HS2 UPDATE

Whilst the relatively new Labour government considers options for HS2 within the overall transport budget and the wider economy, work continues on our section. There will be three way lights at the bottom of Crewe Lane, and Dale House Lane will be closed from 19th August for a week. Coupled with the restrictions on the A46 roundabout and the slip road onto this, it's becoming a challenging route into Kenilworth.

One is always tempted to ask, "Yes, but when will it all end?", and there is no realistic answer to this. This is the civil engineering phase of the overall project: digging out; constructing bridges; diverting roads and utilities etc.

Once the track bed is laid then the contractors should have more options for access and moving of materials.

SMVC PUT THE SERENADE INTO SUMMER

Imagine the most quintessential summer garden with flowers in full bloom, bees scurrying about doing their thing, dragonflies hovering, observing, then scudding off to their next spying opportunity; laughter teetering on the light breeze and the angelic sounds of an almost ethereal choir drifting carelessly across the verdant lawn. And there we have it folks - this year's Summer Serenade in the walled Residents' Garden at Stoneleigh Abbey.

Around 200 souls captivated by a glorious summer setting listened intently (for they did not want to miss their cues to join in!) while the Stoneleigh Male Voice Choir under the baton of the wonderful Judy Hadfield and musical direction of the incomparable Alan Biddle, opened the afternoon with an American Band Medley and then burst forth into their mixed repertoire of popular songs.

In between the bouts of robust chorusing, the Coventry City of Culture Orchestra Jazz Ensemble burst forth also with some superb jazz sounds that led to a great deal of involuntary foot tapping and clapping. The credit for their performance must go to their outstanding Musical Director, Seb Farrall, who kept them all rhythmically positioned through their selection of great numbers such as "Just A Closer Walk With Thee", "Let It Be" and rounding the set off with the "Bare Necessities" from Disney's "Jungle Book".

The Choir hit back immediately with such classics as "Happy Together", One Direction's "History" (to show they can 'get down with the kids'; a vain hope but neatly executed!). An ABBA medley concluded the first half with excellent audience participation revealing more than our fair share of "Dancing Queens".

During the interval a fine selection of tasty sandwiches were served, raffle tickets sold and there were very moving talks from our guest charities - the British Blind Sports (funds being raised for Paralympian and multi gold medallist Melanie Barrett who is to swim the English Channel in August and will be the first blind swimmer to do so) and Leamington Night Shelter who do so much to provide food and shelter to the homeless in the area.

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters we were able to donate £1000 to each.

The second half was opened by SMVC "Flying Us To The Moon", a powerful version of "The Battle Hymn of The Republic" and a glorious and moving rendition of songs from "Les Miserables". They concluded with a special arrangement of the popular song "Don't Stop Believing", it's ok guys we won't! A brilliant performance by them that brought the house down and unfortunately a bundle of very heavy rain drops but fortunately short lived.

The Choir finished the afternoon with a selection of crowd pleasers which demanded the crowd join in starting with "Love Shine A Light" and, would you believe it, that was when the rain stopped and the sun burst forth again. "He's Got The Whole World in His Hands" forced the audience into a frenzied hand clapping and various hand gestures (careful!) to illustrate the charming lyrics.

The Choir not wishing to be left out showed off their terpsichorial expertise in "New York, New York" (which was where some disparaging members of the audience may have wished the Choir were!) and concluding with "My Way" - holding that last note until some turned blue as others passed out! (Joking!)

The day ended by everyone joining in a little tribute to acknowledge the 80th commemoration of the D-Day Landings, "There'll Be Bluebirds Over" and "We'll Meet Again" and so we will - at Summer Serenade of 2025 of course!

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC Update

Activities for the orchard group continued at pace over the summer. The selling of our stocks of cider was helped by events such as the May "Blossom Event" and July's Stoneleigh "Duck Race", both of which were a great success. Operations in the orchard needed to be maintained in the light of the weight of fruit on the trees causing some varieties to drop branches. At the moment of writing this article it would seem that we have yet another large apple harvest to process going forward, this is an arduous task that by no means should be considered routine or perfunctory. Let us hope for another good turnout when it comes to apple picking and we will as ever communicate when picking is occurring through the Stoneleigh Village Facebook group.

I am informed by East Chase distillery that our first batch of Apple brandy now resides in cherry oak barrels where it will mature for three to four years. A second 300 litre batch of cider especially developed to contain elevated alcohol levels was delivered in late July for processing which keeps the ball rolling with regards to this element of the project.

Also, back in late July I was interviewed about the orchard project by the Kenilworth Nub News. The resulting <u>online article</u> can be found in the 29th July edition and can be found via a Google search. It can be argued that the most important element of a business is marketing as this forms a foundation from which everything else can be built, it follows that such opportunities for favourable publicity are welcomed, indeed I believe that this article was such a success that there will be a follow-up article in the near future.

Readers may recall that earlier in the year the orchard was involved in engaging with local environmental issues particularly centred on the water quality of local rivers as well as the impact of HS2 on the flow dynamics within the river Sowe catchment. It seems that the Environment Agency were unable to observe files uploaded as photographic evidence of flooding. One may speculate about the underlying reasons for this, though several popular sayings spring to mind centred on the convenience of selective blindness.

Needless to say, that the torch will be picked up once again concerning this issue. I am also currently exploring the possibilities of combining river water quality testing with other agents in the village who are undertaking similar work. This will hopefully avoid any duplication of effort.

RESIDENTIAL HOUSING VACANCY

The Dame Alice Leigh's Almshouse is a Charity providing housing accommodation in ten sandstone cottages in the centre of Stoneleigh, a quiet rural village in Warwickshire. A residence in this 16th century Almshouse will soon be available.

On the ground floor of each home there is a hall, leading to a sitting room with kitchen. A door to utility room leads through to a cloakroom with washbasin and toilet. A dog-leg staircase from the hall leads to the first floor where there is a bedroom and shower room with washbasin and toilet.

Outside there is a small private patio connected to large communal gardens where there is a useful storage building with dedicated space for each resident.

Cottages are equipped with cooker, fridge & washing machine, phone line, emergency assistance-call unit, carpets, electric storage heaters, smoke & heat detectors, hot water heater, and a TV point.

The Dame Alice Leigh Charity, repairs and maintains the fabric and services to the building, as well as the outbuildings and communal gardens.

Applicants must be of retirement age or above, capable of independent living and have a genuine need of Almshouse housing. Preference is given to residents who live in, or have connections with, the parish of Stoneleigh. However, Trustees welcome applications from other qualifying persons.




