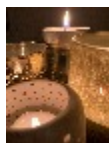

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC Update

With apple pressing concluded and the juice fermenting in tanks over the winter period, attention amongst board members has been focused towards how the orchard can be sustained and equipped for the next decade. Readers may recall that 2021 marks a decade since the orchard's creation. From experience, the only guarantee in life is that change will happen irrespective of opinion, and this, no doubt, will equally apply to the evolution of the orchard and its related processing.

Given this observation, the board has directed a lot of research into how similar local enterprises have developed in order to be informed of what challenges may lay ahead. This research has revealed some startling realities that show that Stoneleigh Orchard is relatively unique in Warwickshire in the way it operates. It seems that most of Warwickshire's cider producers receive apple juice pressed outside of the area from more traditional cider counties such as Herefordshire. The apple juice is then conveyed and received in large tankers for fermentation locally. One can only speculate as to what impact transporting juice in tankers has on the quality of the product, not to mention the impact on the carbon footprint (which is at the forefront of so much recent public discussion). From research, it also seems that the option to subcontract the processing of derived products also appears to be the first recourse of local producers.

On the face of it, this makes Stoneleigh cider a relative "one-off" for the county and this can be viewed very positively for its future. In a recent discussion with an established local cider producer, I mentioned our ever-increasing harvests and requisite scales of production. Our operation and circumstance was very familiar to that producer as something he had encountered a decade or so back; the advice was that we will have to grow ourselves in order to meet those volumes. Since shipping apples to Herefordshire seems as ridiculous as shipping tea to china, it seems, by deduction, that a challenge of scale will need to be addressed in-house in order to meet the volumes of apples harvested going forward.

Given the drive towards change, and as the pressures of scale start to mount, as a first step it makes sense for the Orchard to work more closely with the Meadows who own the land on which the orchard is located. With this in mind, I will shortly be taking up a position on the Meadows in addition to being on the board of the Orchard.

With the festive period almost upon us, the Orchard Group want to mention that we intend to run Twelfth Night wassailing celebrations this year, the date of which is subject to the preference of the Coventry Mummers around whom the event largely centres. Twelfth Night falls on Monday 17th January, according to the old Julian calendar, so there are two potential weekend dates of Saturday 15th January or Saturday 22nd for this celebration to occur. This date is yet to be confirmed, so keep an eye on the village noticeboard and website! The wassail procession will depart from outside Stoneleigh Village Club at 7.00pm and will then progress to the orchard, where the Mummers will present a play. The gathering will then make a great cacophony of noise so as to awake the trees and drive out malevolent spirits (towards HS2) before wassail readings occur at selected trees throughout the orchard. Refreshments will be provided and hopefully the weather will be kind on proceedings, so do participate and bring with your pots, pans and other things with which to make a noise!

Finally, on behalf of the Orchard board, I want to wish readers a merry Christmas and a happy New Year!

HS2 Update

Residents should have received notices direct from HS2 Ltd regarding planning road closures, restrictions and HS2-related work scheduled in our area in the near future. However, if recent incidents are anything to go by, we need to be aware that such notices do not necessarily bear any resemblance to reality! An example in the last month has been notice of the closure of Dalehouse Lane. Many of us altered our travel movements assuming that closure would be, as announced, early in the month but – no – notices later appeared saying the road would be closed from 22nd November to 5th December. Who knows what will happen? This is extremely annoying, adding to the general inconvenience to residents, to say nothing of the continued desecration of the local countryside and what seems perpetual chaos around us. There are also numerous unintended consequences of road alterations, e.g. the COVID vaccination centre has been moved back to Stoneleigh Park from the Ramada Inn, just as four-way traffic controls have been introduced at the Park entrance, causing delays and confusion.

Representations continue to be made to HS2 Ltd staff and our local contractors regarding local developments, including road closures. (See also the Parish Council report on page 12.)

As the News was being compiled, the Government announced its revised plans for transport, including HS2. The HS2 eastern leg (Nottingham to Leeds) has been scrapped and the Integrated Rail Plan proposes other measures for the Manchester to Leeds section than had been previously announced. This has far-reaching consequences for those private individuals, local councils and organisations who had made plans (or been forced to move house etc.) assuming that the project would go ahead. The original business case for HS2 has been seriously undermined. A huge political row has followed – not suitable for comment here. Meanwhile, the London to Birmingham section is deemed too far advanced to be cancelled now.

Somewhat surprisingly, there was little mention of HS2 during the recent Climate Change Conference in Glasgow.

Meetings

The next meeting will be held online via Zoom on **Thursday 9th December 2021**. The access link will be published on the website three days prior to the meeting. To view the details of this and other meetings, including upcoming planning applications, please visit the Parish Council (PC) website at <http://www.stoneleighshowparishcouncil.co.uk>.

At the PC meeting in November, we were joined by Paul Kinsella from Warwickshire County Council (WCC) and Darren Abberley from Aecom to talk about the proposed Stoneleigh Bypass. A copy of their presentation is available to view on the PC website. They confirmed that the bypass was still a number of years away and that timing was dependent on the completion of HS2 works in the area. Although the closure of Birmingham Road was not discussed in any detail, it was confirmed that WCC will shortly be undertaking traffic surveys in the area to understand the traffic flow prior to the road closure and how it changes once the road is closed.

Every few months, Warwickshire East Rural Forum Safer Neighbourhood Team (part of Warwickshire Police) hold a vote on local community safety priorities. The two options with the most votes are actioned. We have included a request for high visibility patrols to prevent and detect road-related offences on Birmingham Road, Stoneleigh.
