

## HS2 UPDATE

As I write this (18<sup>th</sup> March) the Early Works contractor should be starting the "vegetation clearance" along the A46 (this assumedly at night when a carriageway is to be closed) and along the B4115. This is to clear the route of the line and also to allow for the construction works, access routes etc. which accompany the process.

By the time you read this (unless there has been a delay to the works), you may have a clearer idea of what this actually means to our area. Clearances in other areas, e.g. near the proposed Birmingham Interchange can already be seen, and it looks very drastic.

Ironically, as these works progress, there has been no award of the main construction contract: this decision appears to be delayed. At the same time, there remains dissent in political ranks over the rising cost of HS2 with some Cabinet members openly expressing that they would cancel the project if it were their choice to do so. I think it fair to say that, whether you are a supporter or detractor, certainty over costs must be a priority before works start. Therefore it is a shame that these enabling works have to go ahead at this stage. Of course, Government and Parliament has its attention drawn to other matters.

Several pieces of work have been completed this month, including analysing and challenging the HS2 figures on earth movement and the ground investigation work (geotechnical baseline reports), which are required to enable the Main Works contractors to plan and prepare budgets. The Department for Transport then has to approve these before work can begin. Note that similar work on Crossrail took 2½ years. As above these factors will influence the schedules and start dates.

At a recent meeting with Jeremy Wright MP, Highways England, WCC and HS2 have been requested to revise the local traffic plans (dated 2017) to reflect new information and traffic movements.

## **Stoneleigh Community Orchard Update**

On February 12<sup>th</sup> four members of the Stoneleigh Orchard Group travelled to Pershore College in Worcestershire to investigate the facilities available for bottling cider.

This was undertaken largely in response to a number of customers requesting a sparkling cider in addition to the still "bag in a box" offering that is currently available, as well as to meet the demands of processing larger harvests going forward.

Readers may recall from previous articles that harvests appear to be increasing exponentially thereby requiring a more industrial and process based approach to meet the challenge.

Despite its location in Worcestershire, Pershore College is a part of Warwickshire College and has diversified its educational foundation to include the processing of cider and apple juice. This ranges from pressing, fermentation through to pasteurisation, carbonation and finally bottling.

The operation has been so successful that it offers the carbonation and bottling facility to small orchards and operators throughout the county and its bottled cider can be seen on sale at sites such as the Gloucester "eco" services on the M5.

Those members of the board who attended the meeting and who read the excellent follow-up visit report by John Churchly were sufficiently impressed to recommend that a small proportion of the cider from last year's harvest should go to bottling. This will no doubt present exciting new challenges and opportunities for the Orchard team to address!



Stoneleigh Orchard continues to consider aspects of marketing such as how to develop the orchard website. On an environmental front we are looking at the possibility and practicalities of removing a length of barbed wire fencing adjacent to the orchard that runs along the length of the river banks. This has degenerated into a collapsed condition, serving no purpose but to present a danger to man and beast.

Finally, the Orchard group will now be holding their quiz night on Saturday April 13<sup>th</sup> at 19:00 in Stoneleigh Village Club. The date was revised from March which coincided with other events being held in the village.

Orchard Friends subscriptions and yearly renewals for 2019 still only cost £10 and can be made to Pete Freeman as Chairman or to Richard Hancox as Treasurer. Cheques should be made payable to Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard, however why not become a long term friend and set up a direct debit?

At the March meeting of the Parish Council, there was discussion about the Warwickshire County Council report of the consultation about Birmingham Road. The majority of respondents want the road to be closed, however, there was no clear consensus as to which end the closure should be. The Parish Council will work with the Highways Authority and Warwickshire County Council to consider the best way forward.

Councillors will be meeting in early April to discuss their approach on the Stoneleigh & Ashow Neighbourhood Plan. A Neighbourhood Plan is a local initiative which gives communities the power to prepare a planning document that includes a shared vision for their neighbourhood. These plans can set out policies on the development and use of land in the parish and have formal weight in determining planning applications. This is a chance for the residents of Stoneleigh and Ashow to have their say and make a real impact on planning decisions in the parish. It will also increase the amount of money that the community will receive from any development in the area. ## **Birmingham Road Consultation**

The Parish Council have published the results of the consultation regarding options for easing traffic through Stoneleigh. The full report can be found on their website: <u>stoneleighashowparishcouncil.btck.co.uk/VillageMatters</u>


There were four options presented by Warwickshire County Council:

- A Do nothing
- B Close Birmingham Road at Ashow Road
- C Close Birmingham Road at Coventry Road
- D Alternative suggestions

#### Results

154 people voted, with 71% in favour of closing the Birmingham Road.

However, since this majority was split between which end of the Birmingham Road to close (options B or C), Warwickshire County Council have concluded that:



"WCC will NOT be progressing with a scheme on the Birmingham Road, Stoneleigh at this

time due to a lack of clear consensus towards a particular option, which would need to be demonstrated in order to support a bid for funding."

## Letter from Rev Nikki

#### Deal or No Deal?

That is the question we all wait to hear the answer to, is it not?

Though I suspect the answer will not be as straight forward as we might hope. Of course, the sad part of all the debacle in Westminster is that other important issues facing our nation are being neglected. As Westminster spends its time and energy wrangling over Brexit, we face a growing crisis on our streets.

Knife Crime amongst our young people is at epidemic proportions and homelessness has more than doubled since 2010. Do you know that the average age that a homeless person dies is 47? That is the age that I am now, and it is a sobering fact.

Though perhaps not as sobering as the figures for knife crime. In 2018, 59 knife crime offences were committed every day and this year looks set to be even higher and those most affected are our teenagers.

Of course, the thing with statistics is that they can mask the fact that we are talking about real people. Real people who, every day, live with the consequence of inaction on these and other issues that face our communities and our families.

As we approach Easter Day, when Christians move out of the death and destruction of Good Friday and into the light and hope of Easter Sunday, let us also turn our face away from the divisions and anxieties of what may or may not happen with Brexit and instead do all we can to be the light and hope for those who are suffering on a daily basis on the streets of our towns and cities.
