throughout the summer the apples have as a consequence ripened early.

Within Stoneleigh Orchard the harvesting of early apple varieties started over the August Bank Holiday and is now complete. The apples were then left for a week prior to milling and pressing; this allowed the starch in the fruit to convert to sugar which is a desirable outcome prior to fermentation. Traditionally the apples are ready for milling when they retain the impression of a thumb print when held in the hand.

Unfortunately, 5 Church Lane doesn't possess the capacity to store vast quantities of apples for any longer than a week so we have to get on with milling and pressing before the next crop arrives so operating as part of a production line.

As this article is written the group are about to pick then press a Mid season variety of apple called "Yarlington Mill" named after a village and mill in the North Cadbury area of Somerset from which this variety of tree is derived. Those members of the community who want to observe the milling and pressing process are most welcome to visit the cider processing plant to the rear of 5 Church Lane and are also welcome to come and participate in the picking. We generally press on a Saturday and pick on a Sunday afternoon.

Prior to the start of cropping the group had a stand at the Stoneleigh Duck Race with the intention of publicising the Orchard as well as the cider. It was here that the group collected expressions of interest and contact information from folk who want to purchase next year's cider. The stand can be considered to have been a great success!

Finally, as a result of an excellent piece of work undertaken by group members John Churchley and Nora Blagburn, the Orchard now has its trees labelled so that the public can identify the various apple varieties. For those interested in this do wander down and take a look.

Orchard Friends subscriptions and yearly renewals for 2018 will cost £10.

Stoneleigh Village Club Established 1856 Reflections

I attended the delayed AGM on Friday 29 June (delayed because of the need to prepare year-end accounts) and was heartened to hear positive reports from

the officers. The treasurer reported that turnover had increased and a small profit had been generated. However, there was a downside: turnover had breached the VAT threshold and the Club is now VAT registered and this will demand even better future turnover to cover the additional tax burden.

In the light of this need to increase footfall in the Club, it was very disheartening to be one of fewer than 40 members who attended the AGM. Even more worrying was the absence of a candidate for Chairperson until a committee candidate volunteered to upgrade her nomination. More worrying still was the dearth of nominations for the committee which is now two members short of the requirements of the Articles of Association (the Club rules). Moreover, the Club has still not been able to attract a membership secretary; surely there must be a member somewhere who can run the custom designed Excel computer program? The membership secretary is not required to be a director of the Club.

Perhaps it might be timely to recall a little history: it was towards the end of 2012 that the Club was in difficulty; the landlord was demanding a huge increase in rent, the Club was loss-making and the committee was in some disarray. A packed meeting was held in the Village Hall in February 2013 and it was unanimously agreed that the Village Club MUST be saved. However, at the forthcoming AGM in April there were no nominations for officers and the meeting was adjourned. I was the 'locum' chairman of both these meetings and felt very unhappy with the outcome.

A number of village residents came together to see if the Club could be saved – and it was! The AGM re-convened in June and a committee was

elected. Subsequently, generous members raised £42,500 to buy the building and the garden, the club was registered as a Company Limited by Guarantee (this limits the vulnerability of directors, as opposed to committee members of an un-incorporated organisation) and the Club fortunes started to improve. This was achieved through the hard work of the committee and many others.

Returning to the last AGM, it was also very concerning to hear the Chairperson, in her report, refer to some unpleasantness she had received from a small number of members during her term in office. In an organisation run by volunteers it is totally unacceptable for these volunteers to be harangued by discontented members. Critical comment and suggestion is fine in the right place at the right time and perhaps a regular forum for feedback would be a good idea. Perhaps this is why few members are willing to volunteer for committee membership?

Residents of Stoneleigh do not need to be reminded that the Village Club is the only place for impromptu social gathering in the community – we no longer have a shop, a filling station or a post office; we need the Club to be a success.

The Committee recently took the decision to standardise the membership fee at £12 per person per year. It would be a sign of commitment to the future of the Club if most Stoneleigh adult residents joined; surely £1 per month is not too much for most people?

But, to return to my earlier comment, where are the volunteers willing to step forward and make a contribution to the management of the Club? Without a strong and energetic committee on which all posts are filled it would seem highly likely that the problems of 2012/13 might recur. The small team currently in place work hard to maintain and improve the social and economic performance of the Club but they need more help. If you have some time and energy to offer: "Your Village Club Needs You!"

PS. In April 2015, after a vigorous membership drive, the Club had 374 members. Today we have 200 paid up members! **#your Club needs YOU!!**

Meetings

The <u>October Ordinary Council meeting</u> will be held at Ashow Village Club on Thursday 11th October at 7pm.

Please note that there has been a change of date for the November meeting. This meeting will now be held on **Thursday, November 22nd 2018**. It will still take place at Stoneleigh Village Hall.

September's meeting

On September 13th, the Parish Council welcomed Nicola van der Hoven from Warwickshire County Council (WCC) to talk about the new A46 Stoneleigh junction. Ms van der Hoven gave an interesting presentation explaining the rationale and design of the junction. Work on the junction is currently planned to start in Spring 2019, but this is dependent on a number of elements, including ecological mitigation and securing funding from other partners — the West Midlands Combined Authority and the Department for Transport.

The next steps in the programme will set out clearly what is going to happen on Phase 2, which will include traffic modelling, consultation, looking at traffic issues, feasibility design. WCC are working through this a step at a time.

WCC are also looking at ways to reduce through traffic in Stoneleigh Village, which may involve closing a road at one end of the village. Consultation around this will take place during October and November, and there will be an information event in Stoneleigh Village Hall on October 10th where you can find out more and give your feedback. We will publish more information about this consultation on the Parish Council website as soon as we receive it from WCC.

Issues of parking in Stoneleigh were also discussed at the meeting, and Councillor Hancox will be writing to the Chief Constable to see what action can be taken to prevent people parking obstructively or dangerously.

Keeping You Informed

I must thank everyone who has contributed money to repair the chamber organ at Ashow. The response to The "Puff" Fund has been generous, both from individuals and from two local charities. The sum raised already covers the cost of essential repairs which will be completed by the end of October. "Marvellous" as our treasurer said.

What I didn't say in my first communication was that in the first place I applied for a grant for repairs, from a London based charity and we were turned down, basically because we were not prepared to spend enough money to actually restore the organ to its proper appearance, i.e. with the 1970's whitish paint stripped off and the unfortunate 'gold' paint removed from the decorative pipes. We can all learn from our mistakes like this! And by now I have enquired of the organ builders as to the added cost of putting all this right. The next move is to persuade the Ashow PCC to agree to this proposal.

I am willing to finish the job, and ask you to help me raise some more money to accomplish this. I shall also approach two more local charities. The fund stands at £4614.40.
