HS2 UPDATE

Last month's report referred to the renewal of controversy surrounding the escalating costs of HS2, with attention now moving to the possible abandonment of the section of the route to Manchester.

It is most regrettable that communities such as ours are being exposed to all these disruptions for a project which is being potentially scaled back to the extent that it makes little sense to have started it! As reported earlier, there is much doubt that Euston will be the London terminus for the project.

Meanwhile, local residents can look forward to road/lane closures involving night time lane closures on the A46 to permit more tree felling/vegetation clearance (the second operation of this type in this area), complete closure of the Stoneleigh Road bridge over the A46 from 5 October, and several weeks' closure of Dalehouse Lane. Some challenging diversions lie ahead for us all!

Of course, coupled with other live construction projects, eg the houses being built in the 'Thickthorn Wedge', there may be additional road closures or one-way systems put in place.

HS2 Ltd attempts to keep residents informed but this is somewhat erratic and date changes aren't always notified, adding to the confusion caused by other projects in this area. The village Facebook page is a useful way of exchanging information about such things.

Stoneleigh Community Orchard

With the picking and pressing of early varieties of apple already started it would be fair to say that the Orchard Group are already engaged in meeting the challenges of the harvest of 2023. This year in advance of the harvest particular attention was given to how to alleviate the pressures of workload and make these manual labours easier to complete. It has long been an aspiration to acquire larger premises in the proximity of the orchard as well as to automate otherwise manual processes to meet the demands of an exponentially increasing harvest. To this end, the area occupied by the Meadows Hut given its location adjacent to the Orchard would clearly make an ideal plot from which to operate and therefore has an inherent value to our community enterprise. The owners having recently been refused planning permission for a dwelling and then being approached by the Orchard to purchase it from them now value the land at offers in excess of £170,000. This interestingly would put the land at values approaching those located in areas of the Borough of Westminster. It would therefore appear that there will be little chance of addressing our needs through this means, leaving the Meadows hut at an impasse and representing little more than a "folly" to the calculus of flawed speculation for the foreseeable future.

On a positive and exciting note, the Orchard board are pleased to have agreed and supplied 300 litres of cider to be distilled into Brandy at Chase Farm distillery. At this point in time this can be considered the first steps in an experiment, the results of which will only be realised following storage and aging in Cherry Wood barrels for a period of three years. This process will clearly require a degree of patience and from recollection the words of the Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu are applicable when he states that "Every great journey starts with a single step".

As apple picking and pressing gears up and accelerates, we welcome any assistance that the Stoneleigh Community or indeed those from outside the village can offer when it comes to "bringing in" the harvest. As mentioned in the September edition you can simply turn up if you see activity in the Orchard or contact me at the email address below to find out further details or alternatively check the posts of Amanda Freeman on the Stoneleigh Village Facebook for dates and times.


