HS2 UPDATE

Locally, we continue to notice signs of HS2 advance works. Most recently the closure of Dalehouse Lane until 3rd October so the AA notices say, but this may change as the dates of so many HS2 works tend to do. With the A46 roundabout improvement works, considerable disruption is being caused.

In the last News we reported that a petition submitted by Chris Packham had achieved more than the required 100,000 signatures and so a parliamentary debate could be held. This took place on 13th September and several MPs were critical of HS2 and its environmental impact and costs but there was no agreement about abandoning the project. However, this exercise generated a lot of publicity so it is hoped that more careful scrutiny can be made. Hollow consolation!

Stoneleigh Community Orchard Update

With apple harvesting already commenced, it is worth considering when the various varieties are ready to be picked. Apple varieties are broadly grouped into early, middle and late. Stoneleigh Orchard contains a mix of varieties from all three groupings. Our early varieties such as Katie and Hunt's Early are dessert apples which can be harvested and pressed towards the end of August.

To test if an apple is ready to be picked, I cut it in two parts and look at the colour of the seeds. If the apple is ripe then the white seeds will have turned brown, and the apple starch will have been converted into sugars such as fructose. The conversion of starch to sugars can also be checked by pipetting iodine on the apple flesh and observing the colour change; starch shows as navy blue, however, I prefer to avoid any chemistry and normally use the former method.



Our cider apples, Morgan Sweet and Tom Putt, are generally classed as early which can be harvested in the second week of September, whereas middle varieties like Yarlington Mill are harvested later in the month. Late varieties such as our main stay Dabinett and Stoke Red apples have harvests that can last into the latter weeks of October and occasionally into November.

I tend to aim for a fermentation container with a mix of sweet, sharp and bitter flavours and this is achieved by pressing and adding the correct apple in carefully blended proportions. The timescales for the above vary a great deal and are subject to the weather experienced throughout the year. A long hot summer can mean an earlier harvest whilst a cool summer such as this year, can often lead to a protracted and late harvest.


So, the Orchard Group may be working into the late Autumn. I am sure that the orchard will also be subject to storm events which will require a speedy intervention when it comes to harvesting. Having already processed the early dessert varieties, harvesting is scheduled to get into full swing from the third week of September onwards. This is when you will find us in the fields should you want to participate!

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Meetings

The next meeting will be on **Thursday, October 14th at 7pm** and is planned to be held online via zoom. The access link will be published on the website three days prior to the meeting. We will be joined by representatives from HS2 contractor, BBV, who will be giving details of some of the upcoming planned work in the area.

At the PC meeting in September, it was confirmed that there are no further updates for the Birmingham Road closure as yet. Warwickshire County Councillor, Wallace Redford, is looking into potential funding to cover the estimated £30,000 costs. It is unlikely that the road will be closed before January 2022 and the closure will then be in place until the Summer of 2023. During the last six months of that time, Warwickshire County Council will carry out a full evaluation of the closure and decide whether it will remain in place permanently.

Parish Councillors acknowledged the increase in the volume of traffic coming through the village in the last few weeks, and the issues that this is causing around speed and heavy good vehicles using the bridge. The Parish Council will contact Warwickshire police to see how this can be addressed.

It was noted that there has been an increase in the amount of fly-tipping in the area. Residents are reminded that all incidents should be reported to Warwick District Council, including if possible, the date, time and place of occurrence, the vehicle type, colour and registration, a brief description of the person fly-tipping and a photo of the fly-tipping.
