HS2 UPDATE

There has been a flurry of activity about HS2 in the media recently, with great excitement about the archaeological find of a Roman settlement in Oxfordshire/Northamptonshire.

Locally, we continue to be affected by roadworks, seemingly everywhere! Councillor Redford has been alerted to the disintegration of Crewe Lane and the HS2-crossing section of Dalehouse Lane in particular. Despite local objections, the likely approval of the erection of a huge gigafactory on the Coventry Airport site heralds further traffic and other disruptions to our area for the foreseeable future.

The following section is Anthony Bianco's summary of action take to date about noise and associated issues in our area.

The ambient noise from the A46 has been well documented since it was built in the 1970s. The environmental studies by the Parish Council (PC) and others at the time resulted in sound deadening expensive tarmac to be laid in 1997. This, plus a maturing tree line on A46 & B4115, helped shelter Stoneleigh, Ashow & Abbey (SAA) from noise. This good work has been destroyed.

During the last five years, HS2 Ltd. & its contractors have continued deforestation in our area, in many cases involving expensive, unplanned and often unnecessary works

The local PC and Stop HS2 Team (Anthony Bianco and Martin Smith) have raised concerns at every level up to the House of Lords and with Jeremy Wright MP(JW).

The case to be examined by HS2 Ltd. is now the impact of both noise and vibration from the works close to the A46 east/west and the (eventual) planned railway line north/south in the SAA area.

In February 2021 and throughout the year more tree removal took place in spite of vigorous requests from some forty residents to HS2 Ltd. and Warwickshire County Council (WCC) and Warwick District Council (WDC). AB raised the issue three times at JW's three-monthly forums. The WCC initial denial gave way to a written request to HS2 Ltd. from WCC and WDC Councillors in July 2021 in support of action.

Eventually, in November 2021, a five minute presentation and follow up note by Anthony Bianco on behalf of the PC to the visiting Transport Minister, Adam Stevenson MP, JW and HS2 Ltd., was accepted. This request was for expert technical sound and vibration measurements to be taken, together with a record of carbon emissions, followed by independent professional analysis of the results of this exercise.

The aim is for HS2 Ltd. to authorise and invest in sound and visual impact barriers throughout the SAA area should the analysis results merit action. (N.B. as is the case in many European high speed railway systems).

Following further pressure from JW to HS2 Ltd. in November 2021, at the next JW forum, on 21 January 2022, the contractors, BBV, were deputed to present their initial action plan to the PC, allowing time for questions.

The battle continues!

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC Update

It has become a tradition for the Orchard to start the year with the "Apple Wassail". This is held on the Saturday evening that falls nearest to January 17th, a date that corresponds to the twelfth night according to the old Julian calendar. This year it fell on January 15th.

The tradition has its origins in the West Country cider orchards where, villagers congregate to make a cacophony of noise intended to awake the apple trees from their slumbers as well as drive out evil spirits ahead of the growing season. Bread is hung from the branches of trees and cider poured around their roots to encourage a good harvest.

In Stoneleigh we have our own way of celebrating this ancient custom involving an evening parade centred on the Coventry Mummers who gathered behind a Land Rover, courtesy of Adrian Clarke. They then paraded with an assembled crowd from the Village Club down Church Lane to the Orchard gate, where at the newly named "Hammer-Head" arena, they performed their amusing "Ploughmans' Play". The crowd being suitably warmed by a mulled cider provided by Mandy Freeman & Elaine James, (Thanks to them) were treated to a spectacular fire performance by "Rhiannon" of Rosetta's Variety Entertainment before entering the torch lit Orchard to undertake readings and enact ancient rituals at three selected trees followed by a singsong whilst gathered around a flaming griddle. Finally, the assembly returned to Stoneleigh Village Club for delicious jacket potatoes and drinks provided thanks to

Karen & Jimmy Gavin.

The event provided an excellent opportunity to showcase both the Orchard and the Village Club and demonstrated how the two bodies can work successfully together. It also provided a platform for the performing arts that have been so badly affected throughout the Covid pandemic.

I would like to thank Jules Storer for his art work and all those who worked behind the scenes at such short notice as well as the masses who braved the elements to make the evening such a popular and well attended event!

Meetings

The next meeting will be on Thursday, 10th February 2022 to be held at Stoneleigh Village Hall at 7pm.

There is currently a vacancy on the Parish Council for a Councillor to represent Ashow ward. If you are interested, please see the website for more information and how to apply or contact the clerk.

At the PC meeting in December, we were joined by Sara-Louise Lee and Gurcharan Singh from BBV. They gave the Parish Council a presentation regarding the programme of works locally and traffic management in the area, the details of which can be found on our website. BBV will be updating the Parish Council at every other meeting for the time being, so we will see them again at the meeting on February 10th 2022. The draft budget was also reviewed at the December PC meeting and the 2022/23 precept was agreed at £18,352.

At the PC meeting in January, Cllr W Redford informed the Parish Council that he is attending a meeting with WCC and HS2 in the next two weeks to address a number of complaints that have been received regarding the amount of clearance that HS2 has carried out and their authority to do so.

Cllr Redford has asked for any issues to be marked clearly on a map and forwarded to him or myself at the email address below.

Cllr W Redford has also organised for an officer to visit Crewe Lane and inspect the ongoing damage. He will update the Parish Council at the next meeting.
