Stoneleigh Community Orchard

Given that this season is generally one of quiet reflection, there is expectation that the activities in the orchard would similarly wind down. However, this was not the case following the fall of a large oak tree from the opposite embankment into the orchard. The oak, having fallen over the river, had the potential to form a weir in future flood events, which would have threatened properties upstream or indeed damaged the Motslow footbridge had it broken loose and careered downstream.

Thankfully, the Environment Agency took ownership of the problem, and I would like to pay tribute to the small and dedicated team of Adam Harris and Brooke Harris, together with Will I'Anson and Connor McNally, who arrived to tackle the issue.

This was a difficult task requiring planning, strategy and not to mention a degree of courage! I am told by a villager, who undertook a tree ring count of one of the sawn trunks, that its age was some 170 years.

Prompted by this number, I resolved to undertake some research into what was occurring back in 1854 when the tree first germinated from an acorn. Queen Victoria reigned, and a physician called Dr John Snow found the waterborne cause of cholera following an outbreak in Soho but, most poignantly, a war was taking place in the Crimea in which a European army struggled to contain the expansionist ambitions of a Tsar. What ironic symmetry it is when the world finds itself back under similar circumstances at the oak's finale.

Earlier in November, myself and John went to see Luke Weetman, the owner of East Chase Farm distillery, to collect some empty cider containers. I was told that our brandy is maturing in cherrywood barrels located at premises in Huddersfield, where it will remain for at least another two years. We were shown the still in which our brandy was distilled from the cider; interestingly this was named "Ginny" on account of its role in gin production and, by coincidence, a name shared with my neighbour. We look forward to the final product!

On Saturday 18th January 2025 at 7.00pm, the Orchard and Stoneleigh Village Club intend to run a "Wassail", which we previously ran very successfully at the same time of year back in 2022. For those who are unaware of the Wassail, it is an event derived from ancient tradition in which a cacophony of noise is created in the orchard on the old Twelfth Night according to the Julian calendar. The intention is to drive out evil

spirits from the orchard to ensure a good apple crop in the forthcoming year. At 7.00pm, we intend to parade from the Club to the end of Church Lane, where there will be entertainment from the Coventry Mummers followed by a performance by the returning and ever-popular fire artist, Rhiannon. Then the tradition of driving out spirits from the orchard will take place before returning to the Club for food and refreshments. Do dress up in Victorian costume, and bring along items with which to make a noise such as pots, pans and "firearms" (see page 8 for poster).

Stoneleigh Village Hall News

he Village Hall has had a busy year and, post-pandemic, is proving itself once again a tremendous amenity for the village. For those who don't know what it offers, it has a meeting hall that seats 120, with a stage and modern audiovisual equipment, a separate committee meeting room and a fully equipped kitchen. Outside, there is a football pitch, tennis court and artificial turf playing area.



These facilities are primarily for the use of Stoneleigh village's community, groups and associations. Regular users include the Stoneleigh Male Voice Choir, the Stoneleigh Ladies' Choir, the Women's Institute, Stoneleigh History Society, the Dame Alice Leigh's Almshouse and Stoneleigh Parish Council. It is the home of Stoneleigh Football Club, Kenilworth Wardens Junior Football Team and Stoneleigh Tennis Club, and has a play area for children of the village. Another regular user is the NHS. Other groups organise classes in pilates, art, language tuition and even bilingual singing. The Hall is also the village's polling station for elections, as well as hosting the village's second defibrillator.






Groups and individuals outside the village can also rent the Hall, subject to availability and the conditions of hire. Indeed, having a busy bookings calendar is essential for the Hall's long-term viability. While the trustees were able to secure a COVID grant two years ago, this is being used mainly for improving the facilities, such as the audiovisual equipment installed in the main hall and, just underway, a floor-to-ceiling renovation of the outdated toilets (which should be completed by early December).

Stoneleigh Village Hall and Playing Fields Charity (to give it its formal name) is managed by a group of trustees who volunteer to manage the facilities and oversee the Hall's operations, finances and governance. The trustees comprise those elected, as well as representatives of groups who regularly use the Hall. We hold monthly management meetings and can invite people to attend where there is a particular matter requiring their input. Our AGM is an open meeting to Stoneleigh inhabitants and those in the area benefiting from its facilities, at which we report on the past year, review the Hall's governance and finances, and elect new trustees.

The trustees also periodically review the booking policy for the Hall. A recent evening party organised by non-villagers, which was followed by noise and unpleasant disturbances after guests left the Hall, has caused us to do so again. We will take all reasonable precautions within our remit to reduce the prospects of such a disturbance happening in the future. Occurrences of this nature are rare, and we cherish and seek to retain good relationships with our neighbours and the village as a whole.

Lastly, it would be wrong to talk about what the Hall offers and how it is managed without paying tribute to Joe Ball. Like the other trustees, he is a volunteer and the one who carries out most of the day-to-day work, organising bookings and setting up and clearing the rooms. Our thanks go to him especially, and also to those others who volunteer to keep the Hall as a precious amenity for the enjoyment of the whole village.

HS2 Update

s reported in last month's article, the Government is funding the extension of the line into Euston, and the tunnel boring machines have started their slow advance from Old Oak Common. This will prove to be no easy achievement and the final price tag will reflect this, together with the disruption to that London terminus.

I spotted the viaduct over the Colne Valley lakes on a recent trip to the capital; they show a rather graceful arch curve in concrete. Local bridges may not quite be as grand, and we await the ensuing road closures etc. as the bridges on the Ashow Road and the Coventry Road outside Kenilworth are commissioned. The bridge over Dalehouse Lane will require a longer road closure, so watch out for road closures as various bits of enabling works are carried out.


Edward Langley Fardon

Pioneer of bicycle design 1839 – 1926

n Sunday 8th December at 12 noon, there will be a special event in the heart of Stoneleigh village — the unveiling of a blue commemorative plaque to Edward Langley Fardon. He was born on 11th December 1839 and worked for many years as a blacksmith and engineer in both Kenilworth and Stoneleigh, but is perhaps best remembered as a bicycle pioneer, having made, it is said, the original suspension, or spider wheel, and the first entirely iron cycle which was provided with an Indiarubber tyre. Newspaper articles of the day state that he began his designs in 1868 and completed them the following year. He moved to Stoneleigh in 1874, living at 2 Church Lane, and lived there until his death in 1926. For nearly 50 years, he played an active part in the life of the village.

Mr Fardon was a modest man and did not patent his designs, and so the credit for his innovative thinking has often gone to others. As a local newspaper put it, "It is perhaps not universally known that it is to his genius that we owe one of the greatest improvements in the modern bicycle." He was also a talented creator of ornamental ironwork and was in demand by various stately homes as a designer of gates. He worked for the Rothschilds and made ornamental gates at Stoneleigh Abbey.

All are welcome at the forge to participate in this event (see opposite page) and at the Club afterwards for refreshments.


