HS2 Update

s the Autumn Statement approached, there was considerable pressure to abandon the project in order to help plug the hole in the nation's debts. The fact that a recent Government report indicated that HS2 will cost the taxpayer more than its economic benefits added to the arguments in favour of abandonment. Although reference was made to the need for careful review of the project's costs, no such decision was made. Eye-watering amounts of money have been spent already, some of it in vain, e.g. £106 million spent on design work at Euston station, only for a decision to be made to reduce the platforms from 11 to ten, thus requiring a complete redesign! Huw Merriman, the current Minister of State for Transport, remains upbeat about the future of the project.

As residents cannot fail to have noticed, local roads are being adversely affected by increased lorry movements, and mud, associated with various projects in addition to those related to HS2 – A46 improvements, 'Stoneleigh View' housing estate etc.


The charity has given financial help in the past towards costs such as:


Despite this, in his home town, Coventry, he remains neglected. 2022 is the centenary of his birth, but how is he now remembered locally?

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC Update

ith the festive period fast approaching and signalling the end of another year, it is once again time to take stock of the incredible journey that we have been on since the inception of the orchard back in 2011. At the time of writing, 1700 litres of apple juice reside in fermentation containers undergoing transition to cider, as well as a further 50 litres of perry, which is an equivalent pear-derived drink. The volume of cider produced is over 50% up from last year's harvest and highlights the need to put measures in place to meet these increasing harvests.

In truth, the sheer volume of the work surrounding the orchard has meant that directors' meetings have been infrequent and, as a consequence, the decision-making process has taken a back seat, often at the expense of directorial consensus. With this in mind, a directors' meeting occurred early in November, with a number of decisions taken in addition to the approval of accounts. Foremost in this was a decision to strive to increment the number of directors representing Stoneleigh Community Orchard and to have at least one annual meeting in which the membership and villagers can attend and express their opinions. On the operational side of things, it was agreed to once again explore the possibility of bottling and carbonating a portion of the cider.

With regards to events, it was decided not to proceed with the "Stoneleigh Wassail" that normally occurs at the start of January each year in preference for an event to coincide with the Coronation celebrations. Perhaps the enormity of recent harvests necessitates that the Wassail (and its consequent increase in tree fertility) be curtailed somewhat in order to make harvests more manageable. I guess that would be a pagan interpretation of things!

Finally, on behalf of the board I would like to wish everyone a very Happy Christmas and New Year!

Advent

t was some weeks ago (and definitely well before the season of Advent was due to begin) that my eight-year-old grandson showed me his Advent calendar. It was all about outer space, and each of the doors opened on to one of the planets or some other part or aspect of the solar system. It was all very impressive, as was his interest in and knowledge of anything relating to the galaxy and what lies beyond. (I also noticed that most of the doors had already been opened, with the chocolate that had been inside no longer there!)

My initial reaction to all this served to remind me that I'm definitely becoming a grumpy old man. I thought back to the Advent calendars I knew as a child, with their scriptural texts and biblical scenes of the wise men, shepherds, the stable, the star and, of course, Mary and Joseph and the baby. I reflected on 'Christmas isn't what it used to be' and felt a mixture of nostalgia and regret at what had been and what is now past. And then I came to my senses! I'm sure that, when I was eight, I was more interested in the chocolate behind each of the doors on the Advent calendar than I was in the biblical message of the calendar itself. At least my grandson had learnt something from his calendar and was enthusiastic enough to share that knowledge with his ancient grandfather!

But his calendar also reminded me of something that is at the heart of the Advent season and in particular Christmas itself: that the creator is concerned for every part of his creation and that in it and through it, we see something of his glory and can and should feel a sense of wonder and worship as a result. That glory was wonderfully displayed and his love expressed in a stable in Bethlehem when Jesus was born, and all that followed as a result of that birth continues to point us to the love, grace and purposes of the creator.

Over the Advent season, and especially as we draw near to Christmas itself, we'll be remembering and reflecting on these events and what they mean for each of us, for our world and all of creation, and we welcome everyone and anyone to share in the services, study groups and celebrations that mark these few weeks. In the meantime, we hope you enjoy the Advent build-up and that it will lead to a wonderful and blessed Christmas.

The lunch club met at Bubbenhall for a very nice lunch, which was well attended. Our Christmas lunch will be at Stoneleigh Golf Club.


The craft group had a sales table at Hodgetts Lane WI's Christmas craft fair; a good event at which we sold some of our handmade Christmas decorations.
