## Stoneleigh Community Orchard

As this article is being written there seems to be no let-up in the flood events affecting the Orchard and village, the latest occurred during the first full week of February, and though the weather system was not heralded with a name of note and river levels did not reach those of previous storms, it seemed to be a lot more destructive, displacing already damaged fencing and accumulating a strange array of items representing broad aspects of humanity, all of which when combined with dead vegetation trapped in the fencing contributed to the pressure placed upon Orchard boundaries and other boundaries around the meadow.

A small window of dry weather following Storm Henk allowed winter pruning to be completed, clippings removed from site, and materials cleared from fencing that may have acted as levers during further flooding.

Readers of the February edition may recall that a dialogue had been opened up with a number of interested parties following the aftermath of the flooding caused by winter storms. At this point in time the Orchard is working closely with the Parish Council to bring pressure to bear upon HS2 to offer solutions to what appears to be the dam like effects of the railway embankment located a short distance downstream from the village with consequent flood water building up back towards the village. Unfortunately, the Environment agency that should monitor and have some leverage over HS2, is a government body, so the balance of probability suggests that layers of politics will be applied to any subsequent investigation. We will watch carefully to see what if anything they do and then respond accordingly.





Back in January, I attended a presentation entitled "This Septic Isle" at the Quaker Meeting House in Coventry given by Geoff Sallis who is described as a citizen scientist and who is heading a campaign to address river pollution in the River Avon catchment. This was largely in response and out of respect for the excellent work of our late counsellor Anthony Bianco who championed the fight against river pollution locally as well as Stoneleigh resident Marion Murray who described anecdotal observations of the decline of biodiversity in the river immediately outside Motslow Hill Cottage and whose opinion I value.

Readers may be familiar through the media with a recent campaign of pressure centred on the river Wye in which pollution from chicken farms leached into that river with catastrophic effects. The Environment Agency is being challenged to properly address the incidence of this pollution and the case is currently subject to a judicial review. With the Finham Sewage Treatment works on the Sowe only a short distance upstream and with the potential for multi-drugresistant bacteria to be released in raw sewage the Orchard is working closely with the Parish Council to explore possibilities for monitoring and testing water quality and levels of pollution locally. In short this should give our community an oversight of pollution levels on both the River Sowe and Avon respectively and ensure that responsible parties will not be allowed to mark their own homework without scrutiny.

Finally, a reminder that this year the Orchard board intend to develop our "Blossom event" which proved such a success under the very capable leadership of orchard directors, Nora Blagburn and Quentin Compton-Bishop. The format of the event will be similar to last year, but will occur at an earlier weekend of Saturday, 18th May between 2.30 - 4.30 pm to ensure that there is still blossom left on the trees to be viewed. Readers may wish to save this date to their diaries as well as spread the word. There will also be cider available to purchase on the day.

Orchard Friends' subscriptions and yearly renewals cost £10 and can be made to Pete Freeman as Chairman or to Richard Hancox as Treasurer. Cheques should be made payable to Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard, however why not

#### **HS2 Update**

Not much to report. Dalehouse Lane is currently closed. Look out for other road closures associated with the works, as this and other construction projects are putting pressure on routes into Kenilworth and Leamington. The recent surface water and river flooding has also caused problems with traffic, some people are of the view that some of this flooding could be down to disruption to the existing land drains. The Mayors of Birmingham and Manchester have launched their own plan to use the safeguarded land on the line of route north of us to create a dedicated rail connection between the two cities, and to do so before land that has been purchased under compulsory purchase powers is sold on the open market, seeing this as a once in a lifetime opportunity. Were this to come off quite how it could affect train passes (ie numbers) through Stoneleigh is to be seen.

#### Stoneleigh Park Events

Cllr P Redford has previously met with the organisers, who advised at the time, that they would contact sound consultants. They apparently did not turn up. She has since spoken to WDC licensing & environmental department, who have advised equipment can be set up in a resident's property to measure the sound, Cllr J Astle has agreed to have the equipment in his property.

#### **HS2 Updates**

Clerk has asked Sarah Louise to attend the April meeting to provide an update on the project.

#### Stoneleigh Village Hall Noticeboard

WCC have approved location in Hall Close. Clerk to assign contractor and check insurance cover.

#### Birmingham Road Closure Update

Cllr W Redford & Cllr R Hancox met to discuss the road closure. HS2 have the licence until October for the traffic lights. They do have the right to extend the licence, but County Council are unaware of any future plans. The PC are awaiting the application forms for the 20mph limit.

#### Stare Bridge and B4113 Footpath Update

Cllr P Redford has updated and advised the footpath will be addressed in summer.

#### State of Disrepair C32/B4115 Crossroads

Cllr W Redford advised that surfacing has been completed on one side, with the other side planned for 24th March. This will require a road closure and diversion in place. The blocked drains and gully have been reported.

#### <u>Updates from Warwickshire Police, WCC Councillor Redford</u> <u>and WDC Councillors P Redford and J Payne</u>

Cllr P Redford advised there is currently a funding scheme in place of £35k called 'Move On' for the prevention of rough sleeping to help towards accommodation for the homeless.
