HS2 UPDATE

Margaret Wallis - Stoneleigh Action Group (against HS2) (StAG)

It seems as though the same observations, complaints and changes to plans are going to be a feature of our foreseeable futures! For example, HS2 Ltd. has recently announced that the closure of the A425 Southam-Leamington Road will continue for several further months. Meanwhile, trees vanish, temporary closure notices are erected and long-term road diversions are announced on an almost daily basis.

Anthony Bianco (Stoneleigh and Ashow Parish Council) has provided the following information.

The 6th of March saw the long overdue publication of the planning application to build a roundabout on Stoneleigh Road to serve the A45-HS2 compound and proposed re-located Rugby Farmers' Market. In theory this is good news. The lengthy document will be carefully discussed by the Parish Council (PC) to ensure the plan is fit for purpose. Given the short period to respond, the PC requested an extension and this was granted until the 9th of April. Comments from residents are gratefully received.

As a result of the village vehicle watch on HGVs, the PC has persuaded Warwickshire County Council (WCC) to get HS2 Ltd. to provide road signs at the top and bottom of Birmingham Road to further deter HGVs coming through the village. The data collected has been presented monthly in support of this small deterrent. Thanks to Sue Malone, Martin Smith and others for keeping watch and providing the data.

The one way system proposal for the B4115 is still very much alive. The PC is waiting for proposals from HS2 Ltd. to mitigate and shorten the use of the B4115 route to the A46 compound. Hopefully there will be more plans soon and more constructive news. Under the Highways Act, only 12 HGVs per day are permitted to use the B4115. If more are required, HS2 have to apply to WCC in advance. It has been agreed that WCC & PC will be monitoring the route and requests.

Stoneleigh Community Orchard Update

The month of March typically represents a relatively quiet time in the orchard, with any pruning generally finished and the Stoneleigh cider awaiting the completion of fermentation prior to being pasteurised and boxed up.

Given the above, and in the absence of recent activities to report, it is worth reflecting upon some of the environmental projects that have occurred in the Stoneleigh area, and specifically those designed to mitigate the effects of HS2. For example, the areas of new tree planting in which members of the Orchard Group were involved during the planning alongside managers and employees from the Royal Agricultural Show ground.

In common with many others, I have taken to walking the surrounding countryside after work as part of an exercise regime during lockdown, and have been amazed at how these areas have already had such a benefit to the environment in the short time since they have been planted.



In recent months it's been a pleasure to observe the latest residents to Stoneleigh, a pair of barn owls! They can be observed flying low over the recently-planted areas in search of their prey. These are generally mice, voles and shrews which have clearly flourished in these unmown and wild areas. Barn owl numbers have been dropping in recent decades so it is great to see how Stoneleigh has played a small part in helping their population to recover.



It will also be interesting to note if the large numbers of colourful "Scarlet Tiger Moths" observed in late spring and early summer of last year will make a reappearance this year. They have also clearly benefited from the meadows remaining uncut for longer periods with the caterpillars largely feeding on wild comfrey.

So please keep an eye out for this wildlife in the weeks and the months that lie ahead.

RESIDENTIAL HOUSING VACANCY

The Dame Alice Leigh's Almshouse is a charity providing housing accommodation in ten sandstone cottages in the centre of Stoneleigh, a quiet rural village in Warwickshire.

A residence in this 16th century Almshouse has become available.

On the ground floor of each home there is a hall, leading to a sitting room with kitchen. A door to utility room leads through to a cloakroom with washbasin and toilet. A dog-leg staircase from the hall leads to the first floor where there is a bedroom and shower room with washbasin and toilet.

Outside there is a small private patio connected to large communal gardens where there is a useful storage building with dedicated space for each resident.

Cottages are equipped with cooker, fridge & washing machine, phone line, emergency assistance-call unit, carpets, electric storage heaters, smoke & heat detectors, hot water immersion heater, and a TV point. A communal digital TV aerial and mast is also provided.



The Dame Alice Leigh Charity repairs and maintains the fabric and services to the building, as well as the outbuildings and communal gardens.

Applicants must be needy, of retirement age, capable of independent living and have a genuine need of Almshouse housing.

Preference is given to residents who live in or have connections with the parish of Stoneleigh. However, Trustees welcome applications from other qualifying persons.

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Meetings

Due to the current social distancing requirements, Parish Council meetings are being held online, via Zoom. Residents are still welcome to attend (you do not need to have a Zoom account to attend), details will be posted on the website 3 days before the meeting. Please also note that all information relating to meetings will be on the website only for now; no information will be posted on the village noticeboards.

The next meeting will be on Thursday, April 8th at 7pm.

The Stoneleigh Village Meeting will take place on April 22nd at 7pm, via Zoom. A link to the meeting will be available on the Parish Council website 3 days beforehand.

The May meeting of the Parish Council has been brought forward to May 6th 2021. This is to enable the Council to meet remotely via Zoom. The legislation that allows the Council to meet online expires on May 7th, so if this is not extended, meetings may have to take place physically from June. The Parish Council are currently looking at how this can be managed and it may be the case that meetings are held outdoors in order to facilitate social distancing requirements.

At the Parish Council meeting in March there was discussion about the offer of a funded artwork for the Parish. There have been different opinions expressed by residents, and Councillors are keen to get feedback from as many people as possible about whether or not they would like the art installed in the parish, what sort of artwork they would like, and where, if anywhere, it should be placed. Please do contact the Clerk or speak to one the Councillors about this as we want to hear from you. More information can be found on the PC website.

The problem of cars parking on the verge near the crossroads was also discussed. As residents may be aware, Warwickshire County Council (WCC) have installed signage in the area but this is not stopping people using the verge as a car park. WCC will be asking the Police to issue fixed penalty notices to anyone caught parking on the verge. If this does not address the problem, our WCC Councillor will ensure that further action is taken to address the issue.

The Parish Council are continuing their fight against the proposal for a one-way system on the B4115. Councillors discussed the planning application submitted by HS2 for construction of a roundabout which would provide access to the HS2 compound from Stoneleigh Road. If this roundabout were to be built, it would mean that HS2 traffic would not have to use the B4115 to access the compound. Residents are encouraged to view the planning application on the WDC Planning Portal (www.warwickdc.gov.uk/planning, reference W/20/2013).

The Parish Council has yet to hear from Warwickshire County Council regarding the plans for the closure of Birmingham Road. Officers from WCC have been invited to attend the April PC meeting and we are waiting on their response. Check the website for further information.

There is currently a vacancy on the Parish Council. If you are interested in becoming a Councillor, please see the website for more information and how to apply, or come along to one of the meetings to see what is involved.

Minutes of all meeting are available on the Parish Council website.
