Stoneleigh Community Orchard Update

In this month's edition I would first like to pay tribute to those involved in the planning of our Orchard Blossom Event. Directors Nora Blagburn and Quentin Compton-Bishop brought experience and a skill set to the proceedings which built on the success of previous years.

A broad set of villagers helped from the start of the day, and all will get a mention in the July / August edition of the Stoneleigh and Ashow News, along with photographs, owing to the late generation of this article and inevitably missing the copy deadline.

The day started off warm and got even hotter through the collective heat generated whilst trying to construct the big marquee provided by Stoneleigh Village Club, which having previously been packed away damp and with poles mixed up provided a thought-provoking challenge which Adrian Clarke and Paul Britten managed to resolve using their engineering know how. Thank you to villager Malcolm Murphy, Gordon Gatward and David Blagburn who had travelled all the way from Ireland to assist in this exercise!

Thanks to all the ladies who baked cakes and staffed the stalls, all of whom will get a mention in the next edition. The event also provided an opportunity to observe an assortment of activities ranging from Morris dancing to bee keeping as well as the opportunity to sample a broad selection of products ranging from spirits from the East Chase Farm Distillery to soaps. It is worth a mention to say that John Churchley and I managed to sell all our boxes of cider on the day and it is my understanding that Stoneleigh Village Club also benefitted from the foot fall coming into the village.

Finally, big thank you to the weather, as these occasions invariably rely on sunshine!

With the Blossom event providing the main focus for May the only other news of note was that John Churchley and I took the opportunity to personally introduce ourselves to staff from HS2 earlier in the month during a HS2 PR exercise held at Stoneleigh Village Hall. We went to discuss the tunnelling under the A46 and used this occasion to highlight flooding issues that this project is exacerbating locally.

A gallery of relevant flooding photographs had been uploaded to the Environment Agency website in advance and they have shared these with HS2. So, we will wait to see what the response to this evidence is, but initial indications seem to concentrate on a plan to form an artificial water storing lake at the confluence of the river Avon and Sowe.

We will follow this possibility with interest.

The talk will look at how we can read landscapes for clues about their evolution. We will examine how the so-called Forest of Arden was colonised and settled from Anglo-Saxon times onwards.
