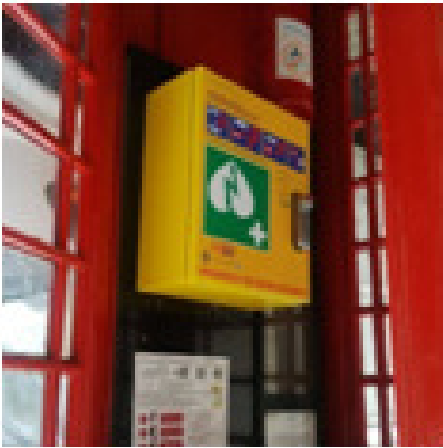

Peter Walters, remembered by many as a former Evening Telegraph journalist, will tell us about an extraordinary initiative to create a layered historical atlas of Coventry. Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC update

With Covid restrictions starting to relax, both cider processing and orchard activities are once again on the cusp of “ramping up” into the new season. I am hoping that visitors to the Orchard will once again be treated to a fine display of blossom from April and throughout May. Readers may recall that the harvest of 2020 approached 1000 litres in capacity so assuming there is negligible spoilage, the group’s immediate task, commencing traditionally from the first blossoms, will be to pasteurise and box up the cider ready for sale. Existing prices will remain the same as previous years at £20 for a 5 litre box and £16 for those folk who have become “Friends of the Orchard”.

As Stoneleigh Community Orchard is a not-for-profit CIC and we appear to have generated a £428 profit as of 31st March 2020, following the submission of accounts, it is incumbent on us to make some of those monies available in support of community related activities. Allowance will of course be necessary to meet any operational expenses which may arise generally during and in advance of the harvest. One also never knows if we will require a replacement “scratter” to pulp the apples, which being German in origin has operated stoically for a decade!

The Orchard Group would be glad to consider any suggestions with how to distribute these profits. My own preferences generally centre on environmental related projects such as tree planting. In that respect they echo some of the aspirations of Captain Sir Tom Moore and his legacy to the Woodland Trust. Of particular personal interest is the reintroduction of disease resistant elm trees which were largely destroyed during the 1960’s and used to be so abundant in this county that they were called “The Warwickshire Weed”.

Woodland projects such as those financed by the late local poet Felix Dennis in areas to the South of Warwickshire around Great Alne and Studley designed to recreate the Forest of Arden, could act as a catalyst for smaller projects locally.

On reflection it is amazing how the power of the written word and poetry can inspire:

*'I built myself a house of wood....'
I built myself a house of wood
Where once an apple orchard stood
On stormy nights I lay in bed*

*While rafters moaned above my head.
They wept aloud for limbs long lost,
For buds pinched out by early frost,
For wicker baskets piled with fruit,
For phantom branches and withered root.*

*I caulked the roof and rafter beams,
But still they whispered in my dreams,
They spoke of rising sap and wood:
- And then, at last, I understood.*

*This spring I planted out a score
Of apple saplings by my door.
Now stormy nights my rafters chime
To cider choirs and nursery-rhyme.*

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Meetings

Because of the current social distancing requirements, Parish Council meetings are being held online, via Zoom. Residents are still welcome to attend (you do not need to have a Zoom account to attend), details will be posted on the website 3 days before the meeting.

The next meeting will be on **Thursday, May 6th at 7pm** for the Annual Parish Council meeting, and 7.30pm for the Ordinary Parish Council meeting.

At the PC meeting in April there was discussion about the proposed roundabout to be built on Stoneleigh Road. The roundabout will provide access to the HS2 compound as well as the proposed Farmers Market. If the roundabout is built, it will take away the need for a one-way system on the B4115, a system that the PC is strongly opposed to. Whilst supporting the roundabout in principle, the PC have raised a number of questions to Warwick District Council around issues including drainage, the impact on traffic at the Stoneleigh Crossroads and details of the acquisition of the land to be used. A conditional objection has been submitted to WDC based on these issues. Details of the planning application can be found on the WDC Planning Portal (www.warwickdc.gov.uk/planning, reference W/20/2013).

The PC invited a representative from Warwickshire County Council (WCC) to attend the meeting to talk about the closure of the Birmingham Road. They were unable to attend, but did provide the following statement:

"The County Council is aware of the issues associated with rat-running traffic which uses Birmingham Road through Stoneleigh Village as a short-cut between the B4115 and B4113. In response to a request from Stoneleigh and Ashow Parish Council, the Transport Planning Unit have been exploring options for a potential closure of Birmingham Road to general traffic, whilst maintaining access for buses, pedestrians and cyclists."

Discussions are ongoing with HS2 Ltd and other key partners to identify what measures could be implemented given other considerations in the area. These include HS2 construction movements to/from their Stoneleigh Compound, and the need to maintain access to the Covid-19 mass vaccination centre at Stoneleigh Park."

The on-going problem of cars parking on the verge near the crossroads was discussed. Cllr Wallace Redford asked for residents to provide him with photographic evidence of parked cars to support the case for WCC to change the incorrect signage that has been put and instead install bollards to prevent parking.

Councillors discussed the proposal for a funded piece of artwork in the parish. Options are being explored for a sculpture of a dove with an olive branch, which may be able to be placed in the churchyard. More information about the potential design options and siting will be discussed at the May meeting.

There is currently a vacancy on the Parish Council. If you are interested in becoming a Councillor, please see the website for more information and how to apply, or come along to one of the meetings to see what is involved.

HS2 UPDATE

Residents cannot fail to have noticed ongoing works, and erratic felling of trees in our area.

There is route-wide concern about tree-felling which has received extra publicity as one of the woods concerned is where Roald Dahl is supposed to have written 'Fantastic Mr Fox' . Ecologists at the RSPB have demanded a review and an enquiry into the granting of licences by Natural England for felling in the bird-nesting season. (*Stop press.* A judge has ordered HS2 Ltd. to cease all felling at Jones Hill Wood pending a hearing on 24 May at the earliest).

Work on the A46/Stoneleigh Road compound area, in addition to the new junction works on the outskirts of the village, are ongoing and will increase in the near future and last for some 5 years

In the last 6 weeks the PC have had several meetings with HS2 Ltd. and the contractors LM and BBV to minimise the disruption to our community

The traffic plan for next 5 years, HGV numbers and the proposed *new* routing to avoid the overuse of the B4115, has been verbally presented to the PC and WCC..

The long-awaited planning application for the roundabout on Stoneleigh Road was published on 6 March 2021. The WCC & PC have filed a number of objections on the lack of detailed content. (See the April PC meeting minutes). The PC have stressed that they wish the work to go forward but with a more future-proofed proposal.

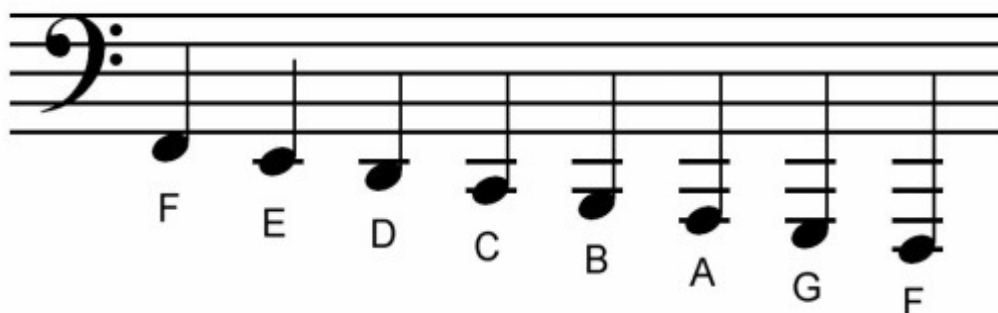

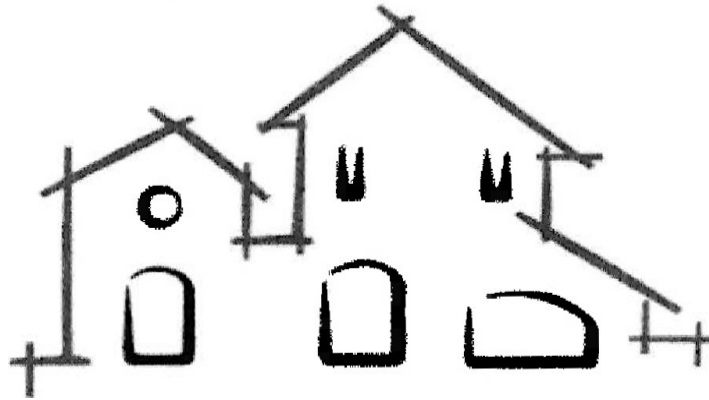
