

Stoneleigh Community Orchard

As with the election of a new pope being signified through the appearance of white smoke issuing from a chimney in the Sistine Chapel, so on October 14th at about 12:45pm the completion of the harvest and pressing of this year's apple crop was once again marked in the traditional way through the playing of Motorhead's "Ace of Spades" at full volume!

This year's harvesting has had to navigate a course through inclement weather and the fine days have been especially targeted for picking with those events generating massive outputs from a small and battle-hardened team. One such day occurred on Saturday 5th October in which villagers such as Mike Evans, Paul Britten, Martin Browett & Martin Smith complete with grandchildren Amelie & Noah joined John Churchley & myself to generate 46 large crates of apples. In follow-up picks we were joined by Quentin Compton-Bishop plus Tony & Sam Hyndman who all helped to produce similar yields. On the final pick we were graced by the presence of Paul & Gwen Britten's granddaughter "Ava" who though few in years overflowed with enthusiasm in her mission to fill a red bucket with red apples! Thank you, Ava!

Of course, each picking event was swiftly followed, usually on the following Monday and Tuesday, by manual pressings in which John and myself equalled our storage capacity of 1700 litres of juice. Things did not always run smoothly and I recall a large bucket of juice slipping from my hands to form a tsunami that transited the outhouse in a spectacular fashion and as a consequence we stuck to the floor for the rest of the afternoon. There was also an incident in which we endeavoured to coax out a spider that had taken up residence in one

of our 300 litre containers. Never has there been a more awkward arachnid!

It seems that the success of our orchard has attracted the attention of Warwick County Council and specifically Tara from the ecology department who was introduced to us through our treasurer Richard Hancox and visited us on Monday 30th September after a press. She wanted to learn from our project as there is money available as part of a King Charles III led initiative. Let us hope that similar projects take off around the county.

Finally, just a line to mention that as we have reached our cider storage capacity and given that there are still some apples on the trees, please feel free to help yourself to any remaining apples in the orchard.





HS2 Update

Work continues locally in constructing the elevated roadway at Stoneleigh Park and on the B4115, amongst other items. Work to slide in the bridge section on the A46, now scheduled to take place during a three week closure of the A46 (diversion routes being planned) will be delayed until the A46 roundabout is completed. The completion date for the latter is to be confirmed, but readers may recall that the new bridge section was lifted into place in January 2023. HS2 has now constructed the access junction close to the Colas construction site, and so this is ready to use when required.

Nationally the picture is unclear. The Transport Secretary, Louise Haigh is committed to taking the route into Euston, no mean task due to site restrictions and consequent platform number reduction, at least she understands that finishing this at Old Oak Common makes little sense.

Work has started to construct the Digbeth terminus in Birmingham as the bored auger piling contractor is on site (boring refers to the method of construction, although one cannot comment on the mental state of the contractor).

One does have to note the volume of water entering the top of Birmingham Road off the fields, and cannot recall it being that bad before, but rainfall intensities have to be noted.
