HS2 UPDATE

COVID-19 notwithstanding, the HS2 Show rumbles on relentlessly, causing havoc in its wake! No amount of adverse publicity or petitions (the latest one, initiated by Chris Packham, doing particularly well) seems to make the slightest bit of difference. This seems to be one U-turn too far for the Government!

There has been much publicity this month about the 'Community Engagement Programme' which is part of the HS2 Ltd Green Corridor Programme which Laing Murphy is undertaking. Given the amount of destruction of ancient trees, woodlands and natural habitats happening before our eyes, it is ironical that a programme is being promoted whereby millions of trees are being planted and swathes of wild spaces are being created. Despite assurances to the contrary, no one can be sure that, for example, saplings won't be planted in flood plains and /or will be ignored in times of drought.

For those of you hoping to use Dalehouse Lane for the rest of January - Forget it. Major works associated with HS2 are planned and the road will be closed.

As has been highlighted in this column many times before, several local road programmes impinge on HS2 works already in progress. Those of you who have ventured out during the latest lockdown will have noticed ongoing works associated with the A46 roundabout. The 'WCC/A46/Strategic Link Road Consultation' is currently in progress, deadline 14th February. An extensive online questionnaire is available:

<u>a46linkroad@warwickshshire.gov.uk</u> or 01926 418029 for a paper copy, where residents' views are sought on the 'New transport corridor between the A46 Stoneleigh junction, the University of Warwick and Westwood Heath, Coventry'. If anyone wants to give themselves nightmares of what things might be like around here in the future, have a look! However, this presents a chance to influence things.....Well, mabe.....

For those of you who can bear to contemplate what lies ahead, the following are some of the local issues associated with HS2 which our Parish Council and Stop HS2 are attempting to clarify:

- The proposal to make the B4115 one way from March 2021 for at least three years to allow HGV access to the A45 compound. This includes proposals for the Chesford corner, B4115 widening plans and Crew Lane to Stoneleigh crossroad plans/road realignment (including points raised by Stoneleigh Park and Warwick District Council).
- 2. A46 compound at Stoneleigh Road and Farmers' Market entrance urgent resolution of land/covenant issues over land affecting the Stoneleigh Road compound entrance and preferred entrance plan application.
- 3. B4113: Site plan revision for Stoneleigh Park Gate 1, bridge and crossing.
- 4. Clarification needed from HS2 Ltd., contractors (BBV/LM) and Warwick County Council about traffic plans for our area for the next two years.
- 5. Continuation of Stoneleigh By-pass plans to be included in site plans for 2021 (to ensure this remains on the agenda).

Stoneleigh Village Club Update


The Club committee & staff would like to wish all of our members a Happy New Year.



Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC Update

In late November of last year the Orchard Group held its first directors' meeting, for some considerable time, via video conference. Ideas flowed and were certainly in abundance.



A large part of the meeting concentrated on the growth strategy for the orchard. As a group we are already approaching full capacity for what we can effectively process in terms of a harvest so several ideas were proposed as to how we can proceed going forward. These spanned from the sale of excess fruit to third party companies, liasing with similar local orchards and strategies to increase our processing capacity. This will certainly form a theme for Orchard accounts 2019/20. This is a large piece of work undertaken amidst the obstacle of a Covid lockdown and is deserving of recognition. It is a key task that every company has to wrestle with at this time of year.

In response to a number of observations made by visitors and walkers in the orchard throughout the winter an inspection was undertaken of the strapping that attached the trees to the stakes to ensure that they didn't cut into the bark. Where required the straps were loosened. This is quite an important piece of work as if left to cut into the trunks this can cause infection as well as ultimately kill the tree. The whole idea of using stakes and strapping is to provide support for the tree, but care has to be taken with this.

Many of the larger trees were purchased aged three years, grafted bare root stock and required the support of stakes and strapping at an early stage. This however is a double-edged sword as the intention is for the trees to develop a root system that can support the tree into maturity without the need of a stake.

The stakes do not encourage the trees to develop a root system and are in effect counterproductive to their long-term development. The Group's long term strategy is to gradually remove the stakes and let the trees stand alone and strengthen naturally.

Finally, with shared thoughts, let us hope we emerge from these dark times and look forward to the start of the new spring blossoms and warmer weather!

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Meetings

Due to the current social distancing requirements, Parish Council meetings are being held online, via Zoom. Residents are still welcome to attend (you do not need to have a Zoom account to attend), details will be posted on the website three days before the meeting. Please also note that all information relating to meetings will be on the website only for now, no information will be posted on the village notice boards.

The next meeting will be on Thursday, February 11th at 7pm.

At the December meeting, we were joined by colleagues from Warwickshire County Council (WCC) to discuss the consultation about the A46 strategic link road. The proposed road will run between the A46 Stoneleigh Junction, University of Warwick and Westwood Heath in Coventry. The consultation puts forward a number of scenarios, from doing nothing, creating a partial link, extending the link and some sub-options. The consultation runs until 14th February 2021. The main issues raised by Councillors were around the impact on traffic in Stoneleigh and the need for the Stoneleigh bypass to be built before the development of the link road.

At the January meeting the main area of discussion was the closure of the footpath between Stare Bridge and Stoneleigh Park by HS2 Ltd.. This issue has also been raised at previous meetings and the Parish Council were disappointed that their efforts to stop or postpone the closure until a suitable alternative route could be found had failed. There was anger that HS2 have proceeded with the closure of the public right of way without addressing any of the complaints and that the closure is likely to last for a period of years. Discussions are continuing to take place with WCC, Warwick District Council and HS2, and this has been raised with Jeremy Wright MP to try and reach an appropriate resolution.

It was mentioned during the meeting that a technical report has been provided by the developers of the land at Thickthorn examining the flood risk at Ashow Village. This report will be circulated via the Ashow email distribution list, and or can be obtained by emailing the Clerk at stoneleighashowparishcouncil@gmail.com.

There was discussion about the upgrade of broadband for Ashow and Crewe Lane areas, which is now being taken forward by Openreach, although delays have occurred due to the uncertainty of eligibility for funding to offset the costs. This will be discussed further at the PC meeting in February.

We had been hoping to hear from WCC about the plans for the proposed closure of Birmingham Road. We have been informed by the county council that they have some outstanding issues to resolve before they are able to present their plans to us, so we hope to hear from them soon about when that will be. All information about the proposed closure will be put on the PC website.

There is currently a vacancy on the Parish Council for a Councillor to represent the Ashow ward. If you are interested, please see the website for more information and how to apply.

Minutes of all meeting are available on the Parish Council website.

Information about COVID19 is changing quickly, and we are keeping our Facebook page up to date with the latest developments. Don't forget to check out the Parish Council website which is regularly updated with local information such as road and traffic issues, HS2 updates and local consultations.
