# News from the Rectory

It has been six months now since my appointment as the priest-in-charge for Stoneleigh and Ashow. It is funny because I remembered the other day when I first met the Bishop of Warwick, John Stroyan, he said something to me which I should not have forgotten in the first place!

It was just after my interviews in the benefice, and after being nominated for the post, that I had to go and see Bishop John who, is the one appoints the new clergy. He was very friendly and calm, and deeply thoughtful, asking me all kinds of questions about myself and what I thought about the benefice.

I was all very "well-rehearsed" from my previous interviews, and from visiting both parishes, I knew exactly what I wanted to tell him, and I thought I knew what he wanted me to say. It is always that perennial question, "what are you going to do in your first six months in post?" So, I started telling him that I was going to do this... and I was going to do that... it is like a politician's mini pledge, making all these "promises" in good faith and great hope.

I was telling him all these exciting ideas that would "change the world in three days," never mind six months, all these little strategies for growth, how to support the diocesan vision for a multi-parish benefice etc.... when suddenly, he made a gesture with his hand, indicating me to take a pause... and I stopped.

He looked at me and said: "Petrică, just love them!"

I almost burst into tears. "Thank God, because I have no idea what I'm talking about!" And the only thing that really matters is love. Everything else is politics, economics, religion, and dry admin stuff!

This is not a reflection about me and my priorities, but about all of us. If we love one another, everything is possible and everything else will follow. Jesus said, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples if you love one another." (John 13:34)

Our purpose, as beloved children of God, is only this one thing: to love. To love without judgment. To love without fear. To love without bias, or qualification, or exception. To love as Christ has loved us. Because that's what Jesus says. Love. Each. Other.

The Annual Meeting of the Council was held before our usual monthly meeting, where Cllr Hancox was appointed as Chairman for the Parish Council and Cllr Astle as Deputy Chairman.

At our Ordinary Meeting in May, the Parish Council were informed that the first set of noise monitoring equipment had been installed in the village of Stoneleigh, with a further three installations planned.

Two volunteers have come forward to support the Community Speed Watch scheme. If you can spare a couple of hours a month to help, then please contact the clerk (on the channels at the top of the page ) or PCSO Ed King on Edward.King@warwickshire.police.uk. for more details.

Cllr Wright (WDC) informed the Parish Council that he had received reports of a fraudulent roof repairs scam from a neighbouring village. He has urged all residents to be vigilant.

We also received an update on the status of the closure of Birmingham Road. Warwickshire County Council have agreed to carry out a formal design and estimate of costs.

There has been a lot of exciting change on the University campus over the last few years. Warwick Arts Centre is back open after a significant redevelopment, adding three new cinemas, a repositioned Mead Gallery, and a brand-new restaurant. The Interdisciplinary Biomedical Research Building is up and running – bringing together our researchers to fight human diseases and modern challenges like microbial resistance.

Almost 12 months ago the Warwick Manufacturing Group Degree Apprenticeship Centre was formally opened. The new Centre provides apprentices with the opportunity to study on degree programmes to develop the skills needed by advanced engineering and manufacturing companies. There is also a new facility to host the National Automotive Innovation Centre – a partnership between WMG, University of Warwick, Jaguar Land Rover, and Tata Motors as a beacon for automotive research. And this is all before I mention the significant investment in the creativity of the arts through our new Faculty of Arts building, enabling collaboration and teaching excellence.

The campus is open to everyone so please do come and wander round. There are lots of beautiful walking routes, with lovely flower beds thanks to our Estates team.

We are on a mission to build and protect local biodiversity even better than before. That means supporting all the various kinds of life we find in our area – allowing animals, plants, and everything in-between to thrive in their habitats. Over the last year, we have laid more hedging accommodate wildlife, coppiced trees to promote growth and extend their life, and trialled new mowing practices (with 60% reduced mowing in some areas!).



On top of that, a lot of fun was had planting almost 1,500 trees for the Queen's Green Canopy, marking Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee.

I suppose it is fair to say there is a lot going on at Warwick. We would love for you to be part of it, so do get in touch if you would like to know more.

# HS2 Update

Road closures/traffic lights connected with work on HS2 continue to plague the area. More recently, work by Severn Trent has added to the frustration. Dates are not yet known for the Dalehouse Lane closure, but traffic lights have appeared during a short stretch in the last week or so. Leicester Lane is scheduled for closure in June; diversion signs will be in place but if previous experience is anything to go by, these will cause considerable delays to local journeys.

In the wider area, changes have been made to the original plans. For example, the track is being raised by 2m and earth rather than concrete embankments will be used. This will involve the raised height of the Rugby Road overbridge. There is increasing concern in Cubbington about the impact of noise once the railway is built.

Regarding noise in the more immediate future, noise monitors have now been installed in three locations in the area, ready to assess the impact of the increased noise from the A46. The environmental impact of lorry movements to/from the construction site, noise from equipment (cement mixing etc.) will be gauged via separate receptors.

As we go to press, it has been drawn to our attention that Warwick District Council has received a planning application to increase the size of the HS2 compound by 30 hectares. The proposal involves site clearance (more vegetation lost!), material storage, weighbridge and welfare cabins and includes the construction of an internal access road to Stoneleigh Road! The deadline for registration of objections was 17 May. There has been no local consultation about this development.

# Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC update

Activities relating to the orchard take place as a part of a yearly cycle. With the weeks of blossoms starting to end, the main activity is the processing of the cider from the harvest of last year. In our small enterprise we are restricted in advanced assessment of the quality of the cider so the opening of a fermentation tank can take on the suspense of the opening of an Egyptian tomb. One never knows what will be found. To date and since commencing cider making there have been no occasions in which cider has undergone "spoilage" and had to be scrapped.



Spoilage can take many forms varying from sulphury smells, vinegar tastes to even worse effects like "mousiness." Under such circumstances the cider needs to be thrown away. Avoidance of such outcomes is generally achieved through thorough sterilization of equipment and containment. It is therefore a testament to our attention to cleanliness that the cider contained in our two main 300 litre containers opened to date is excellent and has been received very well by those who have taken the opportunity to sample it or who have purchased one of our 5-litre boxes. We also try to avoid Stoneleigh cider having a haze. This is a desirable outcome as we consider "Stoneleigh Village Cider" to be a "craft cider" fermented from fresh apple juice from selected apples and not a Scrumpy.

Stoneleigh Village Cider is available at £20 for a 5-litre box and £16 for "Friends of the Orchard".

Finally, a reminder that the grass cuts for late May & early July will avoid cutting some areas of the orchard that are considered to have the potential for the propagation of wildflowers, which are located near to hedging running adjacent to properties at the end of Church Lane and Coventry Road respectively and some small plantings next to the river.

Orchard Friends' subscriptions and yearly renewals for 2022 will cost £10 and can be made to Pete Freeman as Chairman or to Richard Hancox as Treasurer.

Cheques should be made payable to Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard, however why not become a long-term Friend, and set up a direct debit.
