A Coat of Many Colours?

The Ashow Map wall hanging, installed a year ago, has brought welcome colour and freshness to the otherwise lifeless interior of Ashow church. It has highlighted in particular the drabness of the George III coat of arms, above the door, a feature which is of considerable historical interest.

Following the Restoration in 1660, all churches were required to display a royal coat of arms to emphasise that the monarch, and not the Pope, was the head of the Church of England. The Ashow example dates from between 1760 and 1801, and is the coat of arms of the Hanoverian monarchs of the United Kingdom of Great Britain, first created for George I in 1714. The top left quarter of the central escutcheon (shield) shows the combined arms of England and Scotland, and the bottom left, that of Ireland.

Since Edward III (1327-1377), the rulers of England had a claim to the throne of France, and this is shown by the fleurs de lys in the top right quadrant. The arms of Hanover are shown in the bottom right. They combine the two golden lions of Brunswick, the blue lion of Luneburg and the silver horse of Westphalia. The status of the Hanoverians as Prince-Electors of the Holy Roman Emperor is shown by the inescutcheon depicting the golden crown of Charlemagne.

It would be great to see the coat of arms restored to its original brilliance. Alternatively, given the present antipathy to all things European, some may prefer it to be removed altogether!

Thoughts from the Rev Nikki

Is your village church important to you and why?

On Wednesday 8th May I was formally licensed as Priest-in-Charge of Stoneleigh with Ashow at a wonderful celebration service. Firstly, a big thank you to all who came along and particularly those who helped to ensure it went smoothly.

So now I am officially the Priest-in-Charge of these two parishes as opposed to being here on secondment as has been the case for the past year or so. It is worth letting you know that the post is an interim post for a maximum of three years and part time. The reasons why are varied and complex, but one of the main reasons is because the churches of Stoneleigh and Ashow are unable to meet the financial costs of having a Vicar, even half- time, and they are being supported financially by other churches in the Kenilworth area.

Obviously, we cannot expect other churches to support us indefinitely so one of the objectives of my time here will be to work with the church and village communities to find out if the two churches can become financially viable for the longer-term future. We plan to write to each of you later this year with information about our financial position and how you may be able to help.

Other aspects of church life are struggling too; this is particularly the case in Ashow where regular attendance is dropping rapidly and the question being posed is whether it is feasible to continue to have weekly services in Ashow church when congregation numbers are often in single digits. For Stoneleigh we are seeing a growth in attendance which is heartening and the task here is to look to how we might better integrate into the community. The Baby and Toddler group is proving successful in this area but we feel there are more ways the church and village communities can better serve one another.

And this is why I ask the question:

Is your village Church important to you and why?

Is your village Church important to you and why?

- If it is important as a symbol of a Christian presence, then perhaps think through how you might help the church community grow in numbers and in their ministry of bringing the love of God into the villages.
- If it is important as a place where family members have and will be baptised, married and have their funeral, then perhaps consider how you might help ensure it continues to be here for future families.
- If it is important as a beautiful and historic building, then please consider how you might help with the upkeep of the building both practically and financially.
- And if the church is not really doing anything for you at the moment, then please do think about how it might better serve the needs of the villages at this time of national uncertainty.

I am always happy to chat with you about your views of the church as a building, as a community of Christian people and as an integral part of village life.

Together, over the next two to three years, we can work together to ensure the future of these churches in these parishes but I will need your help to do so.

HS2 UPDATE

Little has changed since the last edition of the News. It is clear that HS2 Ltd continues to prevaricate in its dealings with groups all along the proposed route. Given the ongoing speculation about the future of the Prime Minister, potential successors have been voicing contradictory statements about their views as to whether or not the project should be cancelled. Watch this space. However, the latest in a long line of statements from various research organisations and public bodies (notably the National Audit Office), on 16 May the House of Lords economic affairs committee stated that costs could be reduced by cutting the speed of HS2 trains; this would completely negate the original arguments about the need for a straight route in order to enable high speeds! The Lords committee also repeated its 2017 request that a full appraisal be made of the project's viability

Locally, the main evidence of preparatory works is on the B4115 where additional notices have been erected recently indicating that the work is associated with HS2. So far there has been no traffic disruption along the road but this is expected soon. Proposed tree removal along the A46 seems to have been delayed. In effect this would mean that the tree noise barrier – some 30 years' growth – will be removed and Stoneleigh will be noisier. This matter is being raised by the Parish Council and other PCs on the route who have petitioned the Government regarding the continuation of enabling works. These works are supposedly halted until the results of the financial review of all current infrastructure projects are known (possibly in December).

The Midlands Autofest at Stoneleigh Park over the Easter Weekend

Many of you contacted your parish and district council councillors regarding issues around the event held at Stoneleigh Park over the Easter Weekend.

The issues raised were from all around the Parish and covered noise, nuisance, traffic volume, speed and behaviour.

We have met with the event managers - Stoneleigh Events Ltd - along with the police, councillors and an environmental health officer from Warwick District Council and the Stoneleigh Park management.

We have suggested and continue to suggest that the venue is not suitable for such events. We are working with councillors and officers from the district council licensing team to see if we can influence changes or obtain clarification on the licence Stoneleigh Events has for running these and other events.

You may have noticed that for the Kit Car Show that followed the Easter Weekend event they placed additional signing out and provided better quality marshals to try and ensure traffic went the correct route into and out of the show ground. We believe this helped.

However this event was not the same sort of event, it didn't attract anywhere near the attendance figures that we saw over the Easter weekend.

Whilst discussions are still ongoing it would be difficult to say what the likely outcome will be, but we will endeavour to keep you informed throughout the process.

The police that attended the meeting did suggest that if we provide video or photographic evidence of offences being committed they will take action so please remember to send in any issues you manage to pick up.

On the signing issue, we have mentioned on more than one occasion to Stoneleigh Events and to the managers of Stoneleigh Park that the permanent signs in the village say “Stoneleigh Park” the permanent signs on the A46 and surrounding area say “Nat. Agric. Centre” and the temporary signs for the event say “NAEC” so how is anyone supposed to know where to go. One example of this is the sign at the top of the Exit Slip from the A46 states Nat. Agric. Centre to the right, but the very next sign at the crossroads before entering the village says Stoneleigh Park to the left. No wonder traffic comes down the Birmingham Road.

Also the temporary signs are always of different sizes, constantly falling over and not being picked up, set low in long grass etc. They have stated they will improve on this, but again we would welcome feedback on the signing for future events with photos where possible and safe to collect.

On another note a number of maintenance issues have been passed to us and these have been passed to the our County and District Councillors for rectification, these include:

- Nuisance and disturbance from the new houses being built on the Birmingham Road
- Overgrown hedges
- Slippery footpaths
- Faulty street lights
- Damaged drains between houses and the road
- Issues with the wooden posts in the footway near the bus stop
- Drainage issues on the Birmingham Road

County Councillor Wallace Redford updated the Parish Council about the proposals for revising the Stareton road junction to make it safer. It was confirmed that the Warwickshire Mobile Library Service is now visiting Stoneleigh Village Hall on a regular basis. It will be stopping in the village hall car park between 12.20 and 12.50 on the following Mondays – 10th June, 1st July, 22nd July, 12th August and 2nd September. AGM SPECIAL!

Stoneleigh Village Club (SVC) has a current 2018/19 membership of 224 persons. 172 of those members receive regular email updates with no bounce-backs. 29 of those members opt to only receive updates by phone or post and 10 members requested not to receive any updates at all.

Throughout 2018/19 SVC offered and hosted numerous events:

- Run club, weekly walks, book club, teams (as per below);
- Food hygiene course, first aid courses;
- Pudding Club, games, quizzes;
- Acoustica, karaoke;
- Duck Race, Halloween, Christmas Party, Easter Bonnet, Pancake Race.

Despite repeated requests to host social events, responses to invitations and participation has been significantly disproportionate and unsupportive compared to the 224 members that we have.

At the June 2018 AGM the mandatory positions of Secretary and Treasurer were voted to continue in their roles and the vacant Chair position was filled temporarily with no other nominations on the day. Three other committee members continued to show their support by remaining in their roles.

Throughout the 2018/19 membership year, 4 members requested to visit the beginning of a Committee meeting. One of these chose to become a full Committee member. At the end of this membership year SVC has 3+4 active voluntary Committee members representing a membership of 224.
