HS2 Update

Margaret Wallis on behalf of Stoneleigh Action Group (against HS2)

S2 continues to attract media attention, but with pressure for the project to be scrapped in favour of other financial priorities falling on deaf ears in Government. This area is now surrounded by 'enabling works', with road closures/traffic lights/one way systems/noise very much in evidence. Cadent have now begun gas pipeline works which will involve four closures of Crewe Lane between now and the end of October.

An HS2 Zoom meeting is planned in mid-July, when BBV will give the Parish Council and StAG an update on the planning situation.

Jeremy Wright MP will host another Forum meeting in July, which Anthony Bianco will attend. Various issues around the subject of noise have been raised by StAG and these have been forwarded to Jeremy Wright and to the Department for Transport for urgent environmental review.

- a) **B4115: Surveying for three days from 6th July**Temporary traffic lights (two- or three-way) along the route from Stoneleigh Road/Birmingham Road and the junction of the B4115 and A452 Leamington Road/Kenilworth Road
- b) Temporary night closures (approx. 8.00pm to 6.00am)

12th – 15th July: Stoneleigh Road closed from A46 to

B4115/Birmingham Road junction)

16th, 19th & 20th July: B4115 to Stoneleigh Close

21st & 22nd July: Hall Close to B4113 Coventry Road 23rd July: Coventry Road to Stoneleigh Bridge

HS2 say that "access to properties will be maintained". Let's hope so, as the diversions are inevitably long-winded.

To pour salt into the wound, numerous other roadworks are in the pipeline.

- New roundabout entrance to Stoneleigh Park
- New roundabout for entrance to the re-located Farmers' Market (next to the new A46 Stoneleigh junction)

The June meeting, held virtually, covered subjects including the closure of the Birmingham Road, HS2 and flooding in Ashow. We were pleased to be joined by five members of the public, demonstrating that, although the meetings are being held online, people are still able to attend and take part.

The potential closure of the Birmingham Road has been an on-going issue for some time, and Councillors have drafted a short consultation paper that will soon be sent to all residents of the parish who are registered on the electoral roll. This will be your opportunity to state whether you are in favour of closing the road or not. If residents are in favour of closing the road, it will be down to highway engineers at Warwickshire County Council to consider the best way to do this and where the closure should be. We would like to hear from as many people in the parish as possible, so do look out for your consultation letter, and be sure to return your completed vote by the deadline given. If you have any questions, please contact the Clerk via email. Minutes of the meeting are available on the Parish Council website.

Information about COVID-19 is changing quickly, and we are keeping our Facebook page up-to-date with the latest developments. ere is silence, and for some darkness, lonelines


Now there is silence, and for some darkness, loneliness and fear. Where is God?

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC Update

s predicted in last month's article, we ran out of cider back at the start of June and of further interest was how popular our limited quantity of perry proved to be!

In Stoneleigh Orchard, our perry pear trees form part of the line following the banks of the river. We have five varieties with interesting names such as Moorcroft, Thorn, Judge Amphlett, Hendre Huffcap and Helen's Early. Each of these pear varieties share common features. Their fruits are small, hard and packed with tannins. When you try to eat them, the taste is pretty awful and full of acids. Perry is the alcoholic liquor derived following their pressing and fermentation. The perry created from the orchard to date appears to have a clear-to-blush appearance, with the sweetness of the pear only picked up as a subtle background taste. It makes a perfect drink on a hot summer's day, particularly when chilled with ice!

The harvesting of these fruit will commence in September and will definitely be more labour intensive because the fruit rots from the inside to the out, so needs to be picked just at the right moment to both capture all the natural sugars, but also avoid the decay. A pressing also produces smaller volumes of juice and, as a result, Stoneleigh perry can be considered a premium product relative to Stoneleigh cider.

I consider June, July and the first part of August to be a relatively quiet period in the orchard, unless there is a summer storm to interrupt the serenity, so do take a stroll in advance of the busy autumn period. I look forward to meeting fellow members of the group for the harvest.

Finally, I'd like to praise villagers, Russell Poole and Deborah Collins (who live in the School House) for all their hard work litter picking in the meadow. This work is purely voluntary, but didn't go unnoticed when we met in the orchard earlier in the year. Perhaps they can act as a catalyst for others.

It was also with some amusement that, back in late May, the orchard became the final destination of Brody's "Gold and Treasure" hunt on BBC CWR. The interview was a small, but significant, milestone and was won, as I recall, by a listener from the Rugby area. It is great to see the orchard becoming a focus more broadly in the area.



1. Cancellation of the 2020/2021 AGM due to the COVID-19 pandemic

Resolution No 1:

The 2020/2021 AGM was voted to be cancelled by 20 votes for and nil against.

2. The current club committee is to remain in post for a further 12-month period.

Resolution No 2:

With the formalities above now concluded, the committee can proceed with plans for the forthcoming year in these very challenging times. The committee has been working very hard in the background right from the early days of the lockdown to ensure that the club premises, staff and financial position are in the best possible shape they can be, given the uncertainty surrounding any possible reopening of hospitality venues.

We have been monitoring both the Government, local council and the large pub chains as sources of information, and will continue to do so in order to be able to be in a position to reopen when safe to do so. Guidance is constantly changing, so we are doing our utmost to keep up-to-date with developments.


Each individual premises will have its own unique challenges to overcome. We are actively investigating internal and external layouts, protection of staff and customers, sanitary arrangements, working practices, cleaning, capacity planning, stock availability and reordering, claiming duty back on spoilt stock and redecoration.

Unlike the major pub chains and free houses who have full time management teams and access to large financial and material resources, we are a part-time committee of volunteers who will do their level best to get the club open again. We want members and your friends and families to enjoy coming to the club in the confidence that it is a safe and well-run establishment.

The best way that you can support the club at present is to renew your membership subscriptions. If we can get this activity completed quickly, we can then put one hundred percent effort into preparing the club for reopening. We will not be able to renew club memberships on the club premises due to the anticipated restrictions regarding hygiene, cash and staff safety. Payments can be made via bank transfer or cheque through the club letterbox in an envelope detailing who the payment is for (membership remains at £12 per adult). We'd like this opportunity to thank those who have already paid; your support really is appreciated.

Very quickly, the Birmingham Road became a fast flowing river! It headed down past the Green, across the Square, down Church Lane and out into the orchard.

The water spilled over on to the pavements and into gardens, carrying with it mud and debris from the road edges and fields, causing mess for many. However, some (these being men of a certain age!) found it exciting and could not resist the temptation to paddle in the deep (4") flowing river; one neighbour even managed to lose a flip flop!



The following day, the Council were straight on with cleaning the road (thanks to the efforts of the Parish Council reporting concerns), and councillors Pam and Wallace Redford knocked on doors to check that all was well, which was really appreciated. There is concern about the state of the drains.

I haven't heard of anyone experiencing serious damage, so I do hope that nobody is in this situation.
