David Vaughan. 1932-2022. A Tribute.

Only a very brief announcement of David's death was made in the April edition of the *News* as we heard the sad news just as we went to press. There is now time to give a lengthier tribute to someone who has been a giant of a neighbour for over five decades.

On 13 April, our church was full with his family, former colleagues, friends and many villagers for a celebration of David's wonderful life. Stoneleigh owes a tremendous debt to him. During his time in the village he served on numerous committees and provided invaluable legal and personal advice to the Village Hall Committee, Stoneleigh Club, the Parish Council, Meadows Society, Leigh Educational Foundation, History Society, StAG (Action against HS2) as well as to many individuals. It is especially appropriate that the *Stoneleigh & Ashow News* records its thanks and appreciation. For many years, David and Jean ensured that copies of the monthly *News* were collated and then distributed throughout the surrounding area, David having driven hundreds of miles to each distributor's house/dropping off point, only the pandemic's restrictions halting this (just before ill health made the decision for him).

In his tribute to his father during the Celebration of his life, David's son noted that Stoneleigh meant a great deal to David; he was always ready to support village life in whatever way he could. Many of us have enjoyed the wonderful concerts given by the Stoneleigh Male Voice Choir, performing their Summer Serenade in the grounds of Wentworth House; the booklet which David and Jean researched and wrote about the house is a lasting testament to his pride in its importance to the village's history.

Amongst many tributes recorded on 13 April were:-

'Steadfast, reliable, engaging in every way, and a man of utmost integrity'

'David would give sound advice and be very supportive of all we undertook in the village'

'Such a lovely man and a real gentleman – a friend of many in Stoneleigh'

'His encouragement, support and wise counsel was always there; I could always rely on him to solve a knotty problem with meticulous care!'

We wish to record our thanks and wonderful memories of David, and send our thoughts and support to Jean and the family at this sad time. David's name will always appear in the list of those to whom residents of Stoneleigh owe an enormous debt. RIP.

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC update

One of the highlights of the year at the Stoneleigh Community Orchard is the occurrence of the spring blossom. The perry pear blossoms near to the edge of the river are normally first to bloom followed by the early dessert apple varieties such as Katy and Hunt's Early.

It seems that Stoneleigh Community Orchard is gaining some prominence locally for its beauty during the blossom season, so much so that local radio CWR phoned back in late March asking if and when full bloom is to be expected and wanting to know more about the project. Cider apple varieties tend to bloom later in the year than dessert and cooking apples therefore a blossom prediction of late April to early May is usually accurate. The telephone interview formed part of a broader discussion with the National Trust centred on the loss of orchards throughout our country generally. It seems that the National Trust have calculated with the aid of old Ordnance Survey maps and specialist software that an orchard area the size of the Isle of Wight has disappeared since 1900. In the West Midlands alone an area of 27,000 hectares of orchard has contracted to some 12,000 hectares which is a reduction amounting to some 56% of blossoming trees.

On a positive note, Stoneleigh Community Orchard can be considered to be part of a broader initiative to redress the orchard balance locally together with re-planting following Historic Coventry Trust's work at Charterhouse and plantings at Coventry schools such as Blue Coat. Let us hope that the momentum of these initiatives can be maintained.

Needless to say that public and budding photographers are welcome to visit and capture the orchard in all its splendour throughout the coming weeks.

Stoneleigh Village Cider should be available from the start of May at £20 for a 5 litre box and £16 for "Friends of the Orchard".

Stoneleigh Male Voice Choir Report from Rod Owen.

A Welsh Invasion of Stoneleigh.

An enthusiastic audience of over 150 at Stoneleigh Church were enthralled by the singing at the Stoneleigh Male Voice Choir Concert to raise funds for the Coventry Resource Centre for the Blind on Saturday 2 April 2022. SMVC were joined by their guests, Bois Goetre-Hen a'r Cylch from Bridgend, South Wales, which is easier to spell than say for some of us, whatever the Welsh equivalent of sassenachs is! The choir was led and accompanied by their Musical Director, Dale Evans.

The visitors kicked off the first half with a selection of beautiful tunes including "Don't Dream It's Over" with a lovely, lyrical solo performance by Chris Hill. The fine traditional Welsh choir tones were then complemented by a set from SMVC which included "Happy Together" and "Always on my Mind/Love Me Tender" all skilfully arranged and accompanied by Musical Director, Alan Biddle and conducted by SMVC's resident Welsh representative, Judy Hadfield. The first half closed with another wonderful set from the Bridgenders of some heartfelt Welsh numbers and a brilliantly sung solo from Chris Price in a classic rendition of Whitney Houston's "I Wanna Dance with Somebody".

During the interval the audience and choirs enjoyed refreshments generously provided by the Charity organisers, Coventry Resource Centre for the Blind which helps people in the Coventry and surrounding area to cope with the huge challenges of sight loss, providing practical advice and guidance whilst arranging social activities to develop inclusiveness.

SMVC opened up after the interval with a rousing selection of songs and concluded the set with a heartfelt selection from Les Miserables warmly appreciated by the gathered throng. Bois Goetre-Hen changed the mood a little to a reflective collection of beautifully sung songs and completed their programme with a moving performance of Labbi Siffre's "Something Inside So Strong", the solo part being rendered by Richard A Howells in such a powerful manner and which performance the choir dedicated to the spirit of the people of Ukraine.

The very welcoming audience then braced themselves for the final set from SMVC – as this was without folders!! This allowed the Choir to perform some of the most extraordinary moves witnessed at an SMVC concert, synchronised swaying (almost!) and a high kicking front line in “New York, New York!”. The horse liniment was passed round later! The bracing audience were invited to join in the singing and given solo parts which they entered into enthusiastically and with good spirit. They sang all the right notes but..... you know which way this is going to go!!

Both Choirs combined for the final number “My Way” and were greeted by a brilliant, generous audience applauding and whooping. A splendid evening all round!

The Choirs adjourned to the Stoneleigh Village Club for further refreshments including liquid ones to re-oil those hard working throats and a little bit of spontaneous choral work.

SMVC are grateful to Stoneleigh Church for providing the venue, the Charity for interval refreshments and giving the evening its purpose, Stoneleigh Village Club for their post-match hosting and all those others behind the scenes who helped the evening go so well.

We are of course indebted to our friends of Bois Goetre-Hen a’r Cylch who provided such a quality performance and friendship. It was their third visit and we hope there will be many more.

HS2 UPDATE

Road disruptions continue. During April, Stoneleigh had a foretaste of our possible future when the crossroads were closed to enable preparatory work to be undertaken for traffic lights to enable what we understand to be easier movement of construction traffic. It would appear that the crossroads will also have wider road splays constructed.

The installation of noise monitoring equipment is still underway and HS2 is making the final selection of locations. A noise forum (to discuss this) requested by Cllr Anthony Bianco became a victim of this and it was felt frustratingly by him that little was achieved when this would be such a critical subject for all affected around here. However, efforts will continue to try to get some clarity and focus into this topic.

HS2 works on Leicester Lane in Cubbington are causing inconvenience, as indeed are many others in the area, and we must be prepared for the planned road closures including an anticipated long closure of Dalehouse Lane to re-align the road over the line of route of HS2. You will have seen the tree clearance there (as well as in many other places) to accommodate that. Other independent construction works, eg along Crewe Lane do not help the situation. We did request at the House of Commons Select Committee stage that at least two roads to Kenilworth were kept open at any one time (in case one should then have to close due to an emergency), but one cannot be confident that this has or will be “actioned”. The County did have review a plan for “blue light” services.

There have been no new major construction developments since the report in the April edition of the News, it appears to be a mix of enabling works and some civil engineering works, including earth moving.

At our meeting in April, we welcomed Sophie Matthews, our new Parish Councillor for Ashow ward. Sophie has lived in Ashow for the last 18 months. She has found the community incredibly welcoming since her arrival, and feels she would like to give back to the community by supporting and representing Ashow as a parish councillor.

Warwickshire Police have contacted the Parish Council, hoping to reintroduce the Community Speed Watch scheme back into the village. They are currently assessing a location (on both sides of the Birmingham Road, between Stoneleigh Close and the post box) that they feel will be the safest and most appropriate place for the volunteers to position themselves.

Volunteers would be placed in teams of three people, committing to one session every three weeks. If three teams were formed then there would be an active Community Speed Watch every week!
