We remember the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe Day.

Welcome to the May edition of the Stoneleigh and Ashow News

In this edition we shall reflect (among our usual articles) on the 80th anniversary of VE, the "Victory in Europe", Day which officially ended the fighting on May 8th 1945 when an Armistice was signed on Luneberg Heath between the Allied and Nazi German Forces.

Of course, the war in the far East continued until August 1945, only ending with the dropping of two atomic bombs on Japanese soil.

But what of the transition brought about by V.E.Day? Of the servicemen and servicewomen returning home to estranged families, to husbands and wives new and old, to babies not yet held? For all those who did not return, their loved ones had to continue as best they could, facing the destruction, the crippling cost of the war and the future.

To all of that generation we give our thanks.

Remembering those who gave their lives (with thanks to Sheila Woolf for the information):

Humphrey Desmond Cooke 1914-1942. Wing Commander RAF

Lost his life on a bombing raid to Bremen, Germany

Geoffrey Lee 1920-1943. Sergeant RAF

Lost his life on a bombing raid to Dortmund, Germany Buried in Rheinburg Military Cemetery

Donald Stewart Hegan 1916-1942. RAF Volunteer Reserve

Lost his life in a flying accident over Staffordshire. Buried here in Stoneleigh

John Alun Edmonds 1916-1944 RAF Volunteer Reserve

Lost his life in a flying accident at Gaydon airfield.

Stoneleigh Community Orchard Update

Blossom Festival

Those readers who have visited the orchard in recent weeks will have noticed the gradual swelling of buds upon the trees prior to them breaking into leaf. The perry pears appear to be already in blossom which is a strong indicator for a large pear harvest later in the year and a welcome addition given its scarcity in recent years. The commencement of blossom in the orchard has also focussed the group's attention on our "Blossom Festival" which is scheduled to occur on Saturday 17th May between 2:30 - 4:30pm in the orchard field at the end of Church Lane.

The event co-ordinator Quentin Compton-Bishop has put together literature designed to bring the visiting public up to speed with the orchard narrative to date, as well as to provide some points of interest concerning apple varieties and processing. This can be used as a resource and guide to those exploring the orchard. I am informed by fellow coordinator, Mandy Freeman, that the event has been successful in attracting a broad and varied array of stalls, interest groups and activities. All of these are described in our accompanying event poster. Orchard activities include Morris dancing provided by "Plum Jerkum" who are Warwick's own mixed Border Morris group. Also, keep your eye out for the appearance of the "Green Man" (Barry Patterson) during these festivities, who will be entertaining folk with stories, music and poetry which makes him an essential for all May celebrations. Barry is also a specialist in playing the mediaeval bagpipes which makes him somewhat unique in these modern times. Live music performances will also occur. The centrepiece of the event will be a large effigy of a "Wicker Man" as described in the April edition, which is now close to completion. He will serve multiple roles in advertising and signing both before, during and after the event. Our Wicker Man will of course require a name, so we welcome suggestions!

The event will also be the first opportunity to buy this year's sparkling bottled cider. Our boxes of still cider will also be available for purchase. Finally, there will be the opportunity to glance inside the processing facility where the cider is created and stored.

Orchard Friends' subscriptions and yearly renewals for 2025 will cost £10 and can be made to Pete Freeman as Chairman or to Richard Hancox as Treasurer. Cheques should be made payable to Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard, however why not become a long term, friend and set up a direct debit?

Alfred William Jones 1925-1944

Private Royal Welch Fusiliers

Killed in the fighting in the bocage country in Normandy. He has no grave but is commemorated on the Bayeux War Memorial.

Harold Mills 1921 - 1944

Private 5th Battalion Sherwood Foresters

Killed in action on 31 August 1944 during the Italy campaign. He is buried at Montecchio, along with 581 other Commonwealth servicemen.

John Copeland Aris, 1921-1942

Ordinary Telegraphist HMS Nigeria, Royal Navy.

Killed whilst part of a convoy from Gibraltar to Malta.

Finally, some facts and possible fictions about VE Day

Not all the fighting in Europe ceased on May 8th. Stalin insisted that a separate Armistice was signed between Germany and Russia on May 9th. Furthermore, some German units in Denmark (and the islands) weren't immediately aware of the Armistice, as were those on the Channel Islands.

May 8th was declared a Public Holiday in Britain. The Government announced the news to the nation on May 7th. My mother joined the revelling crowds in Trafalgar Square, as (it is rumoured) did the Princesses Elizabeth and Margaret. Pubs stayed open until 1am that day.

Many servicemen and women did not return to the UK in 1945. That depended on generally when they were "called up", and which "theatre" of war they operated in. My father returned from Greece in 1946 as an example, by ship to Marseille then on by train to the UK clutching his "de-mob" cardboard suitcase. I still have it! His war medals were sent to him by The Admiralty much later.


We're delighted to be supporting the Stoneleigh Community Orchard's Blossom Festival, which takes place in the Meadow between 14:30 - 16:30.
